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wise often funny sometimes heartbreaking persepolis tells the story of marjane satrapi's life in tehran from the ages of six to fourteen years that saw the overthrow of the shah's regime the triumph of the islamic revolution and the devastating effects of war with iraq the intelligent and outspoken child of radical marxists and the great granddaughter of iran's last emperor satrapi bears witness to a childhood uniquely entwined with the history of her country persepolis paints an unforgettable portrait of daily life in iran and of the bewildering contradictions between home life and public life amidst the tragedy marjane's child's eye view adds immediacy and humour and her story of a childhood at once outrageous and ordinary beset by the unthinkable and yet buffered by an extraordinary and loving family is immensely moving it is also very beautiful satrapi's drawings have the power of the very best woodcuts

is always pleading to join her parents in political demonstrations which they refuse due to her young age however we find that satrapi can also have a rebellious side as proven in the incident in which she has her maid mehri accompany her to a demonstration on the worst day they could've gone black friday indeed marjane's mother slaps them both when they return home as this was the day when so many people had died in one neighborhood that a rumor spread that it was israeli soldiers who had attacked them when indeed it had been their own who attacked persepolis 1 pg 38 39 things start to look up when the shah finally leaves his post overthrown by the 1979 islamic revolution leading the whole country to rejoice marjane meets two political prisoners who are released after the shah's departure two communists named siamak and moshen buy a copy to keep reading

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is it possible to speak of a contemporary art with an islamic difference this question will be the subject of an exhibition that brings together artists who come from the islamic world but who live and work mostly in europe and the united states tapping into certain aesthetic political and spiritual notions commonly associated with the islamic world the book seeks to highlight the nuanced reactions of each individual artist

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this book offers intimate readings of a diverse range of global autobiographical literature with

an emphasis on the re presentation of the physical body the twelve texts discussed here include philosophical autobiography nietzsche autobiographies of self experimentation gandhi mishima warhol literary autobiography hemingway das as well as other genres of autobiography including the graphic novel spiegelman satrapi as also documentations of tragedy and injustice and subsequent spiritual overcoming ambedkar pawar angelou wiesel in exploring different literary forms and orientations of the autobiographies the work remains constantly attuned to the physical body a focus generally absent from literary criticism and philosophy or study of leading historical personages with the exception of patches within phenomenological philosophy and feminism the book delves into how the authors treated here deal with the flesh through their autobiographical writing and in what way they embody the essential relationship between flesh spirit and word it analyses some seminal texts such as ecce homo the story of my experiments with truth waiting for a visa i know why the caged bird sings a moveable feast night baluta my story sun and steel the philosophy of andy warhol maus and persepolis lucid bold and authoritative this book will be of great interest to scholars and researchers of philosophy literature gender studies political philosophy media and popular culture social exclusion and race and discrimination studies

this text tells the story of marjane satrapi s life in tehran from six to 14 years that saw the overthrow of the shah s regime the triumph of the islamic revolution the devastating effects of war with iraq satrapi paints a portrait of daily life in iran of the bewildering contradictions between home life public life

when more than 150 women testified in 2018 to the sexual abuse inflicted on them by dr larry nassar when they were young competitive gymnasts they exposed and transformed the conditions that shielded their violation including the testimonial disadvantages that cluster at the site of gender youth and race in witnessing girlhood leigh gilmore and elizabeth marshall argue that they also joined a long tradition of autobiographical writing led by women of color in which adults use the figure and narrative of child witness to expose harm and seek justice witnessing girlhood charts a history of how women use life narrative to transform conditions of suffering silencing and injustice into accounts that enjoin ethical response drawing on a deep and diverse archive of self representational forms slave narratives testimonio memoir comics and picture books gilmore and marshall attend to how authors return to a narrative of traumatized and silenced girlhood and the figure of the child witness in order to offer public testimony emerging within these accounts are key scenes and figures that link a range of texts and forms from the mid nineteenth century to the contemporary period gilmore and marshall offer a genealogy of the reverberations across timelines self representational acts and jurisdictions of the child witness in life writing reconstructing these historical and theoretical trajectories restores an intersectional testimonial history of writing by women of color about sexual and racist violence to the center of life writing and in so doing furthers our capacity to engage ethically with representations of vulnerability childhood and collective witness

the great granddaughter of iran s last emperor and the daughter of ardent marxists describes

growing up in tehran in a country plagued by political upheaval and vast contradictions between public and private life

he current political climate of confrontation between islamist regimes and western governments has resulted in the proliferation of essentialist perceptions of iran and iranians in the west such perceptions do not reflect the complex evolution of iranian identity that occurred in the years following the constitutional revolution 1906 11 and the anti imperialist islamic revolution of 1979 despite the iranian government s determined pursuance of anti western policies and strict conformity to religious principles the film and literature of iran reflect the clash between a nostalgic pride in persian tradition and an apparent infatuation with a more eurocentric modernity in familiar and foreign mannani and thompson set out to explore the tensions surrounding the ongoing formulation of iranian identity by bringing together essays on poetry novels memoir and films these include both canonical and less widely theorized texts as well as works of literature written in english by authors living in diaspora challenging neocolonialist stereotypes these critical excursions into iranian literature and film reveal the limitations of collective identity as it has been configured within and outside of iran through the examination of works by among others the iconic female poet forugh farrokhzad the expatriate author goli taraghi the controversial memoirist azar nafisi and the graphic novelist marjane satrapi author of persepolis this volume engages with the complex and contested discourses of religion patriarchy and politics that are the contemporary product of iran s long and revolutionary history
