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through roughly 160 alphabetically arranged reference entries this book surveys the material culture and social institutions of ancient rome ancient rome was one of the great civilizations of antiquity honoring the contributions of their cultural forebearers who included etruscans asians and egyptians as well as greeks roman artists writers and thinkers freely borrowed where tradition dictated and innovated where personal talent and imagination directed forging a unique creative experience that formed the basis of western european artistic literary and philosophical production for 2 000 years while other reference works typically examine battles and politicians this book focuses on roman social history and daily life painting a detailed picture of the material culture and social institutions of ancient rome a timeline highlights key events while an overview essay surveys the achievements of the romans reference entries provide objective information about art architecture literature commerce transportation government religion and other topics related to roman life each entry provides cross references and suggestions for further reading and some provide sidebars of interesting facts along with excerpts from primary source documents the book closes with a selected general bibliography of resources suitable for student research

this study of ancient rome offers a fascinating glimpse of what roman society was like from fashion to food to politics and recreation gathered from literary works art and archaeological remains while the political history and prominent figures of ancient rome are well known accounts of daily life in that time and place often remain untold this fascinating encyclopedia explores this period from a social and cultural perspective digging into the day to day activities of how romans dressed what they ate how they worked and what they did for fun drawing from recent archaeological evidence author james w ermatinger explores the everyday

lives of roman citizens of all levels and classes this book is organized into ten sections art economics family fashion food housing politics recreation religion and science each section contains more than two dozen entries that illuminate such topics as slavery as a social movement the menus of peasants slaves and the elite and the science and engineering solutions that became harbingers for today s technology the work contains a selection of primary documents as well as a bibliography of print and internet resources

when roman objects and artifacts are properly analyzed they serve as valuable primary sources for learning about ancient history this book provides the guidance and relevant historical context students need to see relics as evidence of long past events and society artifacts from ancient rome is a unique social history that explores major aspects of daily life in a long ago era via images of physical objects and historical information about these items this book also affords hands on training on how to approach primary sources the author a historian also trained as an archaeologist begins by explaining the concept of using artifacts to understand and see the past and providing a primer for effectively analyzing artifacts entries on the artifacts follow with each containing an introduction a description of the artifact an explanation of its significance and a list of further sources of information readers of the book will not only gain a composite impression of daily life in ancient rome through the study of artifacts from domestic life religion war transportation entertainment and more but will also learn how to best understand and analyze primary sources for learning

this handy reference provides full access to the 1 200 years of roman rule from the 8th century b c to the 5th century a d including information on art literature law and engineering 150 illustrations

this book sheds new light on labor and laboring in the roman world it starts with the individual laborer and works up emphasizing their agency in navigating transforming and transcending the systems and structures around them taking advantage of the broad applicability of notions of work and labor to human lives at every rung of roman society the volume also offers numerous overlapping frameworks for thinking comparatively between many different kinds of work whether in agriculture craft trade politics art or literature the book is organized around the typical work life experience of the modern 9 to 5 and provides a means of thinking in a rigorous way about how the working lives of scholars of rome are caught up in ancient discourse and practices

throughout history every culture has had its own ideas on what growing up and growing old means with variations between chronological biological and social ageing and with different emphases on the critical stages and transitions from birth to death this volume is the first to highlight the role of age in determining behaviour and expectations of behaviour across the life span of an inhabitant of ancient rome drawing on developments in the social sciences as well as ancient evidence the authors focus on the period c 200bc ad200 looking at childhood the transition to adulthood maturity and old age they explore how both the individual and society were involved in and reacted to these different stages in terms of gender wealth and status and personal choice and empowerment

presenting a wide range of relevant translated texts on death burial and commemoration in the roman world this book is organized thematically and supported by discussion of recent scholarship the breadth of material included ensures that this sourcebook will shed light on the way death was thought about and dealt with in roman society

inspired by the achievements of the ancient greeks the romans made their city the center of an empire unsurpassed in size and

influence for more than a thousand years its rich legacy shaped the medieval world and continues to amaze us today life myth and art in ancient rome celebrates the many achievements of roman culture and delves into its fascinating dark side romans erected structures so well built and engineered that they still stand millennia later yet these same buildings also showcased blood sports as public entertainment the romans instituted just government impartial legal and political institutions and concepts of citizenship yet its population included slaves as well as patricians and plebeians and was often riven by intrigue superstition and savagery this volume is a richly illustrated introduction to a fascinating at times paradoxical civilization and its art and architecture ranging from magnificent temples and aqueducts to exquisite mosaics and jewelry placing the art in its cultural context the author covers themes that have long inspired the western imagination including the rise and fall of emperors the life and death of the gladiator the belief in omens and prophecy and ultimately the establishment of christianity

focusing on the transitional period of the late republic to the early principate trees in ancient rome offers a sustained examination of the deployment of trees in the ancient city exploring not only the practicalities of their cultivation but also their symbolic value the ruminal fig tree sheltered the she wolf as she nursed romulus and remus and year s later rome was founded between two groves as the city grew neighbourhoods bore the names of groves and hills were known by the trees which grew atop them from the 1st century bce triumphs included trees among their spoils and rome s green cityscape grew as did the challenges of finding room for

trees within the congested city this volume begins with an examination of the role of trees as repositories of human memory lasting for several generations it goes on to untangle the import of trees and their role in the triumphal procession before closing with a discussion of how trees could be grown in rome's urban spaces drawing on a combination of literary visual and archaeological sources it reveals the rich variety of trees in evidence and explores how they impacted and were used to impact life in the ancient city

in this highly original book obert bernard mlambo offers a comparative and critical examination of the relationship between military veterans and land expropriation in the client army of the first century bc roman republic and veterans of the zimbabwean liberation war the study centres on the body of the soldier the cultural production of images and representations of gender which advance theoretical discussions around war masculinity and violence mlambo employs a transcultural comparative approach based on a persistent factor found in both societies land expropriation often articulated in a framework of patriarchy land appropriation takes place in the context of war shaped masculinities this book fosters a deeper understanding of social processes adding an important new perspective to the study of military violence and paying attention to veterans claims for rewards and compensation these claims are developed in the context of war and its direct consequences namely expropriation confiscation and violence land expropriation in ancient rome and contemporary zimbabwe contributes to current efforts to decolonise knowledge construction by revealing that a non western perspective can broaden our understanding of veterans war violence land and gender in classical culture

in poetic autonomy in ancient rome luke roman offers a major new approach to the study of ancient roman poetry a key term in the modern interpretation of art and literature aesthetic autonomy refers to the idea that the work of art belongs to a realm of its own

separate from ordinary activities and detached from quotidian interests while scholars have often insisted that aesthetic autonomy is an exclusively modern concept and cannot be applied to other historical periods the book argues that poets in ancient rome employed a rhetoric of autonomy to define their position within roman society and establish the distinctive value of their work this study of the roman rhetoric of poetic autonomy includes an examination of poetic self representation in first person genres from the late republic to the early empire looking closely at the works of lucilius catullus propertius horace virgil tibullus ovid statius martial and juvenal poetic autonomy in ancient rome affords fresh insight into ancient literary texts and reinvigorates the dialogue between ancient and modern aesthetics

the teacher in ancient rome the magister and his world by lisa maurice investigates a particular aspect of education in ancient rome namely the figure of the teacher after identifying and defining the different kinds of teachers in the roman education systems maurice illuminates their ways of life both as both professionals and members of society this text surveys the physical environment in which teachers worked as well as the methods equipment and techniques used in the classroom slavery patronage and the social and financial status of the various types of teachers are considered in depth maurice examines ideological issues surrounding teachers discussing the idealized figure of the teacher and the frequent differences between this ideal and actual educators also explored are the challenges posed by the interaction of greek and roman culture and later between paganism and christianity and how these social clashes affected those responsible for educating the youth of society the teacher in ancient rome is a comprehensive treatment of a figure instantly recognizable yet strikingly different from that of the modern teacher

this book shares little known facts from and excerpts of primary source documents to correct popular misconceptions about ancient rome and to show how those misconceptions became widespread roman personalities and history have always had a larger than life profile in american popular culture but most people think of this ancient civilization as merely decadent cruel and elitist most of our stereotypical conceptions of the empire and its people however are wrong this book corrects popular misconceptions about the ancient roman world thus making ancient history relevant and accessible to modern readers and allowing modern critics of american politics and society to draw accurate comparisons each chapter discusses how a particular misconception developed spread and evolved into what we now believe to be the historical truth topics discussed include crucifixion the destruction of carthage julius caesar s last words and roman hygiene excerpts from primary source documents provide evidence of both the rise of the historical fictions and the truths behind the myths
