news and news sources offers a fresh introduction to the sociology of news it is often suggested that the powerful dominate news agendas increasingly however less powerful groups are employing sophisticated media strategies and new communication technologies to get their message across the implications of this development are unclear do these developments herald a democratisation of news arenas or will they enable the powerful further strengthen their control over the flow of information to the public domain news and news sources reviews new research in the rapidly expanding field of political communication drawing upon material from Britain Europe and the USA provides a clear introduction to the processes of news production and the implications of the rise in global electronic news communication and assesses the various theoretical frameworks available for analysing these developments including functionalism pluralism marxism political economy hegemony theory discourse theory and postmodernism

in the current day and age objective facts have less influence on opinions and decisions than personal emotions and beliefs many individuals rely on their social networks to gather

information thanks to social media's ability to share information rapidly and over a much greater geographic range however this creates an overall false balance as people tend to seek out information that is compatible with their existing views and values they deliberately seek out facts and data that specifically support their conclusions and classify any information that contradicts their beliefs as false news navigating fake news alternative facts and misinformation in a post truth world is a collection of innovative research on human and automated methods to deter the spread of misinformation online such as legal or policy changes information literacy workshops and algorithms that can detect fake news dissemination patterns in social media while highlighting topics including source credibility share culture and media literacy this book is ideally designed for social media managers technology and software developers it specialists educators columnists writers editors journalists broadcasters newscasters researchers policymakers and students

published over twenty years ago regina g lawrence's *The Politics of Force* was the first scholarly book to look at the way in which media coverage of unexpected dramatic events shaped public consciousness about important social and political problems at a time when police brutality was rarely discussed in the news lawrence examined police use of force in over 500 incidents with an in depth look at the rodney king case in doing so she showed that when incidents of police brutality became news they offered one of the few real opportunities for marginalized voices and activists to find a public platform and take on the powerful in the intervening years the empirical and theoretical contributions of *The Politics of Force* have become more significant not only because police brutality is back in the news but because the media system itself has changed in this updated edition lawrence contextualizes and extends these contributions while including a closer look at race and racial justice in incidents of police use of force reflecting on the context in which the book was written a time when race and policing received limited coverage in the news and in the field of political communication lawrence considers what has changed in media studies since the year 2000 what things haven't changed and why moreover lawrence examines coverage of more recent incidents of police violence and the ways in which the voices of citizen activists are treated in the news today in turn she addresses the important question of how defining political problems through such events might or might not produce more lasting policy change expanding on her landmark publication lawrence provides an accessible update on news production dynamics and police use of force for a new generation of scholars students and activists

Resisting the News brings together unique insights from activists and alternative media users to offer a distinctive perspective on the problems of journalism today and how to fix them using critical cultural theory and in particular the conceptual frameworks of ritual communication and interpretive communities this book examines how audiences filter their

interpretations of mainstream news through the prisms of their identities and experiences with alternative media and political protest jennifer rauch gives voice to alternative media audiences and illuminates the cultural resources values assumptions critical skills and discursive strategies through which they make sense of their news environments drawing on a 15 year research project rauch employs a variety of qualitative quantitative and quasi ethnographic methods including focus groups media use diaries close ended surveys and open ended questions to paint a layered portrait of liberal and conservative critiques of journalism shedding new light on popular theories about how news works and about mass audiences this book will be useful to students scholars and teachers of political communication journalism studies media studies and critical cultural studies
