there is a longstanding scholarly debate on the nature of prophecy in ancient israel until now no study has based itself on the semantics of the hebrew lexeme nābî@ prophet this investigation by william l kelly discusses the nature and function of prophecy in the corpus of the hebrew book of jeremiah it analyses all occurrences of nābî? in jeremiah and performs a close reading of three primary texts jeremiah 1 4 19 23 9 40 and 27 1 28 17 the result is a detailed explanation of how prophecy works and what it meant to call someone a nābîl in ancient israel combining the results of the semantic analysis and close readings the study reaches conclusions for six main areas of study 1 the function and nature of prophecy 2 dreams and visions 3 being sent 4 prophets priests and cult 5 salvation and doom and 6 legitimacy and authority these conclusions explain the conceptual categories related to nābîll in the corpus i then situate these findings in two current debates one on the definition of nābî and one on cultic prophecy this study contributes to critical scholarship on prophecy in the ancient world on the book of jeremiah and on prophets in ancient israel it is the first major study to analyse nābî@ based on its semantic associations it adds to a growing consensus which understands prophecy as a form of divination contrary to some trends in jeremiah scholarship this work demonstrates the importance of a close reading of the masoretic hebrew text this study uses a method of a general nature which can be applied to other texts thus there are significant implications for further research on prophecy and prophetic literature

prophecy was a wide spread phenomenon in the ancient world not only in ancient israel but in the whole eastern mediterranean cultural sphere this is demonstrated by documents from the ancient near east that have been the object of martti nissinen s research for more than twenty years nissinen s studies have had a formative influence on the study of the prophetic phenomenon the present volume presents a selection of thirty one essays bringing together essential aspects of prophetic divination in the ancient near east the first section of the volume discusses prophecy from theoretical perspectives the second sections contains studies on prophecy in texts from mari and assyria and other cuneiform sources the third section discusses biblical prophecy in its ancient near eastern context while the fourth section focuses on
