the core of this book is a systematic treatment of the historic transformation of the west from monarchy to democracy revisionist in nature it reaches the conclusion that monarchy is a lesser evil than democracy but outlines deficiencies in both its methodology is axiomatic deductive allowing the writer to derive economic and sociological theorems and then apply them to interpret historical events a compelling chapter on time preference describes the progress of civilization as lowering time preferences as capital structure is built and explains how the interaction between people can lower time all around with interesting parallels to the ricardian law of association by focusing on this transformation the author is able to interpret many historical phenomena such as rising levels of crime degeneration of standards of conduct and morality and the growth of the mega state in underscoring the deficiencies of both monarchy and democracy the author demonstrates how these systems are both inferior to a natural order based on private property hoppe deconstructs the classical liberal belief in the possibility of limited government and calls for an alignment of conservatism and libertarianism as natural allies with common goals he defends the proper role of the production of defense as undertaken by insurance companies on a free market and describes the emergence of private law among competing insurers having established a natural order as superior on utilitarian grounds the author goes on to assess the prospects for achieving a natural order informed by his analysis of the deficiencies of social democracy and armed with the social theory of legitimation he forsees secession as the likely future of the us and europe resulting in a multitude of region and city states this book complements the author s previous work defending the ethics of private property and natural order democracy the god that failed will be of interest to scholars and students of history political economy and political philosophy

this book questions the conventional wisdom about one of the most controversial episodes in the cold war and tells the story of the cia s backing of the congress for cultural freedom for nearly two decades during the early cold war the cia secretly sponsored some of the world s most feted writers philosophers and scientists as part of a campaign to prevent communism from regaining a foothold in western europe and from spreading to asia by backing the congress for cultural freedom the cia subsidized dozens of prominent magazines global congresses annual seminars and artistic festivals when this operation gkopera became public in 1967 it ignited one of the most damaging scandals in cia history ever since then many accounts have argued that the cia manipulated a generation of intellectuals into lending their names to pro american anti communist ideas others have suggested a more nuanced picture of the relationship between the congress and the cia with intellectuals sometimes resisting the cia s bidding very few accounts however have examined the man who held the congress together michael josselson the congress s indispensable manager and secretly a long time cia agent this book fills that gap using a wealth of archival research and interviews with many of the figures associated with the congress this book sheds new light on how the congress came into existence and functioned both as a magnet for prominent intellectuals and as a cia operation this book will be of much interest to students of the cia cold war history intelligence studies us foreign policy and international relations in general

secular humanists and other progressives have been predicting the demise of religion for the past 250 years but they keep running into a problem those who were supposed to be liberated by the secular gospel that god is dead aren t buying it except for some parts of western europe and in countries culturally destroyed by communism secularization in the radical sense has not occurred while it has not obliterated the religious impulse however the drive towards progressive irreligion has robert royal believes encouraged ignorance of religion s central role in the development of the west in the god that did not fail royal offers an original reading of religion in ancient greece and rome of christianity and judaism the middle ages the renaissance and reformation the several modern enlightenments culminating with a profound assessment of our current postmodern moment he concludes that since religion is a permanent part of human nature and of the particular character of the west our efforts should be directed not into a quixotic effort to deny the undeniable especially as we face challenges from islamic fundamentalism but into promoting a well thought out and dynamic interplay of faith reason and modern freedoms

from a height of almost 100 000 members during the depression when politicians workers and intellectuals were drawn into its orbit the american communist party has descended into irrelevance and isolation failing even to run a presidential candidate in 1988 indeed as guenter lewy writes in this critical account of american communism despite decades of feverish activity and ferocious discipline it was a cause doomed to fail from the very beginning in the cause that failed lewy offers an incisive narrative of the american communist party from the days of john reed to the advent of glasnost he traces its origins and development underscoring how its devotion to moscow and inflexible marxist ideology isolated it from the american scene in fact most of its first members were eastern european immigrants during the left wing tide of the depression the communist party reached the peak of its influence as it joined labor unions and progressive organizations in a popular front but lewy reveals the deceptive antidemocratic self defeating tactics the communists pursued even then as they manipulated front organizations seized control of political parties peace groups and labor unions and enforced political conformity among members and sympathizers he follows the party through its inexorable decline in the succeeding decades up to its current position as one of the last stalinist parties left in a world of glasnost and perestroika lewy also provides a sharply critical discussion of the

encounter between communism and liberal and mainstream america he examines such groups as the aclu and sane arguing that the years when these organizations were tolerant toward communists were also the times when they neglected their original purpose in favor of partisan causes he shows how communists have manipulated well meaning citizens in the peace movement and in wallace s 1948 progressive party presidential campaign one of the great ills americans suffer he writes is an overreaction to mccarthyism an atmosphere of anti anticommunism which blinds them to the wrongs wrought by international communism and makes them ignore the deceptive role played by the american communist party which even today still keeps eighty percent of its membership secret the cause that failed presents an intensively researched and trenchantly argued historical analysis of communism in america guenter lewy s provocative account provides a new understanding of communism s machinations in u s politics and how americans from across the political spectrum have responded to its challenge

communism has generally been seen to be in long and gradual retreat all over the world since the 1980 s unease against communism and its general principles has been known since at least 1968 when the prague spring unraveled itself this was a period of liberalization in eastern europe but was brutally suppressed by the former soviet union and its communist leaders who feared its ripple and cascading effects in the rest of the communist world the soviet union itself crumbled less than a quarter of a century later this collapse was precipitated by mikhail gorbachev s reforms namely glasnost or openness and perestroika or structural reform gorbachev needs no introduction to most people he was born in 1931 and died in 2022 gorbachev s began his political career in the communist party of the former soviet union where gradually he rose through the ranks to assume leadership positions becoming general secretary in 1985 gorbachev gradually moved away from orthodox stalinism leninism to embrace more democratic ideals he therefore sought to modernize the ussr by saving its stagnant economy which was even being overtaken by newly emerging asian powers and counter nationalist sentiments in other soviet republics the soviet union was subsequently formally dissolved on the 26th of december 1991 by a declaration known as 142 n all the soviet republics declared their independence effectively putting an end to the ussr which vanished into the annals of history many communist nations of eastern europe were dissolved even prior to this with the berlin wall falling in november 1989 and nicolae ceausescu s regime in romania being toppled a month later

the main concern of this study is the artist s vision of society its major theme is the

relation between the individual and society resulting from the impact of social and political upheavals on individual life by criticism of society i mean the novelist s awareness of the social reality and of the individual s response to it the writers i deal with all proved alive to the changes that were taking place in english society between the two world wars though the social attitudes of the inter war years as well as the writers response to them were shaped by lasting and complex influences such as trends in philosophy and science the two wars stand out as determining factors in the development of the novel the consequences of the first were explored by most writers in the twenties whereas in the following decade the novelists felt compelled to voice the anxiety aroused by the threat of another conflict and to warn against its possible effects after the first world war many writers felt keenly the social disruption the old standards which were thought to have made this suicidal war possible were distrusted the code of behaviour and the moral values of the older generation were openly criticized for having led to bankruptcy disparagement of authority increased the individual s sense of isolation his insecurity his disgust or fear even the search for pleasure so widely satirized in the twenties was the expression of a cynicism born of despair the ensuing disengagement of the individual from his environment became a major theme in the novel his isolation was at once a cause for resentment and the source of his fierce individualism
