the most impressive legacy of the dynasty of akkade ca 2310-2160 b.c.e. was the widespread popular legends of its kings dr westenholz offers an annotated edition of all the known legends of the akkadian kings with transliteration translation and commentary of particular interest to biblical scholars is the inclusion of the birth legend of sargon which is often compared to mooses in exodus

scholars have long pointed to the great affinity between stories found in the bible and the qur'an yet no explanation has been proposed that satisfactorily explains the odd combination of incredible likeness and unique divergence. Firestone provides a refreshing new approach to scriptural issues of textuality, exegesis and the origins and use of legend. other victorian urban legends simon young fills this gap for british folklore and for the wider english speaking world of the 1800s young introduces seventy victorian urban legends ranging from beetle eyes to the shoplifter s dilemma and from hands in the muff to the suicide club while a handful of these stories are already known the vast majority have never been identified and they have certainly never received scholarly treatment young begins the volume with a lengthy introduction assessing nineteenth century media emphasizing the importance of the written word to the perpetuation and preservation of these myths he draws on numerous nineteenth century books periodicals and ephemera including digitized newspaper archives particularly the british newspaper archive an exciting new hunting ground for folklorists the nail in the skull and other victorian urban legends will appeal to an academic audience as well as to anyone who is interested in urban legends

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
