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it is important to the survival of a people their culture to have an accurate complete account of their history for way too long in united states history african americans have been subjected to whitewashing segmented telling of their history until now we the black people untold truths of black american history changes this we begin at 1441 tell as comprehensive a story about the plight of africans in the new world united states through the present we cover well known little known topics as well as analyze the role of white supremacy in the struggle for african americans throughout the history of the united states despite the challenges there were many successes in the black experience we the black people is a book long overdue to expose the american citizenry to an aspect of its history long overlooked

the past and future of black history in this information overloaded twenty first century it seems impossible to fully discern or explain how we know about the past but two things are certain whether we are conscious of it or not we all think historically on a routine basis and

our perceptions of history including african american history have not necessarily been shaped by professional historians in this wide reaching and timely book pero gaglo dagbovie argues that public knowledge and understanding of black history including its historical icons has been shaped by institutions and individuals outside academic ivory towers drawing on a range of compelling examples dagbovie explores how in the twenty first century african american history is regarded depicted and juggled by diverse and contesting interpreters from museum curators to filmmakers entertainers politicians journalists and bloggers underscoring the ubiquitous nature of african american history in contemporary american thought and culture each chapter unpacks how black history has been represented and remembered primarily during the age of obama the so called era of post racial american society reclaiming the black past is dagbovie s contribution to expanding how we understand african american history during the new millennium

a valuable contribution to african american literary and theatrical scholarship this volume is a compilation of sixteen plays written during the harlem renaissance brought together for the first time and set in a historical context

in 2000 the united states census allowed respondents for the first time to tick a box marked african american in the race category the new option marked official recognition of a term that had been gaining currency for some decades africa has always played a role in black identity but it was in the tumultuous period between the two world wars that black americans first began to embrace a modern african american identity following the great migration of black southerners to northern cities after world war i the search for roots and for meaningful affiliations became subjects of debate and display in a growing black public sphere throwing off the legacy of slavery and segregation black intellectuals activists and organizations sought a prouder past in ancient egypt and forged links to contemporary africa in plays pageants dance music film literature and the visual arts they aimed to give stature and solidity to the american black community through a new awareness of the african past and the international black world their consciousness of a dual identity anticipated the hyphenated identities of new immigrants in the years after world war ii and an emerging sense of what it means to be a modern american

concerned scholars and educators since the early 20th century have asked questions regarding the viability of black history in k 12 schools over the years we have seen k 12 black history expand as an academic subject which has altered research questions that deviate from whether black history is important to know to what type of black history knowledge and pedagogies should be cultivated in classrooms in order to present a more holistic understanding of the group s historical significance research around this subject has been stagnated typically focusing on the subject s tokenism and problematic status within education we know little of the state of k 12 black history education and the different perspectives that black history encompasses the book perspectives on black histories in schools brings together a diverse group of scholars who discuss how k 12 black history is understood in education the book s chapters focus on the question what is black history and explores that inquiry through various mediums including its foundation curriculum pedagogy policy and psychology the book provides researchers teacher educators and historians an examination into how much k 12 black history has come and yet how long it still needed to go

first martyr of liberty explores how crispus attucks s death in the 1770 boston massacre led to his achieving mythic significance in african americans struggle to incorporate their experiences and heroes into the mainstream of the american historical narrative while the other victims of the massacre have been largely ignored attucks is widely celebrated as the first to die in the cause of freedom during the era of the american revolution he became a symbolic embodiment of black patriotism and citizenship this book traces attucks s career through both history and myth to understand how his public memory has been constructed through commemorations and monuments institutions and organizations bearing his name juvenile biographies works of poetry drama and visual arts popular and academic histories and school textbooks there will likely never be a definitive biography of crispus attucks since so little evidence exists about the man s actual life while what can and cannot be known about attucks is addressed here the focus is on how he has been remembered variously as either a hero or a villain and why at times he has been forgotten by different groups and individuals from the eighteenth century to the present day
