frederic c schaffer challenges the assumption often made by american scholars that democracy has been achieved in foreign countries when criteria such as free elections are met elections he argues often have cultural underpinnings that are invisible to outsiders to examine grassroots understandings of democratic institutions and political concepts schaffer conducted fieldwork in senegal a mostly islamic and agrarian country with a long history of electoral politics schaffer discovered that ideas of demokaraasi held by wolof speakers often reflect concerns about collective security many senegalese see voting as less a matter of choosing leaders than of reinforcing community ties that may be called upon in times of crisis by looking carefully at language schaffer demonstrates that institutional arrangements do not necessarily carry the same meaning in different cultural contexts democracy in translation asks how social scientists should investigate the functioning of democratic institutions in cultures dissimilar from their own and raises larger issues about the nature of democracy the universality of democratic ideals and the practice of cross cultural research

this book locates an ethic of love as central to the democratic philosophies of martin luther king jr and cornel west while much has been written about king s moral vision social activism and theology there has been no book length treatment of the implications of his thinking to democratic theory additionally cornel west is the leading african american public intellectual of our time but the range of his cultural criticism and academic scholarship obscures his intellectual and social projects this project synthesizes west s vast corpus and places him within the modern african american intellectual tradition he shares with du bois king maulana karenga the creator of kwanza and others deeply grounded in the african american intellectual and philosophical traditions in which king and west are rooted as well as the western mainstream political philosophical traditions in which they were educated this book offers a penetrating interpretation and comparative analysis of their thought on the ideals of democracy and of their critiques of american democracy it also reflects on the nature and values of democracy exploring how love is inseparable from justice in a democratic society

anti democracy in england 1570 1642 is a detailed study of anti democratic ideas in

early modern england by examining the rich variety of debates about democracy that took place between 1570 and 1642 it shows the key importance anti democratic language held in the late tudor and early stuart periods in particular it argues that anti democratic critiques were addressed at popular government as a regime that empowered directly and fully the irrational uneducated dangerous commonalty it explains why and how criticism of democracy was articulated in the contexts here under scrutiny and it demonstrates that the early modern era is far more relevant to the development of democratic concepts and practices than has hitherto been acknowledged the study of anti democracy is carried out through a close textual analysis of sources often neglected in the history of political thought and by way of a contextual approach to elizabethan jacobean and caroline history most importantly the study re evaluates the role of religion and cultural factors in the history of democracy and of political ideas more generally the point of departure is at a time when the establishment and presbyterians were at loggerheads on pivotal politico ecclesiastical and theoretical matters the end coincides with the eruption of the civil wars cesare cuttica not only places the unexplored issue of anti democracy at the centre of historiographical work on early modern england but also offers a novel analysis of a precious portion of western political reflection and an ideal platform to discuss the legacy of principles that are still fundamental today

mediterranean states are often thought to have democratised only in the post war era as authoritarian regimes were successively overthrown on its eastern and southern shores the process is still contested re imagining democracy looks back to an earlier era the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries and argues it was this era when some modern version of democracy in the region first began by the 1860s representative regimes had been established throughout southern europe and representation was also the subject of experiment and debate in ottoman territories talk of democracy its merits and limitations accompanied much of this experimentation though there was no agreement as to whether or how it could be given stable political form re imagining democracy assembles experts in the history of the mediterranean who have been exploring these themes collaboratively to compare and contrast experiences in this region so that they can be set alongside better known debates and experiments in north atlantic states states in the region all experienced some form of subordination to northern great powers in this context their inhabitants had to grapple with broader changes in ideas about state and society while struggling to achieve and maintain meaningful self rule at the level of the polity and self respect at the level of culture innes and philip highlight new research and ideas about a region whose experiences during the age of revolutions are at best patchily known and understood as well as to expand understanding of the complex and variegated history of democracy as an idea and set of practices

from a leading political thinker this book is both an invaluable playbook for meeting our current moment and a stirring reflection on the future of democracy itself the covid 19 pandemic has demonstrated some of the strengths of our society including the rapid development of vaccines but the pandemic has also exposed its glaring weaknesses such as the failure of our government to develop and quickly implement strategies for tracing and containing outbreaks as well as widespread public distrust of government prompted by often confusing and conflicting choices to mask or not to mask even worse is that over half a million deaths and the extensive economic devastation could have been avoided if the government had been prepared to undertake comprehensive contextually sensitive policies to stop the spread of the disease in democracy in the time of coronavirus leading political thinker danielle allen untangles the us government s covid 19 victories and failures to offer a plan for creating a more resilient democratic polity one that can better respond to both the present pandemic and future crises looking to history allen also identifies the challenges faced by democracies in other times that required strong government action in an analysis spanning from ancient greece to the reconstruction amendments and the present day allen argues for the relative effectiveness of collaborative federalism over authoritarian compulsion and for the unifying power of a common cause but for democracy to endure we as participatory citizens must commit to that cause a just and equal social contract and support for good governance
