in arabic and islamic studies the subject of variance in general and that of textual variation in particular has not been investigated exhaustively so far in the present book the variation in texts of the closed transmission will be studied focusing on a small corpus of didactic and model poems with a view to establishing what degree of text stability and change was allowed by the medium manuscript categories of variance relating to work titles text number of verses and their sequence page layout context and the means of controlling them in the manuscripts of the poems are identified and detailed descriptions of

the copies are given the monograph also includes a presentation of some major traits of the cultural background to the study of arabic didactic poetry and of its dissemination in which memorization has played a crucial role the intended readers editors and other users of manuscripts are helped to acquaint themselves with the methods employed in the manuscripts to control variation and they are given an overview of the large spectrum of arabic didactic poetry and of its place in the traditional culture of learning in islamicate societies

this is a pioneering book about the impact that knowledge produced in the maghrib islamic north africa and al andalus muslim iberia had on the rest of the islamic world it presents results achieved in the research project local contexts and global dynamics al andalus and the maghrib in the islamic east amoi funded by the spanish ministry of science innovation and universities ffi2016 78878 r aei feder ue and directed by maribel fierro and mayte penelas the book contains 18 contributions written by senior and junior scholars from different institutions all over the world it is divided into five sections dealing with how knowledge produced in the maghrib was integrated in the mashrig starting with the emergence and construction of the concept maghrib sections 1 and 2 how travel allowed the reception in the maghrib of knowledge produced in the mashrig but also the transmission of locally produced knowledge outside the maghrib and the different ways in which such transmission took place sections 3 and 4 and how the maghribis who stayed or settled in the mashriq manifested their identity section 5 the book will be of interest not only for those whose research concentrates on the maghrib but more generally for those who want to understand the complex and shifting dynamics between centres and peripheries as regards intellectual production and circulation

this volume represents the state of the art in research on the muslim legal scholar theologian and man of letters ibn azm of cordoba d 456 1064 who is widely regarded as one of the most brilliant minds of islamic spain

tantamount to unbelief muslim scholars approached and used the bible for a variety of purposes and in different ways thus muslim historians regularly relied on biblical materials as their primary source for the pre islamic period when discussing the creation as well as the history of the israelites and the prophets preceding muḥammad authors seeking to polemicize against jews and christians were primarily interested in the presumed biblical annunciations of muḥammad and his religion and or in perceived contradictions and cases of internal abrogation in the bible these various concerns resulted from and had an impact on the ways in which muslim authors accessed the scriptures

focused on ahmad ibn ajība an eighteenth century moroccan sufi scholar renowned for his contribution to sufi gur ānic exegesis this book engages critically with his theory of divine love to elucidate his impact on the wider field of qur anic scholarship the principal source of analysis is ibn ajība s oceanic exegesis of the gur an which connected theoretical works on the concept of divine love to their practical application a breakthrough in sufi literature close analysis of this text is supplemented by a comparative approach focusing on several other eminent sufi commentaries including those of abū al qāsim al qushayrī and rūzbihān baglī shīrāzī this comparative approach situates ibn ajība s thought in theological and historical perspective engaging with his mystical approach which integrates his theory of divine love with other sufi doctrines in an accessible manner this approach it is argued left an indelible impact on future generations of gur anic exegetes within north africa and across the islamic world the book will prove an important resource for academic researchers who wish to explore the vast intellectual heritage that ibn ajība left as well as to those interested in sufi literature and islamic theology in general

the anonymity of a commentator examines the life and writings of the egyptian sufi scholar zakariyyā al anṣārī d 926 1520 the longest serving chief shāfi ī justice to the mamlūk sultanate during its final years it analyzes al anṣārī s commentaries in the disciplines of sufism and islamic law as a case study to illustrate how and why muslims produced commentaries in the later islamic middle period and how the form and rhetoric of commentary writing furnished scholars like al anṣārī with a medium in which to express their creativity and adapt the received tradition to the needs of their time whereas twentieth century scholars tended to view muslim commentary texts as symbols of intellectual stagnation in and of themselves contemporary scholars recognize that these texts are often the repositories of profound ideas although they approach them with little guidance from their academic predecessors the anonymity of a commentator aims to provide this guidance through a close study of one of the most prolific commentary writers in islamic history

muhammad different religious factions within the muslim community laid claim to the prophet s legacy drawing on research from sunni and shi ite literature liyakat n takim explores how these various groups including the caliphs scholars sufi holy men and the shi ite imams and their disciples competed to be the prophetic heirs the book also illustrates how the tradition of the heirs of the prophet was often a polemical tool used by its bearers to demand obedience and loyalty from the muslim community by imposing an authoritative rendition of texts beliefs and religious practices those who did not obey were marginalized and demonized while examining the competition for muhammad s charismatic authority takim investigates the shi ite self understanding of authority and argues that this was an important factor in the formation of a distinct shi ite leadership the heirs of the prophet also provides a new understanding of textual authority in islam by examining authority construction and the struggle for legitimacy evidenced in islamic biographical dictionaries
