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endocentric structuring of projection free syntax puts forward a novel theory of syntax that rigidly adheres to the principle of minimal computation in which a number of traditional but extraneous stipulations such as referential indices and representational labels projections are eliminated it specifically articulates the overarching hypothesis that every syntactic object is composed by recursive phase by phase embedding of the endocentric structure $h \alpha$ where h is a head lexical item and α is another syntactic object order irrelevant the proposed mechanism achieves both theory internal simplicity and broad empirical coverage at the same time advancing a radically reduced conception of endocentricity headedness while deriving a number of empirically grounded constraints on human language
