an examination of the various different expressions of the distinctive german myth of the east that has been such a marked feature of german culture over the last two centuries influencing german attitudes both to eastern europe itself and also to germans own sense of identity

why does the myth of the fall continue to matter in an increasingly secularised world why do we continue to imagine a point where everything went wrong and why must we imagine that things were once better than they are now modern political theodicies repeatedly play to the myth of the fall as empowering human authorship promising to take back control or make america great again the myth of the fall is so absorbed into western culture that we sometimes don t even notice it s there let alone think about why and how it has persisted through secularisation it is often pernicious playing on feelings of innate supremacy and lost dominion linda freedman shows that it is also creative the first act of disobedience and resistance which set new human stories in motion and gave narrative shape to existence nineteenth century writers were so steeped in christian traditions that the fall remained an ineluctable structure of thought and even those who resisted or tried to secularise its doctrinal

orthodoxies tended to affirm its logic it was a political social and cultural force as well as an aesthetic preoccupation a way of reflecting on the limitations and possibilities of art and literature driving innovations in prose poetry and the novel rethinking narratives of american exceptionalism with transatlantic and anti racist writings freedman captures some of the most theologically imaginative and aesthetically and politically interesting textures of the fall in nineteenth century literature the myth of the fall survives as much more than a judgmental and repressive social mechanism and mattered to people living vastly different lives this is partly due to the adaptability and force of its narrative logic and partly because it gives narrative time the feel of a quest an infinite search for meaning the fall holds onto the otherworldly and the unworldly it serves as a formal metalanguage a residually and sometimes explicitly religious aesthetic an origin myth of modernity a source for being in time

james s examination of the generational curse doctrine uncovers the unsound scriptural foundations of the doctrine and brings believers in christ to the awareness of their god decreed blessedness in christ christian

this critical review of the history of america s relations with iran shows how little of the two countries long and complicated relationship is reflected in the foundational axioms of the great satan myth the author explains why meaningful and equitable relations can begin only after the two nations have arrived at a common critical and accurate reading of the past

nathaniel berman s divine and demonic in the poetic mythology of the zohar the other side of kabbalah offers a new approach to the central work of jewish mysticism the sefer ha zohar book of radiance berman explicates the literary techniques through which the zohar constructs a mythology of intricately related divine and demonic personae drawing on classical and modern rhetorical paradigms as well as psychoanalytical theories of the formation of subjectivity berman reinterprets the meaning of the zohar s divine and demonic personae exploring their shared origins and their ongoing antagonisms and intimacies finally he shows how the zoharic portrayal of the demonic the other side contributes to reflecting on alterity of all kinds

this book examines the phenomenon of the russian intelligentsia as a cultural story or myth it focuses on one of the most important and influential groups of russian intellectuals the 1960s generation or sixtiers who devoted their lives to defending socialism with a human face authored perestroika and were subsequently demonized when the reforms failed

the idea that religion has a dangerous tendency to promote violence is part of the conventional wisdom of western societies and it underlies many of our institutions and policies from limits on the public role of religion to efforts to promote liberal democracy in the middle east william t cavanaugh challenges this conventional wisdom by examining how the twin categories of religion and the secular are constructed a growing body of scholarly work explores how the category religion has been constructed in the modern west and in colonial contexts according to specific configurations of political power cavanaugh draws on this scholarship to examine how timeless and transcultural categories of religion and the secular are used in arguments that religion causes violence he argues three points 1 there is no transhistorical and transcultural essence of religion what counts as religious or secular in any given context is a function of political configurations of power 2 such a transhistorical and transcultural concept of religion as non rational and prone to violence is one of the foundational legitimating myths of western society 3 this myth can be and is used to legitimate neo colonial violence against non western others particularly the muslim world

everyday around the world women who work in the third world factories of global firms face the idea that they are disposable melissa w wright explains how this notion proliferates both within and beyond factory walls through the telling of a simple story the myth of the disposable third world woman this

myth explains how young women workers around the world eventually turn into living forms of waste disposable women and other myths of global capitalism follows this myth inside the global factories and surrounding cities in northern mexico and in southern china illustrating the crucial role the tale plays in maintaining not just the constant flow of global capital but the present regime of transnational capitalism the author also investigates how women challenge the story and its meaning for workers in global firms these innovative responses illustrate how a politics for confronting global capitalism must include the many creative ways that working people resist its dehumanizing effects

myths of europe focuses on the identity of europe seeking to re assess its cultural literary and political traditions in the context of the 21st century over 20 authors historians political scientists literary scholars art and cultural historians from five countries here enter into a debate how far are the myths by which europe has defined itself for centuries relevant to its role in global politics after 9 11 can old europe maintain its traditional identity now that the european union includes countries previously supposed to be on its periphery how has europe handled relations with the non european other in the past and how is it reacting now to an influx of immigrants and asylum seekers it becomes clear that founding myths such as hamlet and st nicholas have helped construct the european consciousness but also that these and other european myths have disturbing eurocentric implications are these myths still viable today and if so to what extent and for what purpose this volume sits on the interface between culture and politics and is important reading for all those interested in the transmission of myth and in both the past and the future of europe

as many as six thousand years ago when their civilization flourished in the Nile river valley the ancient Egyptians told many of the myths in this book author Don Nardo discusses various myths including the creation of the gods and humans and the near destruction of humanity Nardo also introduces us to the story within a story in the shipwrecked sailor each chapter is followed by a question and answer section which covers characters themes and symbols an expert commentary section enhances the myths with opinions by noted scholars

Sir James G. Frazer (1854-1941) is famous as the author of *The Golden Bough* but his work ranged widely across classics cultural history folklore and literary criticism as well as anthropology a fellow of Trinity College Cambridge for 62 years Sir James G. Frazer devoted his life to research this volume was first published in 1930

lexicon for identifying the superhero mythos the author examines the myth in several narratives including buffy the vampire slayer green arrow and beowulf and discusses such diverse characters as batman wolverine invincible and john constantine
