popular histories of organized crime in the united states often look to the mafia and the sons of early twentieth century immigrants such as al capone lucky luciano and meyer lansky for their origins in this second edition of organized crime and american power michael woodiwiss refocuses on us organized crime as an american problem the book starts in 1789 with the birth of a new nation intended to be run according to laws and conventions with a written commitment to civil rights woodiwiss examines the organization of crime before the civil war which damaged or destroyed the lives of those excluded from constitutional protections indigenous peoples black people and women the book focuses on white supremacist crime and the pernicious influence of southern leaders in alliance with opportunistic politicians it examines the organized crimes of powerful business interests in alliance with

politicians as well as the corrupt consequences of the us moralistic campaigns against alcohol gambling drugs and abortion organized crime and american power brings solid historical evidence and analysis to the task of refuting conventional wisdom that frames organized crime as something external to us political economic and social systems

why did the youthful optimism and openness of the sixties give way to ronald reagan and the spirit of conservative reaction a spirit that remains ascendant today drawing on a wide array of sources including tabloid journalism popular fiction movies and television shows philip jenkins argues that a remarkable confluence of panics scares and a few genuine threats created a climate of fear that led to the conservative reaction he identifies 1975 to 1986 as the watershed years during this time he says there was a sharp increase in perceived threats to our security at home and abroad at home america seemed to be threatened by monstrous criminals serial killers child abusers satanic cults and predatory drug dealers to name just a few on the international scene we were confronted by the soviet union and its evil empire by opec with its stranglehold on global oil by the ayatollahs who made hostages of our diplomats in iran increasingly these dangers began to be described in terms of moral evil rejecting the radicalism of the 60s which many saw as the source of the crisis americans adopted a more pessimistic interpretation of human behavior which harked back to much older themes in american culture this simpler but darker vision ultimately brought us ronald reagan and the ascendancy of the political right which more than two decades later shows no sign of loosening its grip writing in his usual crisp and witty prose jenkins offers a truly original and persuasive account of a period that continues to fascinate the american public it is bound to captivate anyone who lived through this period as well as all those who want to understand the forces that transformed and continue to define the american political landscape

anchor these claims methodologically the research is innovative in advancing inquiry into ethically and logistically challenging environments the style of writing and framing of the text is one that punches upward and avoids the voyeuristic and reductionist tropes historically associated with dangerous fieldwork through a range of disciplinary perspectives corrupt capital offers both scholarly rigor and inviting prose to advance our understanding of crimes of the relatively powerful and powerless alike an accessible and compelling text this book will appeal to readers in criminology sociology law and society political science and all those interested in learning about the relationship between power law and routinized corruption in the nightlife economy

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
