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in this book lisa coutras explores the structure and complexity of j r r tolkien s narrative theology synthesizing his christian worldview with his creative imagination she illustrates how within the framework of a theological aesthetics transcendental beauty is the unifying principle that integrates all aspects of tolkien s writing from pagan despair to christian joy j r r tolkien s christianity is often held in an unsteady tension with the pagan despair of his mythic world some critics portray these as incompatible while christian analysis tends to oversimplify the presence of religious symbolism this polarity of opinion testifies to the need for a unifying interpretive lens the fact that tolkien saw his own writing as religious and catholic yet was preoccupied with pagan mythology nature language and evil suggests that these areas were wholly integrated with his christian worldview tolkien s theology of beauty examines six structural elements demonstrating that the author s christianity is deeply embedded in the narrative framework of his creative imagination

many contemporary theologians seek to retrieve the concept of beauty as a way for people to encounter god this groundbreaking book argues that while martin luther s view of beauty has often been ignored or underappreciated it has much to contribute to that quest mark mattes one of today s leading lutheran theologians analyzes luther s theological aesthetics and discusses its implications for music art and the contemplative life mattes shows that for luther the cross is the lens through which the beauty of god is refracted into the world

many christian theologians have associated beauty both in nature and art with the holy spirit they include early fathers like st irenaeus and st clement of alexandria and later writers like calvin jonathan edwards sergius bulgakov and hans von balthasar an exploration of early thought on the topic this book is an introduction to theological aesthetics besides examining the connection made between the holy spirit and beauty sherry expands on the theme by considering related topics such as divine glory inspiration and the eschatological character of beauty he effectively brings together two areas of lively interest in contemporary christianity the theology of the holy spirit and theological aesthetics

with juana ines de la cruz and the theology of beauty george h tavad presents an investigation of the theology of this latin american poet examines the whole range of von balthasar s theology and provides a clear introduction to his work

a famous italian theologian s eloquent reflections on beauty and god beauty is an event it happens when the whole the all offers itself to us in the fragment when the infinite makes itself little this is how bruno forte describes the long held christian tradition that sees god as the source of all beauty in the portal of beauty forte examines the deep though not always obvious contribution of theological thought from the minds of such luminaries as augustine aquinas kierkegaard dostoevsky balthasar and evdokimov to our understanding and experience of beauty the portal of beauty is an erudite moving and deeply felt study by the most famous italian theologian in italy on the nature of beauty and how it can lead us to a greater understanding of and communion with the divine

the identification of god with beauty is one of the most aesthetically rich notions within christian thought however this claim is often at risk of becoming untethered from core christian theological confessions to avoid a theological account of beauty becoming a mere projection of our wildest desires it must be reined in by dogmatics to make this case this book employs the thought of robert w jenson to construct a dogmatic aesthetics jenson s whole theological program is directed by exploring the systematic potential of the core doctrines of the faith that finally opens out into a vast vision of the beauty of god and creatures god is a great fugue the rest is music taking jenson s cue the account of beauty presented in this book is propelled by a core conviction of jenson s theology the sole analogue between god and creatures is not being or any other metaphysical concept but jesus christ

this book explores the role of aesthetic experience in our perception and understanding of the holy richard viladesau s goal is to articulate a theology of revelation examined in relation to three principal dimensions of the aesthetic realm feeling and imagination beauty or taste and the arts after briefly considering ways in which theology itself can be imaginative or beautiful viladesau concentrates on the theological significance of aesthetic data provided by each of the three major spheres of aesthetic perception and response throughout the work the underlying question is how each of these spheres serves as a source however ambiguous of revelation although he frames much of his argument in terms of catholic theology from the church fathers to karl rahner hans urs von balthasar bernard lonergan and david tracy viladesau also makes extensive use of ideas from the protestant theologian of the arts gerardus van der leeuw and draws insights from such diverse thinkers as hans goerg gadamer wolhart pannenberg and iris murdoch his analysis is enlivened by the artistic examples he selects the music of mozart as contemplated by karl barth schoenbergs opera moyses und aron the sculptures of chartres cathedral poems by rilke and michelangelo and many others what emerges from this study is what viladesau terms a

transcendental theology of aesthetics in thomistic terms he finds that beauty is not only a perfection but a transcendental that is any instance of beauty rightly perceived and rightly understood can be seen to imply divinely beautiful things as well in other words viladesau argues god is the absolute and necessary condition for the possibility of beauty

reveals the importance of the sacramental imagination as the key to the renewal of christology and of modern christian literature

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
