archaeology the basics rewritten for this fourth edition is a short engaging book that takes the reader on a journey through the fascinating world of archaeology and archaeologists written in a non technical style by two experienced archaeologists and writers about the past the book begins by introducing archaeology as a unique way of studying the entire span of the human past from our origins some six million years ago to today the authors stress that archaeology is a global study of human biological and cultural diversity after a brief look at early archaeological discoveries they introduce today s multidisciplinary archaeology then they go on to describe the archaeological record the archives of the past and the importance of contexts of time and space how do we find archaeological sites and how do we explore them two chapters laced with examples examine these questions later chapters describe ancient technologies and how we study them and the all important subject of changing ancient environments and climate change zooarchaeology flotation methods and other ways of reconstructing ancient diet and subsistence lead us into the study of changing settlement patterns across the landscape next they visit the people of the past either as individuals or groups calling on bioarchaeology to assist them two chapters discuss ancient culture change and the remarkable diversity of ancient societies and they are followed by an exploration of the spiritual realm the exploration of the intangible the final chapter looks at the importance of archaeology in today s world rich in numerous examples and contemporary thinking about archaeology this book tries to answer an important question what does archaeology tell us about ourselves archaeology the basics is essential reading for all those beginning to study archaeology and anyone who has ever questioned the past

this book teaches students and scholars of greco roman medical history how to use and critically assess archaeological materials ancient medicine is a subject dominated by textual sources yet there is a wealth of archaeological remains that can be used to broaden our understanding of medicine in the past in order to use the information properly this book explains how to ask questions of an archaeological nature how to access different types of archaeological materials and how to overcome problems the researcher might face it also acts as an introduction to the archaeology of medicine for archaeologists interested in this aspect of their subject although the focus is on the greco roman period the methods and

theories explained within the text can be applied to other periods in history the areas covered include text as material culture images artifacts spaces of medicine and science and archaeology

taking as its central theme the issue of whether early hominins organized themselves into societies as we understand them john mcNabb looks at how modern researchers recognize such archaeological cultures he examines the existence of a stone tool culture called the clactonian to introduce the multidisciplinary nature of the subject in analyzing the various kinds of data archaeologists would use to investigate the existence of a palaeolithic culture this book represents the latest research in archaeology population dispersals geology climatology human palaeontology evolutionary psychology environmental and biological disciplines and dating techniques along with many other research methods

the first study to bring together such a breadth of data this book compares responses to colonization in the iron age mediterranean from north syria to sicily and north africa tamar hodos explores the responses to these colonies in areas where greeks and phoenicians were in competition with one another via the same local communities highlighting the diversity of interest displayed by local populations in these foreign cultural offering hodos charts their selective adaptation modification and reinterpretation of greek and phoenician goods and ideas as their own cultures evolve for students of archaeology and history this will provide an essential resource for their degree course studies
