poverty is a pressing and persistent problem while its extent varies across countries its presence always represents the diminution of human capacity therefore it seems natural to want to do something about it have countries made progress in mitigating poverty how do we determine who is poor and who is not poor what intuitions or theories guide the design of anti poverty policy is overall labor market performance the key to keeping the poverty rate low or does it matter how well connected an individual is to those who know about the availability of jobs does being an immigrant increase the odds of being poor are there anti poverty policies that work for whom do they work if i m poor will i have access to health care and housing am i more likely to be obese polluted upon incarcerated un banked and without assets if i m poor is poverty too hard a problem for economic analysis these are some of the questions that a distinguished group of scholars have come together to confront in this handbook the handbook is written in a highly accessible style that encourages the reader to think

critically about poverty theories are presented in a rigorous but not overly technical way concise and straightforward empirical analyses enlighten key policy issues the volume has six parts poverty in the 21st century labor market factors poverty policy poverty dynamics dimensions of poverty and trends and issues in anti poverty policy a goal of the handbook is to stimulate further research on poverty to that end several chapters challenge conventional thinking about poverty and in some cases present specific proposals for the reform of economic and social policy

the historic rise in international migration over the past thirty years has brought a tide of new immigrants to the united states from asia south america and other parts of the globe their arrival has reverberated throughout american society prompting an outpouring of scholarship on the causes and consequences of the new migrations the handbook of international migration gathers the best of this scholarship in one volume to present a comprehensive overview of the state of immigration research in this country bringing coherence and fresh insight to this fast growing field the contributors to the handbook of international migration a virtual who's who of immigration scholars draw upon the best social science theory and demographic research to examine the effects and implications of immigration in the united states the dramatic shift in the national background of today's immigrants away from primarily european roots has led many researchers to rethink traditional theories of assimilation and has called into question the usefulness of making historical comparisons between today's immigrants and those of previous generations part i of the handbook examines current theories of international migration including the forces that motivate people to migrate often at great financial and personal cost part ii focuses on how immigrants are changed after their arrival addressing such issues as adaptation assimilation pluralism and socioeconomic mobility finally part iii looks at the social economic and political effects of the surge of new immigrants on american society here the handbook explores how the complex politics of immigration

have become intertwined with economic perceptions and realities racial and ethnic divisions and international relations a landmark compendium of richly nuanced investigations the handbook of international migration will be the major reference work on recent immigration to this country and will enhance the development of a truly interdisciplinary field of international migration studies

the author puts the arguments in favour of free mobility across national borders and counters those against his conclusions are clear and profound free international migration can lessen the huge material inequalities and human injustices

immigration is the primary cause of population change in developed countries and a major component of population change in many developing countries this clear and perceptive text discusses how immigration impacts population size composition and distribution the authors address major socio political issues of immigration through the lens of demography bringing demographic insights to bear on a number of pressing questions currently discussed in the media such as does immigration stimulate the economy do immigrants put an excessive strain on health care systems how does the racial and ethnic composition of immigrants challenge what it means to be american or french or german by systematically exploring demographic topics such as fertility health education and age and sex structures the book provides students of immigration with a broader understanding of the impact of immigration on populations and offers new ways to think about immigration and society

model of labor demand and supply used until the 1990s beginning with a simple model that recognizes the differences between immigrants and natives as workers the articles develop the analysis of complementarity specialization and productivity effect of immigrants in developed economies the book then presents a series of papers analyzing and testing the economic motivation for international migration finally the focus is shifted to the effect of immigration policies and their consequences on immigration and the economy

the positive social benefits of low unemployment are many it helps to reduce poverty and crime and fosters more stable families and communities yet conventional wisdom born of the stagflation of the 1970s holds that sustained low unemployment rates run the risk of triggering inflation the last five years of the 1990s in which unemployment plummeted and inflation remained low called this conventional wisdom into question the roaring nineties provides a thorough review of the exceptional economic performance of the late 1990s and asks whether it was due to a lucky combination of economic circumstances or whether the new economy has somehow wrought a lasting change in the inflation safe rate of unemployment led by distinguished economists alan krueger and robert solow a roster of twenty six respected economic experts analyzes the micro and macroeconomic factors that led to the unexpected coupling of low unemployment and low inflation the more macroeconomically oriented chapters clearly point to a reduction in the inflation safe rate of unemployment laurence ball and robert moffitt see the slow adjustment of workers wage aspirations in the wake of rising productivity as a key factor in keeping inflation at bay and alan blinder and janet yellen credit sound monetary policy by the federal reserve board with making the best of fortunate circumstances such as lower energy costs a strong dollar and a booming stock market other chapters in the roaring nineties examine how the interaction between macroeconomic and labor market conditions helped sustain high employment growth and low inflation giuseppe bertola francine blau and lawrence m kahn demonstrate how greater flexibility in the u s labor market generated more jobs in this

country than in europe but at the expense of greater earnings inequality david ellwood examines the burgeoning shortage of skilled workers and suggests policies such as tax credits for businesses that provide on the job training to address the problem and james hines hilary hoynes and alan krueger elaborate the benefits of sustained low unemployment including budget surpluses that can finance public infrastructure and social welfare benefits a perspective often lost in the concern over higher inflation rates while none of these analyses promise that the good times of the 1990s will last forever the roaring nineties provides a unique analysis of recent economic history demonstrating how the nation capitalized on a lucky confluence of economic factors helping to create the longest peacetime boom in american history copublished with the century foundation

according to the october 2016 world economic outlook global growth is projected to slow to 3.1 percent in 2016 before recovering to 3.4 percent in 2017 the forecast revised down by 0.1 percentage point for 2016 and 2017 relative to april's report reflects a more subdued outlook for advanced economies following the june u.k. vote in favor of leaving the european union brexit and weaker than expected growth in the united states these developments have put further downward pressure on global interest rates as monetary policy is now expected to remain accommodative for longer although the market reaction to the brexit shock was reassuringly orderly the ultimate impact remains very unclear as the fate of institutional and trade arrangements between the united kingdom and the european union is uncertain financial market sentiment toward emerging market economies has improved with expectations of lower interest rates in advanced economies reduced concern about china's near term prospects following policy support to growth and some firming of commodity prices but prospects differ sharply across countries and regions with emerging asia in general and india in particular showing robust growth and sub saharan africa experiencing a sharp slowdown in advanced economies a subdued outlook subject to sizable uncertainty and downside risks may fuel further political discontent with anti integration policy platforms gaining more traction several emerging market and developing economies still face daunting policy challenges in adjusting to weaker commodity prices these worrisome prospects make the need for a broad based policy response to raise growth and manage vulnerabilities more urgent than ever
