did martin luther wield his hammer on the wittenberg church door on october 31 1517 did he even post the ninety five theses at all this collection of documents sheds light on the debate surrounding luther s actions and the timing of his writing and his request for a disputation on the indulgence issue the primary documents in this book include the theses their companion sermon a sermon on indulgence and grace 1518 a chronological arrangement of letters pertinent to the theses and selections from luther s table talk that address the ninety five theses a final section contains luther s recollections which offer today s reader the reformer s own views of the reformation and the ninety five theses

ask any christian and he or she will agree that luther s 95 theses lit the match that became a worldwide fire yet almost none have actually read the theses this short book gives all 95 theses in list form a chapter on what each thesis said with a critical analysis

plus an after word about their impact on the world if you think luther condemned indulgences read this book if you think he condemned the popes think again if you think he pinned his theses to the church door as an act of defiance or as a rebel this book will dissuade you in short at the time he wrote the theses he merely wanted fellow academics to join a discussion he had no intention of lighting a fire that rocked the medieval world see for yourself what the 95 theses really were you might be very surprised the author has reduced the number of theses to about 15 whereas the original german version reduced them to 20 you will see why

martin luther the leader of the protestant reformation was born at eisleben prussian saxony november 10 1483 he studied jurisprudence at the university of erfurt where he later lectured on physics and ethics in 1505 he entered the augustinian monastery at erfurt two years later was ordained priest and in 1508 became professor of philosophy at the university of wittenberg the starting point of luther s career as a reformer was his posting on the church door of wittenberg the ninety five theses on october 31 1517 these formed a passionate statement of the true nature of penitence and a protest against the sale of indulgences in issuing the theses luther expected the support of his ecclesiastical superiors and it was only after three years of controversy during which he refused a summons to rome that he proceeded to publish those works that brought about his expulsion from the church

the ninety five theses were written by martin luther in 1517 and are widely regarded as the initial catalyst for the protestant reformation the disputation protests against clerical abuses especially the sale of indulgences the background to luther s ninety five theses centers on practices within the catholic church regarding baptism and absolution significantly the theses reject the validity of indulgences remissions of temporal punishment due for sins which have already been forgiven they also view with great cynicism the practice of indulgences being sold and thus the penance for sin representing a financial transaction rather than genuine contrition luther argues that the sale of indulgences was a gross violation of the original intention of confession and penance and that christians were being falsely told that they could find absolution through the purchase of indulgences luther objected to a saying attributed to johann tetzel that as soon as the

coin in the coffer rings the soul from purgatory springs he insisted that since forgiveness was god's alone to grant those who claimed that indulgences absolved buyers from all punishments and granted them salvation were in error christians he said must not slacken in following christ on account of such false assurances

of knowledge study or even love thus in responding to hamacher s theses the authors approach language that because it can never be an object of any kind awakens an unfamiliar desire taken together these essays problematize philological ontology in a movement toward radical reconceptualizations of labor action and historical time

just as in the days of luther we are living in a world undergoing enormous changes in the social political economic religious cultural and technological arenas as in the times of the monk from wittenberg these changes also challenge and force the church to rethink and transform itself for this reason the association for hispanic theological education aeth for its name in spanish considers the publication of this book very relevant because it is about commemorating what happened five centuries ago as much as about reliving it in light of our realities in a very particular way this book is an invitation to the church in general and to the hispanic church in particular not to forget thesis 55 raised by the authors we are not helpless victims but god s people called to be instrument of his grace justice and reconciliation

the sixteenth century document that changed the course of christianity monk and theology professor martin luther found himself in disagreement with the roman catholic church on the subject of indulgences certificates sold by the church that promised to spare their owners from punishment for their sins with his 95 theses luther proposed a debate on the subject but ultimately he was excommunicated and the protestant reformation began this is both a religious document and a historical one a turning point that marked a challenge to papal authority set off political conflicts and bloody war in europe and led to the remarkable variety of christian denominations and sects that exist in the world today

rejecting the antiquated and stultifying models in textbooks on method in courses on methodology championed by the self appointed gatekeepers of a narrow and parochial political science norton opens the gates to more new practices new principles new questions more methods and more demanding ethical and scientific criteria

indulgences led christians to avoid true repentance and sorrow for sin believing that they could forgo it by purchasing an indulgence indulgences also according to luther discouraged christians from giving to the poor and performing other acts of mercy believing that indulgence certificates were more spiritually valuable though luther claimed that his positions on indulgences accorded with those of the pope the theses challenge a 14th century papal bull stating that the pope could use the treasury of merit and the good deeds of past saints to forgive temporal punishment for sins

did martin luther really post his 95 theses to the wittenberg castle church door in october 1517 probably not says reformation historian peter marshall but though the event might be mythic it became one of the great defining episodes in western history a symbol of religious freedom of conscience which still shapes our world 500 years later
