this volume deals with the federal theology of johannes cocceius who lived in the seventeenth century 1603 1669 german by birth he taught at bremen franeker and leiden where he was professor of theology 1650 1669 as foremost biblical interpreter he sought to formulate a covenant theory which described all of human history by introducing the structure of consecutive covenants or foedera the book poses a surprising alternative to the readings of earlier scholarship on cocceius by its careful presentation of the pneumatological components of the doctrine of covenants cocceius federal theology was of considerable importance in the theological and political history of europe and the united states and formes the framework for much of the reformed theology in the past three centuries

this is a sequel to richard muller s the unaccomodated calvin oup 2000 in the previous book muller attempted to situate calvin s theological work in their historical context and to strip away various twentieth century theological grids that have clouded our perceptions of the work of the reformer in the present book muller carries this approach forward with the goal of overcoming a series of nineteenth and twentieth century theological frameworks characteristic of much of the scholarship on reformed orthodoxy or what might be called calvinism after calvin

this book contributes to the ongoing revision of early modern british history by examining the apocalyptic tradition through the life and writings of joseph mede 1586 1638 the history of the british apocalyptic tradition has yet to undergo a thorough revision past studies followed a historiographical paradigm which associated millenarianism with a revolutionary agenda a careful study of joseph mede one of the key individuals responsible for the rebirth of millenarianism in england suggests a different picture of seventeenth century apocalypticism the roots of mede s apocalyptic thought are not found in extreme activism but in the detailed study of the apocalypse with the aid of ancient christian and jewish sources mede s legacy illustrates the geographical prevalence and long term sustainability of his interpretations this volume shows that the continual discussion of millenarian ideas reveals a vibrant tradition that cannot be reconstructed to fit within one simple historiographical narrative

daniel kalaj d 1681 was a polish reformer of hungarian background born in little poland malopolska and trained in franeker friesland under some of the most brilliant reformed theologians of seventeenth century europe such as cocceius and cloppenburgh kalaj s ministry in the reformed church of little poland was abruptly interrupted when catholic authorities wrongly accused him of spreading then outlawed arianism calling him a calvinoarian kalaj became the first polish protestant minister to receive a sentence of capital punishment as a result of the new anti toleration law issued in 1658 against arians under the false pretext of military treason during the second northern war 1655 1660 he escaped the axe by fleeing to lithuania and later to gdańsk where he wrote his best known work a friendly dialogue between an evangelical minister and a roman catholic priest the friendly dialogue is both kalaj s own personal defense and a

compendium to polish reformed doctrine and has a strongly irenic disposition in contrast with many reformed thinkers of his day kalaj is capable of communicating reformed doctrine in a friendly and peaceful manner he places special emphasis on the unity of the catholic church as expressed in his statement that the three churches roman and lutheran and reformed are all part of one true church before god while at the same time attempting to retain his reformed orthodoxy

carmichael argues that johannes cocceius s theology of the sabbath serves as a window through which one can view more clearly his federal theology or covenant theology covenant theology was the most distinctive feature of his theology moreover cocceius spent a notable portion of his life engaging in the leiden sabbath controversies from 1655 to 1659 which played a key role in the split of the reformed dutch republic into two socio political blocs cocceians and voetians so far scholars have tended to overlook this critical phase in cocceius s theological development carmichael sheds light on it by looking at the theological texts that cocceius wrote that absorbed his attention during this significant period casey carmichael examines first the evolution of the problem of the sabbath in cocceius s theological tradition reformed orthodoxy in chapters 2 4 and second the development of cocceius s doctrine of the sabbath structured around the leiden sabbath controversies in chapters 5 8
