a comprehensive overview of important contemporary issues in the field of reading research from the mid 1980s to mid 1990s this well received volume offers readers an examination of literacy through a variety of lenses some permitting microscopic views and others panoramic views a veritable who s who of specialists in the field chapter authors cover current methodology as well as cumulative research based knowledge because it deals with society and literacy the first section provides the broadest possible view of literacy the second section defines the range of activities culturally determined to be a part of the enterprise known as literacy the third focuses on the processes that individuals engage in when they perform the act of reading the fourth section visits the environment in which the knowledge that comprises literacy is passed on from one generation to the next the last section an epilogue to the whole enterprise of reading research provides apt philosophical reflection

write to be read is meant to inspire educators to be designers of engaging curriculum specifically targeting ways to improve the teaching of writing in schools today students tend to write in response to literature whereas the focus of this resource is to help students write material fiction and non fiction that they want to read students often engage in writing that is more about pleasing the teacher or ticking a homework or assignment box this book challenges many assumptions with reference to traditional models for teaching writing a rich assortment of engaging examples are

presented in this book to prompt educators to adapt and construct their own meaningful writing units of study

academic writing often requires students to incorporate material from outside sources like statistics ideas quotations paraphrases into their own written texts a particular obstacle for students who lack strong reading skills in connecting reading and writing in second language instruction alan hirvela contends that second language writing students should be considered as readers first and advocates the integration of reading and writing instruction with a survey of theory research and pedagogy in the subject area although the integrated reading writing model has gained popularity in recent years many teachers have little more than an intuitive sense of the connections between these skills as part of the popular michigan series on teaching multilingual writers connecting reading and writing in second language instruction will provide invaluable background knowledge on this issue to esl teachers in training as well as teachers who are already practicing
