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the sixth edition of the gendered society explores current thinking about gender both inside academia and in our everyday lives michael kimmel challenges the claim that gender is limited to women s experiences his compelling and balanced study of gender includes both masculine and feminine perspectives kimmel makes three bold and persuasive statements about gender first he demonstrates that gender differences are often extremely exaggerated in fact he argues that men and women have much more in common than we think they do kimmel also challenges the pop psychologists who suggest that gender difference is the cause of inequality between the sexes instead he reveals that the reverse is true gender inequality itself is the cause of the differences between men and women finally he illustrates that gender is not merely an element of individual identity but a socially constructed institutional phenomenon

focusing on a largely unknown type of popular print culture that developed in the late 1600s the coffee house periodical helen berry here offers new evidence that the politics of gender far from being a marginal or frivolous topic was an issue of general interest and wide spread concern to the early modern reader berry s study provides the first full length analysis of john dunton s athenian mercury 1691 97 an influential specimen of the coffee house periodical genre as well as the original question and answer publication which addressed both men s and women s issues in one journal as the chapter headings in this book indicate the topics addressed in the agony column of the athenian mercury for example the body courtship and sex are of enduring interest across the centuries berry s study of this periodical provides new insights into the gendered ideas and debates that circulated among middling sorts in early modern england an historical survey of the social effects of mass communication in the early modern period this volume makes an important contribution to the ongoing study of how gendered ideas and values were communicated culturally particularly beyond the milieu of elite groups such as the nobility and gentry it argues that the mass media was from its infancy an important means of communicating powerful messages about gender norms particularly among the middling sorts the study will appeal not only to historians women and gender studies scholars and literature scholars but also to scholars of publishing history

race and gender in the classroom explores the paradoxes of education race and gender as laurie cooper stoll follows eighteen teachers carrying out their roles as educators in an era of post racial and post gendered politics because there are a number of contentious issues converging simultaneously in these teachers everyday lives this is a book comprised of several interrelated stories on the one hand this is a story about teachers who care deeply about their students but are generally oblivious to the ways in which their words and behaviors reinforce dominant narratives about race and gender constructing for their students a worldview in which race and gender do not matter despite their students lived experiences demonstrating otherwise this is a story about dedicated overworked teachers who are trying to keep their heads above water while meeting the myriad demands placed upon them in a climate of high stakes testing this is a story about the disconnect between those who mandate educational policy like superintendents and school boards and the teachers who are expected to implement those policies often with little or no input and few resources this is ultimately a story however about how the institution of education itself operates in a post racial and post gendered society

looking at the social political and legal changes in oman since 1970 this book challenges the islamic and tribal traditional cultural norms relating to marriage divorce and women's rights which guide social and legal practice in the modern omani state the book argues that despite the establishment of legal instruments guaranteeing equality for all citizens the fact that the state depends upon islamic and tribal elites for its legitimacy invalidates these guarantees in practice two particular features of the legal and cultural regulation of marriage and marital rights are focused on the perceived requirement for kafa aor equality in marriage between so called high and low socio economic status peoples is examined and the institution of talaq which grants greater rights to men than to women in appeals for divorce this book addresses highly complex subjects with great rigor in terms of empirical research and engagement with theory sociological and political as well as theological and legal it is an interesting investigation of the divisions of authority between the state islam and tribal norms highlighting barriers to reform in both oman and wider islamic society and advocating the removal of such obstacles
