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paints a lucid picture of the medieval world view providing the historical and cultural background to the literature of the middle ages and renaissance this lewis s last book has been hailed as the final memorial to the work of a great scholar and teacher and a wise and noble mind

imagination has long been regarded as central to c s lewis s life and to his creative and critical works but this is the first study to provide a thorough analysis of his theory of imagination including the different ways he used the word and how those uses relate to each other peter schakel begins by concentrating on the way reading or engaging with the other arts is an imaginative activity he focuses on three books in which imagination is the central theme surprised by joy an experiment in criticism and the discarded image and shows the important role of imagination in lewis s theory of education he then examines imagination and reading in lewis s fiction concentrating specifically on the chronicles of narnia the most imaginative of his works he looks at how the imaginative experience of reading the chronicles is affected by the physical texture of the books the illustrations revisions of the texts the order in which the books are read and their narrative voice the storyteller who becomes almost a character in the stories imagination and the arts in c s lewis also explores lewis s ideas about imagination in the nonliterary arts although lewis regarded engagement with the arts as essential to a well rounded and satisfying life critics of his work and even biographers have given little attention to this aspect of his life schakel reviews the place of music dance art and architecture in lewis s life the ways in which he uses them as content in his poems and stories and how he develops some of the deepest most significant themes of his stories through them schakel concludes by analyzing the uses and abuses of imagination he looks first at moral imagination although lewis did not use this term schakel shows how lewis developed the concept in that hideous strength and the abolition of man long before it became popularized in the 1980s and 1990s while readers often concentrate on the christian dimension of lewis s works equally or more important to him was their moral dimension imagination and the arts in c s lewis will appeal to students and teachers of both children s literature and twentieth century british writers it will also be of value to readers who wish to compare lewis s creations with more recent imaginative works such as the harry potter series

unraveling the mysteries of the universe what do you see when you gaze at the night sky do you contemplate the stars as the random result of an evolutionary process or do you marvel over them as a testament of the creator's glory modern science has popularized a view of the cosmos that suggests there is no need for god and denies any evidence of his existence but the story of the cosmos provides a different and fascinating perspective it points to a god who makes himself known in the wonder and beauty of his creation this compilation from respected scholars and experts spans topics from the mathematical creation and the image of god to the glorious dance of binary stars and god's invisible attributes black holes contributors include dr william lane craig dr guillermo gonzalez dr melissa cain travis and dr michael ward come take a deeper look at the universe and explore the traces of god's glory in the latest discoveries of astronomy science literature and art

this timely and accessible book offers a fresh contemporary introduction to christian apologetics arguing for a version that is theological philosophical and catholic and embracing the whole of human reason it emphasizes a foundation in theology that is both confident and open and makes reference to philosophy in an accessible way it includes contributions from authors such as alister mcgrath and graham ward and a foreword by john milbank

the twentieth century humanist critics revisits the work and place of eight scholars roughly contemporary with anglo american new criticism leo spitzer ernst robert curtius erich auerbach albert bluguin jean rousset c s lewis f o matthiessen and northrop frye william calin first considers the achievements of each critic examining his methodology and basic presuppositions as well as the critiques marshalled against him calin explores their relation to history to canon formation and to our current theoretical debates he then goes on to show how all eight form a current in the history of criticism related to both humanism and modernism underscoring the international cosmopolitan aspects of literary scholarship in the twentieth century the twentieth century humanist critics brings together humanist critical traditions from europe the united kingdom and north america and reveals the surprising extent to which in various languages and academic systems critics were posing similar questions and offering a gamut of similar responses

sehnsucht the c s lewis journal established by the arizona c s lewis society in 2007 is the only peer reviewed journal devoted to the study of c s lewis and his writings published anywhere in the world it exists to promote literary theological historical biographical philosophical bibliographical and cultural interest broadly defined in lewis and his writings the journal includes articles review essays book reviews film reviews and play reviews bibliographical material poetry interviews editorials and announcements of lewis related conferences events and publications its readership is aimed at academic scholars from a wide variety of disciplines as well as learned non scholars and lewis enthusiasts at this time sehnsucht is published once a year

most popularly known as the author of the children s classic the chronicles of narnia c s lewis was also a prolific poet essayist novelist and christian writer his most famous work the lion the witch and the wardrobe while known as a children s book is often read as a christian allegory and remains to this day one of his best loved works but lewis was prolific in a number of areas including poetry christian writing literary criticism letters memoir autobiography sermons and more this set written by experts guides readers to a better understanding and appreciation of this important and influential writer clive staples lewis was born on november 29 1898 in belfast northern ireland his mother died when he was young leaving his father to raise him and his older brother warren he fought and was wounded in world war i and later became immersed in the spiritual life of christianity while he delved into the world of christian writing he did not limit himself to one genre and produced a remarkable oeuvre that continues to be widely read taught and adored at all levels as part of the circle known as the inklings which consisted of writers and intellectuals and included j r r tolkien charles williams and others he developed and honed his skills and continued to put out extensive writings many different groups now claim him as their own spanning genres from science fiction to christian literature from nonfiction to children s stories his output remains among the most popular and complex here experts in the field of lewis studies examine all his works along with the details of his life and the culture in which he lived to give readers the fullest complete picture of the man the writer and the husband alongside his works his legacy and his place in english letters

this new study by lionel adey is unique in its attempt to trace the development of c s lewis as a maker and reader of books adey shows how the two sides of lewis s personality dreamer and mentor affected his writing in its various modes l

although it has been almost seventy years since time declared c s lewis one of the world s most influential spokespersons for christianity and fifty years since lewis s death his influence remains just as great if not greater today while much has been written on lewis and his work virtually nothing has been written from a philosophical perspective on his views of happiness pleasure pain and the soul and body as a result no one so far has recognized that his views on these matters are deeply interesting and controversial and perhaps more jarring no one has yet adequately explained why lewis never became a roman catholic stewart goetz s careful investigation of lewis s philosophical thought reveals oft overlooked implications and demonstrates that it was at its root at odds with that of thomas aquinas and thereby the roman catholic church
