what place did literacy and education have in the construction and maintenance of a colonial society in new mexico the answer to that question is carefully developed for the first time in this book gallegos assembles and interprets church and government documents to examine the relationship between literacy education and the social order in colonial new mexico this study explores the role of literacy in the process of colonization focusing on how individuals learned to read and write to what ends these skills were employed and the ways that literacy functioned to maintain and challenge the social order following the military reconquest missions were re established among the pueblos utilizing a pedagogy common in colonial mexico the missionaries raised and educated selected young boys from the indian pueblos after becoming literate these young men called doctrinarios became invaluable to the friars in the indoctrination of the other natives moreover the author examines the many ways in which literacy in a restricted form was used by the civil and religious authorities to establish and maintain social control and by the populace in exercising their political rights and participating in the economic sphere

chronicles the history geography government economy people and landmarks of the state of new mexico

the people geological features and historic events that have made new mexico what it is today are commemorated in over 350 historic markers along the state s roads this guide is designed to fill in the gaps and answer the questions those markers provoke

why did new mexico remain so long in political limbo before being admitted to the union as a state combining extensive research and a clear and well organized style robert w larson provides the answers to this question in a thorough and comprehensive account of the territory s extraordinary six decade struggle for statehood this book is no mere chronology of political moves however it is the history of a turbulent frontier state sweeping into the current almost every colorful character of the territory not only politicians but ranchers outlaws soldiers newspapermen indians merchants lawyers and people from every walk of life were involved this is a

book for the reader who is interested in any aspect of southwestern territorial history

this new perspective on the colorful history of new mexico includes the stories of many of the people who have spent their lives in the area from before the arrival of europeans in the sixteenth century through the present day

the state of new mexico in the united states was originally part of texas and the land included in the louisiana purchase of 1803 the lands were purchased from the french and included portions of fourteen current u s states and two canadian provinces these lands were under french control from 1682 1763 and from 1803 1804 the area was named in honor of king louis 14th a spanish expedition in 1540 by francisco vasquez coronado was formed in an attempt to find the ancient seven golden cities of ci the rumor began with cabeza de vacas visit to what is now southern new mexico it is rumored that seven priest fled the city of merida spain taking vast amounts of gold and other treasures to a far away land later to be called the americas coronado however was unsuccessful and returned home another expedition led by juan de onate salazar in 1598 explored north of the rio grande and claimed most of modern day new mexico for spain santa fe became the capital city of the territory and remains the capital of the state

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
