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this text presents techniques and concepts for symbolic or formal logic with clear comprehensive explanations and numerous examples this third edition of the book includes a number of new and updated exercises as well as expanded discussions on evaluating arguments

the logic of our language teaches the practical and everyday application of formal logic rather than overwhelming the reader with abstract theory jackson and mcleod show how the skills developed through the practice of logic can help us to better understand our own language and reasoning processes the authors goal is to draw attention to the patterns and logical structures inherent in our spoken and written language by teaching the reader how to translate english sentences into formal symbols other logical tools including truth tables truth trees and natural deduction are then introduced as techniques for examining the properties of symbolized sentences and assessing the validity of arguments a substantial number of practice questions are offered both within the book itself and as interactive activities on a companion website

french philosopher gilles deleuze wrote two logic books francis bacon the logic of sensation and the logic of sense however in neither of these books nor in any other works does deleuze articulate in a formal way the features of the logic he employs he certainly does not use classical logic and the best options for the non classical logic that he may be implementing are fuzzy intuitionist and many valued these are applicable to his concepts of heterogeneous composition and becoming affirmative synthetic disjunction and powers of the false in the logic of gilles deleuze basic principles corry shores examines the applicability of three non classical logics to deleuze s philosophy by building from the philosophical and logical writings of graham priest the world s leading proponent of dialetheism through so doing shores argues that deleuze s logic is best understood as a dialetheic paraconsistent many valued logic

in the great libraries of europe and the united states hidden in fading manuscripts on forgotten shelves lie the works of medieval hebrew logic from the end of the twelfth century through the renaissance jews wrote and translated commentaries and original compositions in aristotelian logic one can say without exaggeration that wherever jews studied philosophy spain france northern africa germany palestine they began their studies with logic yet with few exceptions the manuscripts that were catalogued in the last century have failed to arouse the interest of modern scholars while the history of logic is now an established sub discipline of the history of philosophy the history of hebrew logic is only in its infancy the present work contains a translation and commentary of what is arguably the greatest work of hebrew logic the sefer ha heqqesh ha yashar the book of the correct syllogism of levi ben gershom gersonides 1288 1344 gersonides is well known today as a philosopher astronomer mathematician and biblical exegete but in the middle ages he was also famous for his prowess as a logician the correct syllogism is his attempt to construct a theory of the syllogism that is free of what he considers to be the mistakes of aristotle as interpreted by the muslim commentator averroes it is an absorbing challenging work first written by gersonides when he was merely thirty one years old then significantly revised by him the translation presented here is of the revised version

charles peirce s illustrations of the logic of science is an early work in the philosophy of science and the official birthplace of pragmatism it contains peirce s two most influential papers the fixation of belief and how to make our ideas clear as well as discussions on the theory of probability the ground of induction the relation between science and religion and the logic of abduction unsatisfied with the result and driven by a constant almost feverish urge to improve his work peirce spent considerable time and effort revising these papers after the turn of the century these efforts gained significant momentum when peirce sought to establish his role in the development of pragmatism while distancing himself from the more popular versions that had become current the present edition brings together the original series as it appeared in popular science monthly and a selection of peirce s later revisions many of which remained hidden in the mass of messy manuscripts that were left behind after his death in 1914

peirce s speculative grammar logic as semiotics offers a comprehensive philologically accurate and exegetically ambitious developmental account of peirce s theory of speculative grammar the book traces the evolution of peirce s grammatical writings from his early research on the classification of arguments in the 1860s up to the complex semiotic taxonomies elaborated in the first decade of the twentieth century it will be of interest to academic specialists working on peirce the history of american philosophy and pragmatism the philosophy of language the history of logic and semiotics
