as the purse strings tighten company costs need to be cut without this affecting performance or sales a common solution to this problem is to restructure the organization of the company i e adjust the lines and boxes on the organization chart with the aim of setting it up for high performance this inevitably fails because an organization is a system change one aspect and other facets will also change organization design engaging with change looks at how to re design the organizational system in order to increase productivity performance and value providing the
