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ride the wave of the latin explosion with the much anticipated new book from the award winning author of chicana falsa how to be a chicana role model is the fiercely funny tale of a chicana writer who s trying to find a way to embrace two very different cultures without losing touch with who she is

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since decades women have been raising their voice against the injustice discrimination and exploitation against them the revolutionary thought sparked and took its actual shape when feminine rights movements accelerated at global level with a realization women do exist the mexican women were routed out in the chicano movement of the mexican americans against injustice by the dominant caucasians their civil rights right to equality and voices against discrimination were suppressed they were like left out morsels who were not counted as a part of the community and treated as lifeless showy objects good enough as decorative pieces of the house the chicana feminism is a strong uproar of aggression by the mexican american women who once upon had been the legendary emblems of their historical tribes and who in no way are lesser than man the movement accomplished equal rights for women and promoted egalitarianism the book is a compilation of the historical journey of the chicana feminism from its story of origin till the contemporary form it critically analyzes the multiple perspectives of chicana feminism and its worthwhile contribution in providing it a global space

chicana feminist thought brings together the voices of chicana poets writers and activists who reflect upon the chicana feminist movement that began in the late 1960s with energy and passion this anthology of writings documents the personal and collective political struggles of chicana feminists

the making of chicana o studies traces the philosophy and historical development of the field of chicana o studies from precursor

movements to the civil rights era to today focusing its lens on the political machinations in higher education that sought to destroy the discipline as a renowned leader activist scholar and founding member of the movement to establish this curriculum in the california state university system which serves as a model for the rest of the country rodolfo f acu [?] a has for more than forty years battled the trend in academia to deprive this group of its academic presence the book assesses the development of chicana o studies an area of studies that has even more value today than at its inception myths about its epistemological foundations have remained uncontested acu [?] a sets the record straight challenging those in the academy who would fold the discipline into latino studies shadow it under the dubious umbrella of ethnic studies or eliminate it altogether building the largest chicana o studies program in the nation was no easy feat especially in an atmosphere of academic contention in this remarkable account acu [?] a reveals how california state university northridge was instrumental in developing an area of study that offers more than 166 sections per semester taught by 26 tenured and 45 part time instructors he provides vignettes of successful programs across the country and offers contemporary educators and students a game plan the mechanics for creating a successful chicana o studies discipline and a comprehensive index of current chicana o studies programs nationwide latinas os of which mexican americans are nearly seventy percent comprise a complex sector of society projected to be just shy of thirty percent of the nation s population by 2050 the making of chicana o studies identifies what went wrong in the history of chicana o studies and offers tangible solutions for the future

since the 1960s academics have theorized that literature is on its way to becoming obsolete or at the very least has lost part of its power as an influential medium of social and cultural critique this work argues against that misconception and maintains that contemporary american literature is not only alive and well but has grown in significant ways that reflect changes in american culture during the last twenty years in addition this work argues that beginning in the 1980s a new allied generation of american writers born from the late 1950s to the early 1970s has emerged whose hybrid fiction blend distinct elements of previous american literary movements and contain divided social cultural and ethnic allegiances the author explores psychological philosophical ethnic and technological hybridity the author also argues for the importance of and need for literature in contemporary america and considers its future possibilities in the realms of the internet and hypertext david foster wallace neal stephenson douglas coupland sherman alexie william vollmann michele serros and dave eggers are among the writers whose hybrid fictions are discussed

u s latino literature is defined as latino literature within the united states that embraces the heterogeneous inter groupings of latinos for too long u s latino literature has not been thought of as an integral part of the overall shared american literary landscape but that is slowly changing this dictionary aims to rectify some of those misconceptions by proving that latinos do fundamentally express american issues concerns and perspectives with a flair in linguistic cadences familial themes distinct world views and cross cultural voices the historical dictionary of u s latino literature contains a chronology an introduction and an extensive bibliography the dictionary section has cross referenced entries on u s latino a authors and terms relevant to the nature of u s latino literature in order to illustrate and corroborate its foundational bearings within the overall american literary experience this book is an excellent access point for students researchers and anyone wanting to know more about this subject

featuring 37 essays by distinguished literary scholars a companion to the american novel provides a comprehensive single volume treatment of the development of the novel in the united states from the late 18th century to the present day represents the most comprehensive single volume introduction to this popular literary form currently available features 37 contributions from a wide range of distinguished literary scholars includes essays on topics and genres historical overviews and key individual works including the scarlet letter moby dick the great gatsby beloved and many more

chicano chicana americana is a cultural history of mexican americans in film television and theater through biographical sketches of performers such as anthony quinn katy jurado robert beltran and lupe ontiveros this work asserts mexican americans proper place in the national narratives of our collective imaginary conveying a multicentered polycultural america this book shows us intriguing performers in bit parts who steal the scene and redefine what it means to be american each biographical chapter analyzes an underappreciated actor revealing their artistic contributions to u s common culture their long shot careers tell a tale of players taking action with agency and fighting for screen time and equal opportunity despite disadvantages and differential treatment in hollywood these dynamic and complex individuals altered cinematic representations and audience expectations by surpassing stereotypes the book explores american national character by showing how ethnic mexicans attained social and cultural status through fair open competition without a radical realignment of political or economic structures their

creative achievements demanded dignity and earned respect anthony mac^[2] as argues that these performances demonstrated a pop culture pluralism that subtly changed mainstream america transforming it from the mythological past of the wild west to the speculative future of science fiction

first published in 1998 writing about chicano professionals in los angeles proves timely for many reasons anthropologists now venture into the ethnic borderlands of their own western countries rather than encroach on the flexing ethnicities of the third world as they have traditionally done the story of this ethnic elite begins in the 1960 s and 1970 s when mexican american students from blue collar backgrounds first entered california colleges and universities in significant numbers this generation of mexican american students is important however not merely for its increased numbers but rather for the culture it created the culture of chicanismo the culture of the nationalist chicano movement

the notion of citizenship is complex it can be at once an identity a set of rights privileges and responsibilities an elevated and exclusionary status a relationship between individual and state and more in recent decades citizenship has attracted interdisciplinary attention particularly with the transnational growth of western capitalism yet citizenship s relationship to gender has gone relatively unexplored despite the globally pervasive denial of citizenship to women historically and in many places ongoing today this highly interdisciplinary volume explores the political and cultural dimensions of citizenship and their relevance to women and gender containing essays by a well known group of scholars including iris marion young alison jaggar martha nussbaum and sandra bartky this book examines the conceptual issues and strategies at play in the feminist quest to give women full citizenship status the contributors take a fresh look at the issues going beyond conventional critiques and examine problems in the political and social arrangements practices and conditions that diminish women s citizenship in various parts of the world

this book examines how chicana literature in three genres memoir folklore and fiction arose at the turn of the twentieth century in the borderlands of the united states and mexico lopez examines three women writers and highlights their contributions to chicana writing in its earliest years as well as their contributions to the genres in which they wrote the women leonor villegas de magn^[2] n jovita idar and josefina niggli represent three powerful voices from which to gain a clearer understanding of women s lives and struggles during and after the mexican revolution and also offer surprising insights into women s active roles in border life and the revolution itself readers are encouraged to rethink chicana lives and expand their ideas of chicana from a subset of the chicano movement of the 1960s to a vibrant and vigorous reality stretching back into the past

this bridge we call communication anzald^[2] an approaches to theory method and praxis explores contemporary communication research studies performative writing poetry latina o studies and gender studies through the lens of gloria anzald^[2] a s theories methods and concepts utilizing different methodologies and approaches testimonio performative writing and interpretive rhetorical and critical methodologies the contributors provide original research on contexts including healing and pain woundedness identity chicana and black feminisms and experiences in academia

the essays in women s folklore women s culture focus on women performers of folklore and on women s genre of folklore long ignored women s folklore is often collaborative and frequently is enacted in the privacy of the domestic sphere this book provides insights balancing traditional folklore scholarship all of the authors also explore the relationship between male and female views and worlds the book begins with the private world of women performances within the intimacy of family and fields it then studies women s folklore in the public arena finally the book looks at the interrelationships between public and private arenas and between male and female activities by turning our attention to previously ignored women s realms these essays provide a new perspective from which to view human culture as a whole and make women s folklore women s culture a significant addition to folklore scholarship

uruguayan writer eduardo galeano has described u s and latin american culture as continually hobbled by amnesia unable or unwilling to remember the influence of mestizos and indigenous populations in mestizos come home author robert con davis undiano documents the great awakening of mexican american and latino culture since the 1960s that has challenged this omission in collective memory he maps a new awareness of the united states as intrinsically connected to the broader context of the americas at once native and new to the american southwest mexican americans have come home in a profound sense they have reasserted their right to claim that land and u s culture as their own mestizos come home explores key areas of change that mexican americans have brought to the united states these areas include the recognition of mestizo identity especially its historical development across the nineteenth and twentieth centuries the re emergence of indigenous relationships to land and the promotion of mesoamerican conceptions of the human body clarifying and bridging critical gaps in cultural history davis undiano considers important artifacts from the past and present connecting the casta caste paintings of eighteenth century mexico to modern day artists including john valadez alma l. [?] pez and luis a jim [?] nez jr he also examines such community celebrations as day of the dead cinco de mayo and lowrider car culture as examples of mestizo influence on mainstream american culture woven throughout is the search for meaning and understanding of mestizo identity a large scale landmark account of mexican american culture mestizos come home shows that mestizos are essential to u s national culture as an argument for social justice and a renewal of america s democratic ideals this book marks a historic cultural homecoming

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
