the problem of free will is one of the oldest and most central philosophical conundrums the contemporary debate around it has produced a range of sophisticated proposals but shows no sign of leading to convergence christian onof reviews these contemporary approaches and argues that their main shortcomings are ultimately due to paradoxical requirements on free will imposed by the naturalistic framework onof singles out kant s critical solution as one that stands out among historical approaches insofar as it is based upon a rejection of this framework by using the same methodological tool that he applies to contemporary proposals namely a distinction between a volitional account of how we control our actions a psychological account of the reasons for it and a metaphysical account of our status as agent onof shows that kant s solution constitutes a coherent picture of free will by exhibiting the structure running through several key publications of kant s critical period and drawing upon unpublished notes onof addresses several debates which loom large in contemporary kant literature his exegetical work puts kant s theory into conversation with contemporary analytic theories of free will and leads to defining a kantian position that overcomes the issues plaguing existing approaches to the problem of free will

this book is an easy reference to the origin and history of the false doctrine of free will it shows the inception of the false idea from before creation by satan and down through history including those who are still purporting the lies of free will today the book also shows the contrast of the lies of free will to the truth that being the sovereignty of god in all things including his creation and their destiny

the limits of free will presents influential articles by paul russell concerning free will and moral responsibility the problems arising in this field of philosophy which are deeply rooted in the history of the subject are also intimately related to a wide range of other fields such as law and criminology moral psychology theology and more recently neuroscience these articles were written and published over a period of three decades although most have appeared in the past decade among the topics covered the challenge of skepticism moral sentiment and moral capacity necessity and the metaphysics of causation practical reason free will and art fatalism and the limits

of agency moral luck and our metaphysical attitudes of optimism and pessimism some essays are primarily critical in character presenting critiques and commentary on major works or contributions in the contemporary scene others are mainly constructive aiming to develop and articulate a distinctive account of compatibilism the general theory advanced by russell which he describes as a form of critical compatibilism rejects any form of unqualified or radical skepticism but it also insists that a plausible compatibilism has significant and substantive implications about the limits of agency and argues that this licenses a metaphysical attitude of modest pessimism on this topic while each essay is self standing there is nevertheless a core set of themes and issues that unite and link them together the collection is arranged and organized in a format that enables the reader to appreciate and recognize these links and core themes

a crystal clear scientifically rigorous argument for the existence of free will challenging what many scientists and scientifically minded philosophers believe philosophers have argued about the nature and the very existence of free will for centuries today many scientists and scientifically minded commentators are skeptical that it exists especially when it is understood to require the ability to choose between alternative possibilities if the laws of physics govern everything that happens they argue then how can our choices be free believers in free will must be misled by habit sentiment or religious doctrine why free will is real defies scientific orthodoxy and presents a bold new defense of free will in the same naturalistic terms that are usually deployed against it unlike those who defend free will by giving up the idea that it requires alternative possibilities to choose from christian list retains this idea as central resisting the tendency to defend free will by watering it down he concedes that free will and its prerequisites intentional agency alternative possibilities and causal control over our actions cannot be found among the fundamental physical features of the natural world but he argues that s not where we should be looking free will is a higher level phenomenon found at the level of psychology it is like other phenomena that emerge from physical processes but are autonomous from them and not best understood in fundamental physical terms like an ecosystem or the economy when we discover it in its proper context acknowledging that free will is real is not just scientifically respectable it is indispensable for explaining our world

the philosophical debate about free will and responsibility has been of great importance throughout the history of philosophy in modern times this debate has received an enormous resurgence of interest and the contribution in 1962 by p f strawson with the publication of his essay freedom and resentment has generated a wide range of discussion and criticism in the philosophical community and beyond the debate is of central importance to recent developments in the free will

literature and has shaped the way contemporary philosophers now approach the problem this volume brings together a focused selection of the major contributions and reactions to the free will and responsibility debate inspired by strawson s contribution mckenna and russell also provide a comprehensive overview of the debate this book will be of great value to scholars of strawson and those interested in the free will debate more generally

the traditional doctrine of god s universal causality holds that god directly causes all entities distinct from himself including all creaturely actions but can our actions be free in the strong libertarian sense if they are directly caused by god w matthews grant argues that free creaturely acts have dual sources god and the free creaturely agent and are ultimately up to both in a way that leaves all the standard conditions for libertarian freedom satisfied offering a comprehensive alternative to existing approaches for combining theism and libertarian freedom he proposes new solutions for reconciling libertarian freedom with robust accounts of god s providence grace and predestination he also addresses the problem of moral evil without the commonly employed free will defense written for analytic philosophers and theologians grant s approach can be characterized as neo scholastic as well as analytic since many of the positions defended are inspired by consonant with and develop resources drawn from the scholastic tradition especially aquinas

this book was written for those who have a general interest in how the concepts of personal freedom and determinism affect their daily lives and their dealings with other people

comprising erasmus s the free will and luther s response the bondage of the will discourse on free will is a landmark text in the history of theology and philosophy as erasmus s humanist vision is contrasted with luther s notion of freedom dictated by the grace of god we can see the beginning of the debates that to this day separate the secular and the religious

this book is the result of a discontent on my part with r the super ficial and offhand way many determinists set forth their arguments without the slightest hint of the difficulties which have been raised against those arguments and 2 the fact that the chief and libertarians are scattered allover the literature and are seldom if ever brought together in one

package may be taken as an effort to gather into one place mostly this work and to express as cogently as possible the arguments for freewill so far as i know all of the arguments we treat have been made before only toward the end of this work do i attempt to elaborate a point not heretofore emphasized that point is that freedom of the will is a concept intimately entangled with the human power to reason so that if one of these powers goes the other must also go moreover both the will and the reason are intimately tied up with our moral sensitivities so that no one of these phenomena is intelligible without the others hints of these ideas abound of course in the literature and the degree of originality claimed is minimal the interconnections however between these three basic concepts of the will the reason and the good are of such great importance and are so usually ignored that i feel our short statement of the situation warrants the reader s sympathetic attention

the philosophical inquiry concerning human liberty of anthony collins was considered by joseph priestley and voltaire to be the best book written on freewill up to their own time priestley admitted that it converted him to determinism and it had a powerful effect on voltaire in the same direction it seems important to place in its wider historical context a book which so influenced such men and which greatly impressed the philosophes in general therefore and because such an account has value in itself the introduction contains a survey of the freewill controversy from the time of hobbes to that of leibniz giving in some detail the opinions of hobbes locke pierre bayle william king archbishop of dublin and leibniz and an account of the scholastic doctrine of liberty of indifference opinions which either influenced collins or against which he reacted the value and originality of collins works need assessing he was also at times liable to misinterpret or misunderstand the authorities he quoted i have therefore subjected the inquiry to a detailed critique this also gives cross references to parallel passages in collins works and those of the authors who influenced him and by discussing the philosophical and theological questions to which his writings give rise obviates the need for a good many footnotes in the notes that follow the text

free will in philosophical theology takes the most recent philosophical work on free will and uses it to elucidate and explore theological doctrines involving free will rather than being a work of natural theology it is a work in what has been called clarification using philosophy to understand develop systematize and explain theological claims without first raising the justification for holding the theological claims that one is working with time's aim is to show how a particular philosophical account of the nature of free will an account known as source incompatibilism can help us understand a range of theological doctrines

robert kane provides a critical overview of debates about free will of the past half century relating this recent inquiry to the broader history of the free will issue and to vital currents of twentieth century thought kane also defends a traditional libertarian or incompatibilist view of free will one that insists upon the incompatibility of free will and determinism employing arguments that are both new to philosophy and that respond to contemporary developments in physics and biology neuro science and the cognitive and behavioral sciences

mele's ultimate purpose in this book is to help readers think more clearly about free will he identifies and makes vivid the most important conceptual obstacles to justified belief in the existence of free will and meets them head on mele clarifies the central issue in the philosophical debate about free will and moral responsibility criticizes various influential contemporary theories about free will and develops two overlapping conceptions of free will one for readers who are convinced that free will is incompatible with determinism incompatibilists and the other for readers who are convinced of the opposite compatibilists mele's theory offers an original perspective on an important problem and will garner the attention of anyone interested in the debate on free will

in his book philosopher and law professor ken levy explains why he agrees with most people but not with most other philosophers about free will and responsibility most people believe that we have both that is that our choices decisions and actions are neither determined nor undetermined but rather fully self determined by contrast most philosophers understand just how difficult it is to defend this metaphysical libertarian position so they tend to opt for two other theories responsibility skepticism which denies the very possibility of free will and responsibility and compatibilism which reduces free will and responsibility to properties that are compatible with

determinism in opposition to both of these theories levy explains how free will and responsibility are indeed metaphysically possible but he also cautions against the dogma that metaphysical libertarianism is actually true a widespread belief that continues to cause serious social political and legal harms levy s book presents a crisp tight historically informed discussion with fresh clarity insight and originality it will become one of the definitive resources for students academics and general readers in this critical intersection among metaphysics ethics and criminal law key features presents a unique qualified defense of metaphysical libertarianism the idea that our choices decisions and actions can be fully self determined written clearly accessibly and with minimal jargon rare for a book on the very difficult issues of free will and responsibility seamlessly connects philosophical legal psychological and political issues will be provocative and insightful for professional philosophers students and non philosophers

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
