moss is oceanic his poems rise crest crash and rise again like waves his voice echoes
the boom of the old testament the fluty trill of greek mythology and the gongs of chinese
rituals as he writes about love nature war oppression and the miracle of language he
addresses the god of the jews of the christians and of the muslims with awe and
familiarity and chants to lesser gods of his own invention in every surprising poem every
song to life beautiful life moss by turns giddy and sorrowful expresses a sacred
sensuality and an earthy holiness or putting it another way here is a mind operating in
open air unimpeded by fashion or forced thematic focus profoundly catholic in

perspective at once accessible and erudite inevitably compelling all of which is to recommend moss's ability to participate in and control thoroughly these poems while resisting the impulse to center himself in them this differentiates his beautiful work from much contemporary breast beating moss is an artist who embraces the possibilities of exultation appreciation reconciliation of extreme tenderness as such he lays down a commitment to a common worldly morality toward which all beings gravitate
