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an american carpenter s story is filled with what one baby boomer learned over sixty five years here in america it explores the question and meaning of deep love as discussed in the bible and the mistakes made by false love and the price and pain it caused everyone it leads us through the tragedy of a false accusation that sends william to prison for fifteen years it leads us through story after story and the burning question was that god s intervention it introduces us to william s soul mate and a love that could only be described as coming from a living saint then it reveals to us

the deep love of others that worked tirelessly to save william s life while in prison and the love the church showed to him while there his medical fight for survival after release and his ten year fight with cancer ending with the calm and joy of living with the deep love he had been looking for and the knowledge of knowing that god was in control all the time

when the carpenters first toured japan a journalist mistakenly referred to karen as the lead sister of the band this designation stuck and karen liked it so much that she had a t shirt custom made with the slogan which she wore while drumming on the band s 1976 world tour the term also sums up the approach of this biography a celebratory re evaluation of a pioneering woman as one of the biggest selling acts of the 1970s sibling duo richard and karen carpenter created lush soundscapes of melodic pop producing global hits like we ve only just begun top of the world and close to you however though karen is rightly recognised as one of the greatest singers in popular music the tragedy of her early death in 1983 at the age of just thirty two often overshadows all that she achieved she has long been portrayed as a victim controlled by her family and exploited by the music industry this book now seeks to reframe her life and legacy through fresh interviews with friends musicians and co workers bestselling author lucy o brien s fascinating profile explores karen s contributions in the studio as a singer drummer arranger and producer as well as tracing the roots of the carpenters sound and of karen s distinctive vocals forty years after her death it also honours the lead sister s achievements in the face of her struggle with anorexia as viewed through the lens of new perspectives on eating disorders and mental health yet despite the chronic nature of her illness karen carpenter was above all a creative dedicated and assured artist whose music delivers an emotional resonance that has transcended generations and that is how she should be remembered

karen carpenter was the instantly recognisable lead singer of the carpenters the top selling american musical act of the 1970s they delivered the love songs that defined a generation karen s velvety voice on a string of 16 consecutive top 20 hits from 1970 to 1976 including close to you we ve only just begun rainy days and mondays superstar and hurting each other propelled the duo to worldwide stardom and record sales of over 100 million karen s musical career was short only 13 years during that time the carpenters released 10 studio albums toured more than 200 days a year taped five television specials and won three grammys and an american music award but that s only part of karen s story as the world received news of her death at 32 years of age in 1983 she became the proverbial poster child for anorexia nervosa little girl blue is an intimate profile of karen carpenter a girl from a modest connecticut upbringing who became a superstar based on exclusive interviews with nearly 100 friends and associates including record producers studio musicians songwriters television directors photographers radio personalities classmates childhood friends neighbours personal assistants romantic interests hairdressers and housekeepers thorough and affectionate biography of a singer who s

been constantly undervalued by the music industry mojo schmidt cannot be faulted carefully factual sensitively pitched book the word the first truly convincing account of her nightmarish story the guardian

traditionally women s eating disorders are thought to be strongly influenced by media images idealizing a normative thin female body taking a different approach the anorexic self critically examines diagnostic and popular discourses on anorexia that construct narrow and ideal notions of the female self paula sauikko analyzes the personal and political implications of discourses on the anorexic self in multiple contexts including her own experience of being diagnosed anorexic psychiatrist hilde bruch s postwar research on anorexia and media coverage of karen carpenter princess diana and other women with eating disorders sauikko traces the history of the discourses from postwar idealization of masculine autonomy to postindustrial valorization of feminine flexibility and also explores their politically progressive and psychologically healing as well as sexist and humiliating dimensions drawing on narrative therapy dialogic theory and multisited ethnography the anorexic self cultivates a less judgmental and more self reflexive way of relating to ourselves others and societies in which we live

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introduction by richard carpenter the definitive biography of one of the most enduring and endeared recording artists in history the carpenters is told for the first time from the perspective of richard carpenter through more than 100 hours of exclusive interviews and some 200 photographs from richard s personal archive many never published after becoming multimillion selling grammy winning superstars with their 1970 breakthrough hit they long to be close to you richard and karen carpenter would win over millions of fans worldwide with a record breaking string of hits including we ve only just begun top of the world and yesterday once more by 1975 success was taking its toll years of jam packed work schedules including hundreds of concert engagements proved to be just too much for the carpenters to keep the hits coming and ultimately to keep the music playing at all however richard and karen never took their adoring public or each other for granted in carpenters the musical legacy richard carpenter tells his story for the first time with candor heart and humor he sheds new light on the carpenters trials and triumphs work that remains the gold standard for melodic pop this beautifully illustrated definitive biography with exclusive interviews and never before seen photographs is a must have for any carpenters fan

in the 60s and 70s america s music scene was marked by raucous excess reflected in the tragic overdoses of young superstars such as jimi hendrix and janis joplin at the same time the uplifting harmonies and sunny lyrics that propelled karen carpenter and her brother richard to international

fame belied a different sort of tragedy the underconsumption that led to karen s death at age thirty two from the effects of an eating disorder in why karen carpenter matters karen tongson whose filipino musician parents named her after the pop icon interweaves the story of the singer s rise to fame with her own trans pacific journey between the philippines where imitations of american pop styles flourished and karen carpenter s home ground of southern california tongson reveals why the carpenters chart topping seemingly whitewashed musical fantasies of normal love can now have profound significance for her as well as for other people of color lgbt communities and anyone outside the mainstream culture usually associated with karen carpenter s legacy this hybrid of memoir and biography excavates the destructive perfectionism at the root of the carpenters sound while finding the beauty in the singer s all too brief life

moving nimbly between literary and historical texts monica flegel provides a much needed interpretive framework for understanding the specific formulation of child cruelty popularized by the national society for the prevention of cruelty to children nspcc in the late nineteenth century flegel considers a wide range of well known and more obscure texts from the mid eighteenth century to the early twentieth including philosophical writings by locke and rousseau poetry by coleridge blake and caroline norton works by journalists and reformers like henry mayhew and mary carpenter and novels by frances trollope charles dickens wilkie collins and arthur morrison taking up crucial topics such as the linking of children with animals the figure of the child performer the relationship between commerce and child endangerment and the problem of juvenile delinquency flegel examines the emergence of child abuse as a subject of legal and social concern in england and its connection to earlier primarily literary representations of endangered children with the emergence of the nspcc and the new crime of cruelty to children new professions and genres such as child protection and social casework supplanted literary works as the authoritative voices in the definition of social ills and their cure flegel argues that this development had material effects on the lives of children as well as profound implications for the role of class in representations of suffering and abused children combining nuanced close readings of individual texts with persuasive interpretations of their influences and limitations flegel s book makes a significant contribution to the history of childhood social welfare the family and victorian philanthropy

that many people have never thought of has ground breaking analysis of this great man of faith provides 7 godly principles that men can implement today explains details of the jewish background for many biblical scenes and is easy reading well researched and well documented there are only a handful of books on joseph the carpenter or joseph of nazareth none of them focuses on his fatherhood role this book features a unique approach to the study of joseph the carpenter because of a its fatherhood focus b its bible study components c its extensive application for family studies and family values d its approach to marriage and relationships and e its presentation of jewish customs and traditions

the queer biopic in the aids era offers a new account of the aids crisis and the emergence of new queer cinema author laura stamm asks why queer filmmakers repeatedly produced biographical films of queer individuals living and dead throughout the years surrounding the aids crisis queer filmmakers engagement with the biopic evokes the genre s history of building life through the portrayal of lives worthy of admiration and emulation but it also points to another biopic history that of representing lives damaged by portraying lives damaged by inconceivable loss queer filmmakers challenge the illusion of a coherent self presumably reinforced by the biopic genre and in doing so their films open the potential for new means of connection and relationality the queer biopic in the aids era features fresh readings of the cinema of derek jarman john greyson todd haynes barbara hammer and tom kalin by calling for a reappraisal of the queer biopic this book also calls for a reappraisal of new queer cinema s legacy and its influence of contemporary queer film as a whole this book pays particular attention to the biopic s queer resonances opening up its historical connections to projects of education public health and social hygiene along with the production of a shared history and national identity

kelly englewood was raised by her mother christina harrison a news reporter in afghanistan who is captured by osama bin laden christina is released from his harem and is brought back to the united states she discovers that she has become pregnant by osama she then marries leonardo englewood who kelly believes to be her father until age 13 when her mother tells her who her real father is she questions her mother s validity and still calls leonardo dad kelly tries earnestly to reach osama by letters after he writes back to her for her to meet him at the sacramento state capitol leonardo and kelly become suspicious that he is planning another terrorist attack leonardo and kelly turn in the letters to the fbi osama is captured while he is visiting kelly by national helicopter and imprisoned by the national guard he is executed via president bush s order in the novel justice is served on the victims of the septemeber 11 2001 attacks

this book gives a voice to more than eighty people from every major continent and from all walks of life it includes poets and philosophers rulers and spies activists and artists alongside such celebrated figures as michelangelo frederick the great and harvey milk are lesser known but no less surprising individuals dong xian and the chinese emperor ai whose passion flourished in the 1st century bc the unfortunate robert de péronne first to be burned at the stake for sodomy katharine philips writing proto lesbian poetry in seventeenth century england and aimee and jaguar whose love defied the death camps of wartime germany with many striking illustrations gay life stories will entertain give pause for thought and ultimately celebrate the diversity of human history

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
