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political scientists and political theorists have long been interested in social and political performance theatre and performance researchers have often focused on the political dimensions of the live arts yet the interdisciplinary nature of this labor has typically been assumed rather than rigorously explored further it is crucial to bring the concepts of theatre and performance deployed by other disciplines such as psychology law political anthropology sociology among others into a wider as well as deeper interdisciplinary engagement embodying and fostering that engagement is

at the heart of this new handbook the handbook brings together leading scholars in the fields of politics and performance to map out the evolving interdisciplinary engagement the authors drawn from a wide range of disciplines investigate the relationship between politics and performance to show that certain features of political transactions shared by performances are fundamental to both disciplines and that they also share to a large extent a common communicational base and language the volume is organized into seven thematic sections the interdisciplinary theory of politics and performance performativity and theatricality protest regulation resistance change authority identities race gender sexuality class citizenship indigeneity sites states borders markets law religion scripts accountability authority and legitimacy security ceremony sustainability body voice and gesture representation leadership participation rhetoric disruption and affect media care love empathy comedy populism memory

the research handbook on visual politics focuses on key theories and methodologies for better understanding visual political communication it also concentrates on the depictions of power within politics taking a historical and longitudinal approach to the topic of placing visuals within a wider framework of political understanding

this edited volume breaks new ground and opens up new perspectives by capturing the role played by claims to authenticity in populist discourses in brazil india and ukraine by conceiving of both triumphant populism and increasing demands for authenticity as expressions of crisis the volume seeks to satisfy the need to take a closer look at yearnings for orientation in a globalised world that is often associated with rapid social change and the disappearance of old certainties starting from the assumption that media play a crucial role for populist discourses of authenticity the volume moves beyond conventional and social media by expanding its focus to media in formal education notably school textbooks and curricula these two particular media formats lastingly shape younger generations and thus the future the proposed volume adopts global perspectives from three postcolonial countries that are often beyond the scope of studies dealing with populist discourses and media entanglements insights that contribute new aspects to international scholarly debates

two decades after its launch by the un brundtland commission the paradigm of sustainability seems to have reached its limits whilst the concept figures more prominently in public debate and policy making than ever before the ecological footprint of advanced liberal consumer societies continues to grow and the forceful economic development of countries such as china and india reinforces concerns that the world is moving further away from rather than closer towards the ideal of sustainability given the proven failure of ecological modernisation strategies to secure sustainability the traditional question how may our established lifestyles and socio economic practices be made more sustainable needs to be supplemented by a second equally important question how do advanced modern consumer democracies try and manage to sustain what is known to be unsustainable put differently traditional research into the politics of sustainability needs to be supplemented by a new line of research into the politics of unsustainability exploring the recent transformation of eco political discourses and a variety of ways in which the unfolding paradox of sustaining the unsustainable is being managed the present volume pioneers this new research agenda this book was previously published as a special issue of environmental politics

this book deals with the broader theoretical and philosophical context of performance art in former yugoslavia focusing on more than three decades of politically engaged performance activity of the montažstroj group their activity is only a starting point for a deeper analysis of some of the key notions of contemporary art ivism in a much broader post political and globalized context before during and after yugoslavia and its socialist paradigm collapsed the author analyzes and sets notions of agonism engagement terrorism post war trauma political populism social darwinism participation and publicness and the public sphere into different theoretical matrixes

information explore practices generating knowledge actors authority and legitimacy and analyse struggles over competing policy narratives a first set of chapters focuses on the social construction of facts truth and authenticity through studies of militia research in the dr congo politicians on site visits in intervention theatres in the balkans and afghanistan and the epistemic practices of human rights watch and comics journalism a second set of contributions analyses the strategic side of knowledge through case studies of diplomatic counterinsurgency in bosnia and herzegovina african governments active role in the bunkerization of international aid workers and authoritarian peacebuilding as a challenge to the liberal power knowledge regime in world politics this book was originally published as a special issue of the journal of intervention and statebuilding

in the mid 1980s neil postman claimed that television made entertainment the natural format for the representation of all experience while postman s argument still is pertinent to a description of contemporary television shows it also seems increasingly more accurate to argue that reality based entertainment is quickly becoming the referential format for televisual representations of our experience in the 21st century chapters in this edited volume explore reality television s place within contemporary media landscape in terms of its potential for political engagement the authors engage with a variety of issues such as politics of authenticity and performance audience reception of political issues ethics and media regulation politics of self presentation modernity and collective identity the diversity of perspectives and issues presented in this book cautions readers both against quickly dismissing reality television s potential as a platform for political discourse and against subscribing to the celebratory rhetoric regarding the democratic potential of reality television reel politics reality television as a platform for political discourse furthers our understanding of the semiotic openness of the reality text and the variations in social cultural and political contexts across which the reality television genre formulas migrate

in recent decades authenticity has become an american obsession it animates thirty years worth of reality to programming and fuels the explosive virality of one hot social media app after another it characterizes donald trump s willful disregard for political correctness and proofreading and inspires multinational corporations to stake activist claims in ways that few woke brands ever dared before it buttresses a multibillion dollar influencer industry of everyday folks shilling their friends with spon con and burnishes the street cred of rock stars and rappers alike but ironically authenticity s not actually real it s as fabricated as it is ubiquitous in the authenticity industries journalist and scholar michael serazio combines eye opening reporting and lively prose to take readers behind the scenes with those who make reality and the ways it tries to influence us drawing upon dozens of rare interviews with campaign consultants advertising executives tech company leadership and entertainment industry gatekeepers the book slyly investigates the professionals and practices that make people products and platforms seem authentic in today s media culture and politics the result is a spotlight on the power of authenticity in today s media saturated world and the strategies to satisfy this widespread yearning in theory authenticity might represent the central moral framework of our time allaying anxieties about self and society culture and commerce and technology and humanity it infects and informs our ideals of celebrity aesthetics privacy nostalgia and populism and serazio reveals how these pretenses are crafted backstage for audiences

in contrast to many books on islam that focus on political rhetoric and activism this book explores

when eldridge cleaver wrote in 1965 that black men shall have our manhood or the earth will be leveled by our attempt to gain it he voiced a central strain of black power movement rhetoric in print as well as on stage and screen black power advocates equated masculinity with their political radicalism and potency while many observers have criticized the misogyny in this preoccupation few have noted the challenges to it within the period in the works of authors such as james baldwin john edgar wideman clarence major and john oliver killens these and other writers tested the link between masculinity and radical politics by recovering their voices rolland murray demonstrates that the movement s gender ideals were questioned more fully than scholars have acknowledged he also examines how the black power era s contentious gender politics continue to play a role in contemporary african american culture and scholarship murray analyzes the ways in which notions of masculinity were interwoven with essential movement philosophies regarding revolutionary violence charismatic leadership radical rhetoric and black sexuality striving to forge a more nuanced account of how masculinist discourse contributed to the movement s overall agenda he frames masculinity both as a linchpin of the seductive politics of black power and as a focal point of dissent by black male authors

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
