this is volume iii of seventeen of a series on the philosophy of mind and psychology originally published in 1912 this study looks at the history of psychology and specifically the developments during the ancient and patristic period

in the present book pauline phemister argues against traditional anglo american interpretations of leibniz as an idealist who conceives ultimate reality as a plurality of mind like immaterial beings and for whom physical bodies are ultimately unreal and our perceptions of them illusory re reading the texts without the prior assumption of idealism allows the more material aspects of leibniz s metaphysics to emerge leibniz is found to advance a synthesis of idealism and materialism his ontology posits indivisible living animal like corporeal substances as the real metaphysical constituents of the universe his epistemology combines sense experience and reason and his ethics fuses confused perceptions and insensible appetites with distinct perceptions and rational choice in the light of his sustained commitment to the reality of bodies phemister re examines his dynamics the doctrine of pre established harmony and his views on freedom the image of leibniz as a rationalist philosopher who values activity and reason over passivity and sense experience is replaced by the one of a philosopher who recognises that in the created world there can only be activity if there is also passivity minds souls and forms if there is also matter good if there is evil perfection if there is imperfection

rethinking catholic theology from the mystery of existence to the new creation provides readers with an intelligent informed critical grasp of at least the central truths of the catholic christian tradition it aims to help readers to rethink more deeply these essential truths and moreover in what specific ways the understanding of the catholic faith has changed and or remained the same since vatican ii the first part centers on jesus messiah and the mystery of existence it delineates how his life death resurrection as transformed physicality and ascension usher in the kingdom of god and best answer the questions who am i who are we where did we come from and where are we ultimately headed what is the meaning of it all the second part focuses on how pentecost the trinity the church the scriptures the sacraments christian life itself mariology the communion of saints and christian mysticism shed light on the mystery of existence it demonstrates how the church flows intrinsically and naturally from the person of jesus christ and how the scriptures and the sacraments likewise arise intrinsically and naturally from the church part three stresses considers various views of afterlife mainly from the judeo christian tradition it raises difficult after death questions such as individual and general judgment the intermediate state the nature of the soul after death limbo and purgatory finally it outlines the idea of jesus s second coming and considers such concepts as deep incarnation and the new creation

this latest bacap proceedings covers three key areas in ancient philosophy ethics method and physics under ethics there are three papers on socratic piety aristotelian friendship and augustinian platonic virtue under method socratic elenchos socratic maieutic and aristotelian aporematic inquiry under physics life in plato and proclus s reconsideration of aristotelian motion

this volume explores the tremendous influence of plato s phaedrus on the philosophical religious scientific and literary discussions in the west ranging from plato s first readers over the church fathers and the platonic commentators to byzantine and renaissance thinkers the papers collected here introduce the reader to the first two millennia of the dialogue s reception history thirteen contributions by both junior and established scholars study the engagement with the phaedrus by such major figures as aristotle galen origen clemens of alexandria plotinus augustine proclus psellus ficino erasmus and many others together they cover the wide range of topics discussed in the dialogue the value of myth and allegory religion and theology love and beauty the soul and its immortality teaching and learning metaphysics and epistemology rhetoric and dialectic as well as the role and the limits of writing by placing the dialogue in this broad perspective the volume will appeal to readers interested in the phaedrus itself as well as to classicists literary theorists and historians of philosophy science and religion concerned with the dialogue s reception history and its main protagonists

the high middle ages were remarkable for their coherent sense of christendom of people who

belonged to a homogeneous christian society marked by uniform rituals of birth and death and worship that uniformity which came under increasing strain as national european characteristics became more pronounced achieved perhaps its most perfect intellectual expression in the thought of the western christian thinkers who are sometimes called scholastic theologians these philosophers produced during roughly the period 1050 1350 ce a cohesive body of work from their practice of theology as an academic discipline in the university faculties of their day richard cross elegant and stylish textbook designed specifically for modern day undergraduate use on medieval theology and philosophy courses offers the first focused introduction to these thinkers based on the individuals themselves and their central preoccupations the book discusses influential figures like abelard peter lombard and hugh of st victor the use made by aquinas of aristotle the mystical theology of bonaventure robert grosseteste s and roger bacon s interest in optics the complex metaphysics of duns scotus and the political thought of marsilius of padua and william of ockham key themes of medieval theology including famous axioms like ockham s razor are here made fully intelligible and transparent

a fresh new translation of augustine s fourth work as a christian convert the first four works written by st augustine of hippo after his conversion to christianity are dialogues that have influenced prominent thinkers from boethius to bernard lonergan usually called the cassiciacum dialogues these four works are of a high literary and intellectual quality combining ciceronian and neo platonic philosophy roman comedy and vergilian poetry and early christian theology they are also arguably augustine s most charming works exhibiting his whimsical levity and ironic wryness soliloquies is the fourth work in this tetralogy augustine coined the term soliloquy to describe this new form of dialogue soliloquies a conversation between augustine and his reason fuses the dialogue genre and roman theater opening with a search for intellectual and moral self knowledge before converging on the nature of truth and the question of the soul s immortality foley s volume also includes on the immortality of the soul which consists of notes for the unfinished portion of the work
