some of the greatest works of literature have wrestled with the task of illuminating the human experience of death this new title discusses the role of death and dying in works such as *beloved* *a farewell to arms* *lord of the flies* *paradise lost* and many others featuring approximately 20 essays death and dying provides valuable insights on this recurring theme in literature

film adaptations of shakespeare s plays are increasingly popular and now figure prominently in the study of his work and its reception this lively companion is a collection of critical and historical essays on the films adapted from and inspired by shakespeare s plays an international team of leading scholars discuss shakespearean films from a variety of perspectives as works of art in their own right as products of the international movie industry in terms of cinematic and theatrical genres and as the work of particular directors from *laurence olivier* and *orson welles* to *franco zeffirelli* and *kenneth branagh* they also consider specific issues such as the portrayal of shakespeare s women and the supernatural the emphasis is on feature films for cinema rather than television with strong coverage of *hamlet* *richard iii* *macbeth* *king lear* and *romeo and juliet* a guide to further reading and a useful filmography are also provided

a new york times book review editors choice the third volume of simon callow s acclaimed orson welles biography covering the period of his exile from america 1947 1964 when he produced some of his greatest works including touch of evil in one man band the third volume in his epic and all inclusive four volume survey of orson welles s life and work the celebrated british actor simon callow again probes in comprehensive and penetrating detail into one of the most complex contradictory artists of the twentieth century whose glorious triumphs and occasional spectacular failures in film radio theater and television introduced a radical and original approach that opened up new directions in the arts this volume begins with welles s self exile from america and his realization that he could function only to his own satisfaction as an independent film maker a one man band in fact which committed him to a perpetual cycle of money raising by 1964 he had filmed othello which took three years to complete mr arkadin the most puzzling film in his output and a masterpiece in another genre touch of evil which marked his one return to hollywood and like all too many of his films was wrested from his grasp and reedited along the way he made inroads into the fledgling medium of television and a number of stage plays of which his 1955 london moby dick is considered by theater historians to be one of the seminal productions of the century his private life was as spectacularly complex and dramatic as his professional life the book reveals what it was like to be around welles and with an intricacy and precision rarely attempted before what it was like to be him answering the riddle that has long fascinated film scholars and lovers alike whatever happened to orson welles

this book demonstrates how a group of tragedies by shakespeare and his contemporaries stage the fear and exhilaration generated by encounters with the unknown and the extraordinary arguing that the maritime art of fathoming that is dropping a lead and line into water to measure its depth operates as a master image for these plays it illustrates how they create sublime horror through intuitions of mysterious more than human

agencies and of worlds beyond the visible though tightly focused on a specific body of imagery the book strikes up dialogue with a number of critical fields including theories and histories of tragedy ecocriticism and the environmental humanities oceanic studies and work on early modern ideas about the body madness and language countering a tendency within tragic theory to value the textual over the dramatic it also demonstrates how the tragic effects to which it points are created through specific theatrical strategies including the use of offstage space intertheatricality and the violation of dramatic conventions situating its arguments within recent criticism on these plays and on tragedy more generally and pushing back against scholarship that regards the genre in shakespeare s time as concerned more with pity than with fear the book offers fresh and detailed readings of some of the most frequently studied plays in the english canon including hamlet king lear macbeth the duchess of malfi and the changeling

shakespeare survey is a yearbook of shakespeare studies and production each volume is devoted to a theme or play or group of plays each also contains a section of reviews of criticism and performance for the first time numbers 1 50 are being reissued in paperback

in the process she contributed some of the best work on shakespeare that was then extant as this collection demonstrates searching for a principle of organization professor snyder decided that it would be best to arrange the essays in chronological order the result was a kind of intellectual autobiography as she calls it in her preface and the title she chose was shakespeare a wayward journey since it reflects her travels over the various avenues of shakespearean criticism book jacket

theatre in dublin 1745 1820 a calendar of performances is the first comprehensive daily compendium of more than 18 000 performances that took place in dublin s many professional theatres music halls pleasure gardens and circus amphitheatres between thomas sheridan s becoming the manager at smock alley theatre in 1745 and the dissolution of the crow street theatre in 1820 the daily performance calendar for each of the seventy five seasons recorded here records and organizes all surviving documentary evidence pertinent to each evening s entertainments derived from all known sources but especially from playbills and newspaper advertisements each theatre s daily entry includes all preludes mainpieces interludes and afterpieces with casts and assigned roles followed by singing and singers dancing and dancers and specialty entertainments financial data

program changes rehearsal notices authorship and premiere information are included in each component's entry as is the text of contemporary correspondence and editorial contextualization and commentary followed by other additional commentary such as the many hundreds of printed puffs notices and performance reviews in the cases of the programs of music halls pleasure gardens and circuses the playbills have generally been transcribed verbatim the calendar for each season is preceded by an analytical headnote that presents several categories of information including among other things an alphabetical listing of all members of each company whether actors musicians specialty artists or house servants who are known to have been employed at each venue limited biographical commentary is included particularly about performers of Irish origin who had significant stage careers but who did not perform in London each headnote presents the season's offerings of entertainments of each theatrical type prelude mainpiece interlude afterpiece analyzed according to genre including a list of the number of plays in each genre and according to period in which they were first performed the headnote also notes the number of different plays by Shakespeare staged during each season and gives particular attention to entertainments of special Irish interest the various kinds of benefit performance and command performances are also noted finally this calendar of performances contains an appendix that furnishes a season by season listing of the plays that were new to the London patent theatres and later of the important minors this information is provided in order for us to understand the interrelatedness of the London and Dublin repertoires

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
