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this is a study of higher education in the world's four largest developing economies brazil russia india and china already important players globally by mid century they are likely to be economic powerhouses but whether they reach that level of development will depend in part on how successfully they create quality higher education that puts their labor forces at the cutting edge of the information society using an empirical comparative approach this book develops a broad picture of the higher education system in each country in the context of both global and local forces the authors offer insights into how differing socioeconomic and historic patterns of change and political contexts influence developments in higher education in asking why each state takes the approach that it does this work situates a discussion of university expansion and quality in the context of governments educational policies and reflects on the larger struggles over social goals and the distribution of national resources

integrating topics in urban development real estate higher education administration urban design and campus landscape architecture this is the first book to explore the role of the university as developer accessible and clearly written and including contributions from authorities in a wide range of related areas it offers a rich array of case studies and analyses that clarify the important roles that universities play in the growth and development of cities the cases describe a host of university practices community responses and policy initiatives surrounding university real estate development through a careful blending of academic analysis and practical hands on administrative and political information the book charts new ground in the study of the university and the city

today a substantial portion of higher education is provided outside of the traditional universities in non university institutions with a multitude of varied characteristics in recent decades higher education systems have been subjected to many changes and reforms throughout the world one of the most important was undoubtedly the expansion of higher education in the second half of the last century from an elite system to one for the masses while institutions of higher learning have been in existence for approximately 1 000 years this exponential growth has been much more recent this movement toward mass higher education has created substantial national impacts on the development of the systems of higher education while common denominators of change and adaptation can be identified globally there remain important differences from country to country there are many factors challenging higher education today and in the foreseeable future in one form or another these issues and trends can be seen in

higher education systems throughout the world they include chronic underfunding marketisation and competition alternative providers massification internationalisation governance leadership strategic management accountability accreditation and social relevance another key factor for many countries especially in europe and the focus of this book is the current and future status of the higher education systems that differentiate the university and non university sectors

this is the final volume in a four part series covering the development of the university in europe east and west from its origins to the present day focusing on a number of major themes viewed from a european perspective the originality of the series lies in its comparative interdisciplinary collaborative and transnational nature it deals also with the content of what was taught at the universities but its main purpose is an appreciation of the role and structures of the universities as seen against a backdrop of changing conditions ideas and values this volume deals with the reconstruction and epoch making expansion of higher education after 1945 which led to the triumph of modern science it traces the development of the relationship between universities and national states teachers and students their ambitions and political activities special attention is paid to fundamental changes in the content of teaching at the universities

this is the fourth volume of a history of the university of cambridge and explores the extraordinary growth in size and academic stature of the university between 1870 and 1990 though the university has made great advances since the 1870s when it was viewed as a provincial seminary it is also the home of tradition a federation of colleges one over 700 years old one of the 1970s this book seeks to penetrate the nature of the colleges and of the federation and to show the way in which university faculties and departments have come to vie with the colleges for this predominant role it attempts to unravel a fascinating institutional story of the society of the university and its place in the world it explores in depth the themes of religion and learning and of the entry of women into a once male environment there are portraits of seminal and characteristic figures of the cambridge scene and there is a sketch inevitably selective but wide ranging of many disciplines an extensive study in intellectual and academic history

originally published in 1984 the crisis of the university looks at the way in which changes to intellectual life relate to the development of the different institutions that make up higher education it examines the evolution of the liberal university that flourished in the 19th and early 20th centuries into the modern university that has grown up since 1945 it also looks at the more detailed experience of british higher education with separate chapters on what the robbins expansion meant for the universities and why it was thought necessary to construct an alternative in the shape of the polytechnics looking to the future the book argues first that the present structure of british higher education needs reform and speculates on the future intellectual and social demands that may be made of higher education

since 1980 higher education access and endorsement have grown more dramatically in asia than in any other area of the world both developed and developing nations are witnessing rapid expansion in the higher education sector nor is this progress entirely quantitative a number of asian universities are on a par with the finest institutions of higher education in the u s and europe until now however there has been little historical analysis and virtually no comparative analysis of asian higher education this volume offers a detailed comparative study of the emergence of the modern university in asia linking the historical development of universities in the region with contemporary realities and future challenges the contributors describe higher education systems in eleven countries korea china vietnam cambodia malaysia phillippines singapore indonesia thailand india and japan and explore similarities and differences through two comparative essays each case study includes a discussion of the nature and influence of both indigenous and european educational traditions a detailed analysis of development patterns and a close examination of such contemporary issues as population growth and access cost the role of private higher education the research system autonomy and accountability

this book examines some consequences and implications of both change and stability in british secondary education drawing on a unique series of national surveys of school leavers in scotland the authors provide an empirical and theoretical account of central problems of contemporary schooling their analysis covers certification curriculum and selection the effects of educational expansion trends in educational inequality the impact of comprehensive reorganisation truancy and alienation from schooling the explanation of differences in performance between schools and the implications for the public accountability of schools

in the face of increasing social demand and cutbacks in state budgetary support universities in african countries are now turning towards a multicampus system strategy as african governments have adopted neoliberal education policies that place premium on entrepreneurialism profit making privatization and markets as drivers of university development a reshaping of the academic work and organizational framework have taken place however little is known about the impact of this paradigm shift on access quality and governance in higher education this book fills the void in research and academic knowledge about the impact of the emerging university configurations in africa it analyzes the paradox surrounding the performance of multicampus university systems as avenues of broadening university access but whose structural success may be qualitatively contested this book offers a refreshing examination of the african multicampus university system from both an african and global perspective it makes use of empirical data from kenya collected during extensive fieldwork along with substantive library and documentary resources on the rest of the continents to fortify arguments and demonstrate important conclusions this allows for a comparative analysis of policies and strategies used in the establishment of campuses both within and beyond national boundaries in the continent and will be a welcome contribution to the existing repertoire on african universities

this volume is a bold attempt to address a comprehensive range of themes and issues relating to contemporary kenya it covers independent kenya s history society culture economics politics and environment with great breadth and depth comprising thirty four chapters divided into three parts part i focuses on independence and the political economy of development followed by part ii on environment globalization gender and society part iii examines the external context s impact and implications for kenya and the role of kenya in the global political economy

in facing the question who runs the universities the authors have carried out over a period of years an extensive programme of interviews both formal and informal as well as a detailed study of documents their findings are written up in the language of politics in terms of power authority influence regulation and decision making the result is thus of value both to those with a practical interest in universities and to those with a more theoretical interest in politics or organisational behaviour

this book examines some of the major higher education reforms and policy shifts globally particularly in the light of recent shifts in quality and standards driven education and policy research it critiques the neo liberal ideological imperatives of current higher education and policy reforms and illustrates the way that changes in the relationship between the state and higher education policy affect current trends in higher education reforms using diverse comparative education paradigms from critical theory to historical comparative research the chapters focus on globalisation ideology and higher education reforms and examine both the reasons and outcomes of higher education reforms and policy change the book analyses and evaluates the policy shifts in methodological approaches to globalisation and higher education reforms and their impact on education policy and pedagogy the book contributes in a very scholarly way to a more holistic understanding of the nexus between globalisation comparative education research and higher education reforms

with the competitiveness of firms in an open and integrated world environment increasingly reliant on technological capability universities are being asked to take on a growing role in stimulating economic growth beyond imparting education they are now viewed as sources of industrially valuable technical skills innovations and entrepreneurship developed and developing countries alike have made it a priority to realize this potential of universities to spur growth a strategy that calls for coordinated policy actions
