this collection of eleven original essays interrogates the concept of freedom and recenters our understanding of the process of emancipation who defined freedom and what did freedom mean to nineteenth century african americans both during and after slavery did freedom just mean the absence of constraint and a widening of personal choice or did it extend to the ballot box to education to equality of opportunity in examining such questions rather than defining every aspect of postemancipation life as a new form of freedom these essays develop the work of scholars who are looking at how belonging to an empowered government or community defines the outcome of emancipation some essays in this collection disrupt
