from 1539 to 1542 hernando de soto and several hundred armed men cut a path of destruction and disease across the southeast from florida to the mississippi river the eighteen contributors to this volume anthropologists ethnohistorians and literary critics investigate broad cultural and literary aspects of the resulting social and demographic collapse or radical transformation of many native societies and the gradual opening of the southeast to european colonization

in habsburg england gonzalo velasco berenguer offers a reassessment of the much maligned joint rulership of philip i of england philip ii of spain with his second wife mary i traditionally portrayed as an anomaly in english history previous assessments of the regime saw in it nothing but a record of backwardness and oppression using fresh archival material and paying full attention to the levels of integration and collaboration of spain and england in the political and religious domains velasco berenguer explores philip s role as king of england looks at the complexities of the reign in their own terms and concludes that during this brief but highly significant period england became an integral part of the spanish monarchy

200 cavalry spent four years traveling through what is now florida georgia alabama north and south carolina tennessee mississippi louisiana arkansas and texas for anthropologists archaeologists and historians the surviving de soto chronicles are valued for the unique ethnological information they contain these documents available here in a two volume set are the only detailed eyewitness records of the most advanced native civilization in north america the mississippian culture a culture that vanished in the wake of european contact
