meeting anne frank an anthology captures the stories of some twenty of us who have walked with anne frank and her sister margot as kindred spirits over the course of the many decades that have elapsed since both girls died from typhus and nazi cruelty in bergen belsen in 1945 none writing here actually met or knew anne personally but we have talked to her and journeyed with her kindred spirit anne frank unites us at a time when so much of the world is riven by the familiar and divisive themes of partisan politics anti semitism and prejudice you will though be meeting those who did know anne s most adorable father otto and they have kindly shared their vivid stories in this volume you will be seeing how we cherish not just the loving father daughter relationship that has come to mean so much for many of us but also the inspiration of anne s patient mother edith and her ladylike older sister margot several of anne s surviving school friends also appear in the journeys undertaken by a number of my contributors in the years since she died in 1945 anne frank has become variously the sister mother wife daughter girlfriend or best friend to each of us writing for this anthology and to many in the wider world we honor the happy and tragic story of anne s brief life and recognize the existence of at least two annes in both her sense of fun and mischief and in her growing self awareness while in hiding anne was only a child while she lived freely at merwedeplein 37 in amsterdam the netherlands and barely a teenager when she died in a nazi concentration camp for the simple crime of being jewish anne wanted to go on living after her death in february or march 1945 and i hope we have honored her lasting wish in this work

ronald wilfred jansen visited anne frank s home addresses in frankfurt am main aachen and amsterdam her hiding place the secret annex and the westerbork auschwitz birkenau and bergen belsen concentration camps where anne frank was imprisoned his book describes her history and the objects that today still remind us of the environment in which she lived his motivation for writing this book is that it was one of the last opportunities he would have to contact the people who knew anne these people revealed some new facts about her and her world other contemporaries of anne frank also contributed fascinating information about her surroundings by tracing her footsteps he gained a more complete picture of anne frank and her environment

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interrogates the global and often controversial phenomenon of holocaust and human rights museums spanning six continents europe australia africa asia north america and south america this edited collection offers a comparative transnational study of holocaust and human rights museums that foregrounds the overlapping and often contested work these institutions do in narrating and memorializing histories of genocide and human rights abuses for a public audience museums that link the holocaust with social justice human rights and genocide prevention have been founded in many countries for example the kazerne dossin memorial museum in belgium the anne frank house in the netherlands and the johannesburg holocaust and genocide centre in south africa making holocaust and human rights museums a global phenomenon it is not uncommon for these institutions to court controversy by linking the holocaust to human rights issues in their locales and abroad some begin from a holocaust core and extrapolate from this history to address broader concerns while others integrate the holocaust as a or at times the case study par excellence of human rights abuses other institutions that may not explicitly focus on the holocaust continue to engage these representational practices to highlight other instances of genocide and human rights abuses the case studies in this book illuminate the convergences between holocaust and human rights museums in their demands for social justice and reparation educational and activist purpose design principles and curatorial choices but it also shows how these museums can also be sites of contestation around how stories of suffering courage and survival are told whose stories are prioritized and who is consulted although holocaust museums were once the most influential form of representation of human rights issues in the international museum and heritage fields they are now in dialogue visually spatially methodologically with museums and memorial sites concerned with human rights more broadly interrogating debates in both museology and holocaust memory studies this volume reveals how institutions dedicated to these concerns have become active and influential contributors to local national and transnational dialogues about human rights contributors avril alba brook andrew jennifer barrett jennifer carter danielle celermajer steven cooke donna lee frieze shirli gilbert sulamith graefenstein christoph hanzig vannessa hearman rosanne kennedy marcia langton edwina light wendy lipworth a dirk moses tali nates jessica neath michael robertson amy sodaro garry walter

gerald k stone has collected books about canadian jewry since the early 1980s this volume is a descriptive catalog of his judaica collection comprising nearly 6 000 paper or electronic documentary resources in english french yiddish and hebrew logically organized indexed and selectively annotated the catalog is broad in scope covering jewish canadian history biography religion literature the holocaust antisemitism israel and the middle east and more an introduction by richard menkis discusses the significance of the catalog and collecting for the study of the jewish experience in canada an informative bibliographical resource this book will be of interest to scholars and students of canadian and north american jewish studies

islamophobia has been on the rise since september 11 as seen in countless cases of discrimination racism hate speeches physical attacks and anti muslim campaigns the 2006 danish cartoon crisis and the controversy surrounding pope benedict xvi s regensburg speech have underscored the urgency of such issues as image making multiculturalism freedom of expression respect for religious symbols and interfaith relations the 1997 runnymede report defines islamophobia as dread hatred and hostility towards islam and muslims perpetuated by a series of closed views that imply and attribute negative and derogatory stereotypes and beliefs to muslims violating the basic principles of human rights civil liberties and religious freedom islamophobic acts take many different forms in some cases mosques islamic centers and muslim properties are attacked and desecrated in the workplace schools and housing it takes the form of suspicion staring hazing mockery rejection stigmatizing and outright discrimination in public places it occurs as indirect discrimination hate speech and denial of access to goods and services this collection of essays takes a multidisciplinary approach to islamophobia bringing together the expertise and experience of muslim american and european scholars analysis is combined with policy recommendations contributors discuss and evaluate good practices already in place and offer new methods for dealing with discrimination hatred and racism

oren baruch stier traces the lives and afterlives of certain remnants of the holocaust and their ongoing impact he shows how and why four icons an object a phrase a person and a number have come to stand in for the holocaust where they came from and how they have been used and reproduced how they are presently at risk from a variety of threats such as commodification and what the future holds for the memory of the shoah

today writing by hand seems a nearly archaic process nearly all of our written communication is digital our letters are via email or text message our manuscripts are composed using word processors our journals are blogs and we sign checks to pay bills with the push of a button sonja neef believes that what we have lost in our modern technological conversation is the ductus the physical and material act of handwriting in imprint and trace neef argues however that handwriting throughout its history has always been threatened with erasure it exists in a dual state able to be standardized repeated copied much like an imprint and yet persistently singular original and authentic as a trace or line throughout its history from the first prehistoric handprint through the innovations of stylus quill and printing press handwriting has revealed an interweaving ever changing relationship between imprint and trace even today in the age of the digital revolution the trace of handwriting is still an integral part of communication whether etched photographed pixelated or scanned imprint and trace presents an essential re evaluation of the relationships between handwriting and technology and between the various imprints and traces that define communication

providing a general overview of the accurate history of world war ii which was essentially a continuation of world war i with the same saber rattling participants the ruling elite describes the circumstances leading up

to world war ii author deanna spingola discusses how the diaspora distributed international bankers living and prospering in britain france and america influenced greedy compromised and complicit politicians in those nations the ruling elite explains that through deceptive propaganda those politicians persuaded nave citizens to wage war against germany a peace loving nation whose leaders were uncooperative with the bankers which led to world war i following that war german officials rejected the bankers and their money lending scheme to save their nation and its citizens from the burden of debt the aftermath of world war iia deadly war that killed millions and imposed communism in numerous countriesimpacted every banker occupied country in various ways culturally morally politically and economically researched through historical documents and scholarly works the ruling elite describes how warmongers regularly project their criminal activities onto others frequently blaming the victim whether an individual or a nation spingola offers an unbiased look at world war ii beginning with hitler and the rebirth of germany through the aftermath of the war

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
