the simultaneously tautological and oxymoronic nature of word image relations has become a subject of massive debate in the post modern period this is not only because of the increasing predominance of word image messages within our modern media saturated culture but also because intellectual disciplines are becoming increasingly sensitized to the essentially hybrid nature of the way we construct meaning in the world the essays in this volume offer an exemplary insight into both aspects of this phenomenon focussing on both traditional and modern media theatre fiction poetry graphic art cinema the essays of reading images and seeing words are deeply concerned to show how it is according to signifying codes rhetoric poetics metaphor that meaning and knowledge are produced not the least value of this collection is the insight it gives into the multiple models of word image interaction and the rich ambiguity of the tautological and oxymoronic relations they embody

while baudelaire s le peintre de la vie moderne is often cited as the first expression of our theory of modernism his choice of constantin guys as that painter has caused consternation from the moment of the essay s publication in 1863 worse still in his salon de 1859 baudelaire had also chosen to condemn photography in terms that echo to this day why did the excellent critic choose a mere reporter and illustrator as the painter of modern life how could he have overlooked photography as the painting of modern life in this study of modernity and photography in baudelaire s writing timothy raser who has written on the art criticism of baudelaire proust claudel and sartre shows how these two aberrations of critical judgment are related and how they underlie current discussions of both photography and modernism timothy raser is professor of french at the university of georgia usa

the importance of vision and visual arts such as painting theatre and sculpture in marcel proust s a la recherche du temps perdu has long been affirmed another significant system of visual representation in the novel is photography proust appropriated photography as a practice with its own distinctive characteristics which could inform his writing about the processes of perception and memory through close textual analysis of scenes where photography is experienced or observed as a practice and scenes where photography is written into the body of the text aine larkin offers an invigorating new study that sheds genuinely new light on the presence of photographic motifs in proust s novel and the subtlety of proust s engagement with this modern imaging system in his work

a deep dive into the pioneering collection of nineteenth century french photographs equipment and ephemera which is a cornerstone of the george eastman museum in the early twentieth century parisian photographer amateur historian and collector gabriel cromer 1873 1934 amassed a collection that traced photography s prehistory invention and development to about 1890 his dream was to found a national museum of the photographic arts in france although cromer s ambition was never realized his collection was central to establishing the world s first museum dedicated to photography the george eastman museum the cromer collection of nineteenth century french photography considers the origin and circulation of the collection as well as the influence it has had on photography as a field of study the book s six essays written by french and american scholars explore the cromer collection s complex passage across markets borders and functions for more than half a century curators and scholars worldwide have drawn extensively on the gabriel cromer collection for exhibitions and publications this book provides the first focused scholarly study of the foundational resource

what do photographs want do they need any accompaniment in today s image saturated society can writing inflect photography or vice versa in such a way that neither medium takes precedence or are they in constant inexorable battle with each other taking nine case studies from the 1990s french speaking world from france north africa and the caribbean this book attempts to define the interaction between non fictional written text caption essay fragment poem and photographic image having considered three categories of intermediality between text and photography the collaborative the self collaborative and the retrospective the book concludes that the dimensions of their interaction are not simple and two fold visuality versus alongside textuality but threefold and therefore complex thus the photo text as defined here is concerned as much with orality the demotic the popular the vernacular as it is with visual and written culture that text image collaborations give space to the spoken spectral traces of human discourse suggests that the key element of the photo text is its radical provisionality

through an engagement with the philosophies of proust s contemporaries f? lix ravaisson henri bergson and georg simmel suzanne guerlac presents an original reading of remembrance of things past a la recherche du temps perdu challenging traditional interpretations she argues that proust s magnum opus is not a melancholic text but one that records the dynamic time of change and the complex vitality of the real situating proust s novel within a modernism of money and broadening the exploration through references to cultural events and visual technologies commercial photography photojournalism pornography the regulation of prostitution the panama scandal and the dreyfus affair this study reveals that proust s subject is not the esthetic recuperation of loss but rather the adventure of living in time on both the individual and the social level at a concrete historical moment

an exact date for the invention of photography is evasive scientists and amateurs alike were working on a variety of photographic processes for much of the early nineteenth century thus most historians refer to the year 1839 as the first year of photography not because the sensational new medium was invented then but because that is the year it was introduced to the world after more than 175 years and for the first time in english first exposures writings from the beginning of photography brings together more than 130 primary sources from that very year 1839 subdivided into ten chapters and accompanied by fifty three images of significant visual and historical importance this is an astonishing work of discovery selection and thanks to steffen siegel s introductory texts notes and afterword elucidation the range of material is impressive not only all the chemical and technological details of the various processes but also contracts speeches correspondence of every kind arguments parodies satires eulogies denunciations journals and even some poems revealing through firsthand accounts the competition the rivalries and the parallels among the various practitioners and theorists this book provides an unprecedented way to understand how the early discourse around photographic techniques and processes transcended national boundaries and interconnected across europe and the united states

the encyclopedia of twentieth century photography explores the vast international scope of twentieth century photography and explains that history with a wide ranging interdisciplinary manner this unique approach covers the aesthetic history of photography as an evolving art and documentary form while also recognizing it as a developing technology and cultural force this encyclopedia presents the important developments movements photographers photographic institutions and theoretical aspects of the field along with information about equipment techniques and practical applications of photography to bring this history alive for the reader the set is illustrated in black and white throughout and each volume contains a color plate section a useful glossary of terms is also included

physicist gabriel lippmann s 1845 1921 photographic process is one of the oldest methods for producing colour photographs so why do the achievements of this 1908 nobel laureate remain mostly unknown outside niche circles using the centenary of lippmann s death as an opportunity to reflect upon his scientific photographic and cultural legacy this book is the first to explore his interferential colour photography initially disclosed in 1891 the emergence of this medium is considered here through three shaping forces science media and museums a group of international scholars reassess lippmann s reception in the history of science where he is most recognised by going well beyond his endeavours in france and delving into the complexity of his colour photography as a challenge to various historiographies moreover they analyse colour photographs as optical media thus pluralising lippmann photography s ties to art cultural and imperial history as well as media archaeology the contributors also focus on the interferential plate as a material object in need of both preservation and exhibition one that continues to fascinate contemporary analogue photographers this volume allows readers to get to know lippmann grasp the interdisciplinary complexity of his colourful work and ultimately expand his place in the history of photography

a rigorous new thinking of the photograph in its relation to science philosophy and art so as to discover an essence of photography that precedes its historical technological and aesthetic conditions if philosophy has always understood its relation to the world according to the model of the instantaneous flash of a photographic shot how can there be a philosophy of photography that is not viciously self reflexive challenging the assumptions made by any theory of photography that leaves its own onto photo logical conditions uninterrogated laruelle thinks the photograph non philosophically so as to discover an essence of photography that precedes its historical technological and aesthetic conditions the concept of non photography develops a rigorous new thinking of the photograph in its relation to science philosophy and art and introduces the reader to all of the key concepts of laruelle s non philosophy

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
