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from the bestselling author of a history of god and the great transformation comes a balanced nuanced understanding of the role religion plays in human life and the trajectory of faith in modern times why has god become incredible why is it that atheists and theists alike now think and speak about god in a way that veers so profoundly from the thinking of our ancestors moving from the paleolithic age to the present karen armstrong details the lengths to which humankind has gone to experience a sacred reality that it called god brahman nirvana allah or dao she examines the diminished impulse toward religion in our own time when a significant number of people either want nothing to do with god or question the efficacy of faith with her trademark depth of knowledge and profound insight armstrong elucidates how the changing world has necessarily altered the importance of religion at both societal and individual levels and she makes a powerful convincing argument for structuring a faith that speaks to the

needs of our dangerously polarized age

here armstrong argues that atheism has rarely been a denial of the sacred itself but has nearly always rejected a particular conception of god she suggests that if we draw on the insights of the past we can build a faith that speaks to our needs

a logical case for god and creation first takes the reader through a logical look at whether it is reasonable to believe that the bible is true and that god exists then looking at the universe including the existence of billions of galaxies and trillions of stars the planets that make up the universe and our solar system the author argues it is not possible for the universe to have come about by accident or as a result of an accidental big bang then considering our marvelous bodies the massive number of other species on this earth the beauty of the flora and fauna and the tremendous resources available to us he demonstrates that it is not probable or possible for all that exists to have evolved over millions of years or come about without a design or a designer the author points out to say that we evolved is an insult to our god given human ability to reason and to our intellectual capacity to logically evaluate the truth finally considering the harmonious nature of the universe the author further demonstrates that it is not logical to believe that the trillions upon trillions of objects being propelled through space at such incredible speeds could have accidentally fallen into such a harmonious and orchestrated relationship to each other absent these objects having been purposely put into a predetermined perpetual path in our incredible universe by an intelligent designer logic would suggest that the universe would be in complete chaos without a design

churchgoing may be falling in the western world but intellectually at least christianity is experiencing something of a re birth in this text the author lays out in layman s terms the primary arguments for the existence and nature of god he considers the problem of evil and then sets out the various positive arguments in favour of god s existence the moral argument the cosmological argument the argument from design and then more personal arguments such as common consent authority and religious experience he concludes by providing a summary of the kind of god to whom these arguments point

this is a clear and original investigation of god s nature and existence first of all it considers two of god s traditional properties being all knowing and being all powerful it argues he cannot possess these properties but it argues this is in accord with him being worthy of worship secondly it introduces the notion of evil being overridden it argues he has to bring about other free living things and it is plausible they have to be liable to experience evil due to their conditions but it argues the evil in this world is overridden thirdly it considers the principal arguments for the claim he does not exist they refer to the evil in the world it argues

they do not establish sufficient grounds for this claim finally it considers some well known arguments for the claim he exists it argues they face difficulties it sets out other arguments eg some arguments to increase any degree of belief one has that god can exist it includes a number of appendices god s sovereignty are there sufficient grounds for the claim that very probably god does not exist theodicy and some theodicies it covers as a whole the principal parts of the philosophy of religion it unifies these parts to a significant degree it proceeds regularly by way of formal and clear arguments it will be of interest to advanced students and specialists in philosophy religious studies and theology given its explanation of key terms its jargon free language its clarity and brevity it will be of interest to others too
