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paradoxes have become characteristic of the world we live in poverty and privilege empire and oppression migration and enclaves seeking war and peace justice and injustice reconciliation and revenge during the 2016 *societas homiletica* annual conference held in south africa these paradoxes served as a rediscovery of the calling of preachers to deliver the promise that lies within life's contradictions a divine promise brought forth by the grace of god and the gospel of christ embodied in and through us by the spirit of christ this promise may take many forms and calls for discernment and often interrupts the status quos in surprising shocking ways it is a promise that interrupts in order to comfort

nothing defines california and our nation's heritage as significantly or emotionally says the california mission foundation as do the twenty one missions that were founded along the coast from san diego to sonoma indeed the missions collectively represent the state's most iconic tourist destinations and are touchstones for interpreting its history elementary school students today still make model missions evoking the romanticized versions of the 1930s does it occur to them or to the tourists that the missions have a dark history california mission landscapes is an unprecedented and fascinating history of california mission landscapes from colonial outposts to their reinvention as heritage sites through the late nineteenth and twentieth centuries illuminating the deeply political nature of this transformation elizabeth kryder reid argues that the designed landscapes have long recast the missions from sites of colonial oppression to aestheticized and nostalgia drenched monasteries she investigates how such landscapes have been appropriated in social and political power struggles particularly in the perpetuation of social inequalities across boundaries of gender race class ethnicity and religion california mission landscapes demonstrates how the gardens planted in mission courtyards over the past 150 years are not merely anachronistic but have become potent ideological spaces the transformation of these sites of conquest into physical and metaphoric gardens has reinforced the marginalization of indigenous agency and diminished the contemporary consequences of colonialism and yet importantly this book also points to the potential to create very different visitor experiences than these landscapes currently do despite the wealth of scholarship on california history until now no book has explored the mission landscapes as an avenue into understanding the politics of the past tracing the continuum between the spanish colonial period emerging american nationalism and the contemporary heritage industry

the enclosed garden or *hortus conclusus* is a place where architecture and landscape come together it has a long and varied history ranging from the early paradise garden and cloister the botanic garden and *giardini segreto* the kitchen garden and as a stage for social display the enclosed garden has continued to develop into its many modern forms the city retreat the redemptive garden the deconstructed building as awareness of climate change becomes increasingly important the enclosed garden which can mediate so effectively between interior and exterior provides opportunities for sustainable design and closer contact with the natural landscape by its nature it is ambiguous is it an outdoor room or captured landscape is it architecture or garden kate baker discusses the continuing relevance of the typology of the enclosed garden to contemporary architects by exploring influential historical examples and the concepts they generate alongside some of the best of contemporary designs brought to life with vivid photography and detailed drawings taken primarily from britain the mediterranean japan and north and south america she argues that understanding the potential of the enclosed garden requires us to think of it as both a design and an experience captured landscape provides a broad range of information and design possibilities for students of architectural and landscape design practising architects landscape designers and horticulturalists and will also appeal to a wider audience of all those who are interested in garden design this second edition of *captured landscape* is enriched with new case studies throughout the book the scope has now been broadened to include an entirely new chapter concerning the urban condition with detailed discussions on issues of ecology sustainability economy of means well being and the social pressures of contemporary city life

landscape and history explores a complex relationship over the past five centuries the book is international and interdisciplinary in scope drawing on material from social economic and cultural history as well as from geography archaeology cultural geography planning and landscape history in recent years as the author points out there has been increasing interest in and concern for many aspects of landscape within british european and wider contexts this has included the study of the history development and changes in our perception of landscape as well as research into the links between past landscapes and political ideologies economic and social structures cartography art and literature there is also considerable concern at present with the need to evaluate and classify historic landscapes and to develop policies for their conservation and management in relation to their

scenic heritage and recreational value this is manifest not only in the designation of particularly valued areas with enhanced protection from planning developments such as national parks and world heritage sites but in the countryside more generally further ian d whyte argues changes in european union policies relating to agriculture with a greater concern for the protection and sustainable management of rural landscapes are likely to be of major importance in relation to the themes of continuity and change in the landscapes of britain and europe

routes and roads make their way into and across the landscape defining it as landscape and making it accessible for many kinds of uses and perceptions bringing together outstanding scholars from cultural history geography philosophy and a host of other disciplines this collection examines the complex entanglement between routes and landscapes it traces the changing conceptions of the landscape from the enlightenment to the present day looking at how movement has been facilitated imagined and represented and how such movement in turn has conditioned understandings of the landscape a particular focus is on the modern transportation landscape as it came into being with the canal the railway and the automobile these modes of transport have had a profound impact on the perception and conceptualization of the modern landscape a relationship investigated in detail by authors such as Gernot Böhme Sarah Bonnemaïson Tim Cresswell Finola O Kane Charlotte Klöckner Peter Merriman Christine Macy David Nye Vittoria Di Palma Charles Withers and Thomas Zeller

this volume continues the recent trend towards expanding definitions of war experience through considering a range of different landscapes and voices not all landscapes were comprised of trenches and barbed wire voices supporting or dissenting were many and varied collectively they combine to offer fresh insights into the multiplicity of war experience alternate spaces to the familiar tropes of mud and mayhem

in the tradition of Kathleen Norris Terry Tempest Williams and Thomas Merton *The Solace of Fierce Landscapes* explores the impulse that has drawn seekers into the wilderness for centuries and offers eloquent testimony to the healing power of mountain silence and desert indifference interweaving a memoir of his mother's long struggle with Alzheimer's and cancer meditations on his own wilderness experience and illuminating commentary on the Christian *via negativa* a mystical tradition that seeks God in the silence beyond language Lane rejects the easy affirmations of pop spirituality for the harsher but more profound truths that wilderness can teach us there is an unaccountable solace that fierce landscapes offer to the soul they heal as well as mirror the brokenness we find within it is this apparent paradox that lies at the heart of this remarkable book that inhuman landscapes should be the source of spiritual comfort Lane shows that the very indifference of the wilderness can release us from the

demands of the endlessly anxious ego teach us to ignore the inessential in our own lives and enable us to transcend the false self that is ever obsessed with managing impressions drawing upon the wisdom of st john of the cross meister eckhardt simone weil edward abbey and many other christian and non christian writers lane also demonstrates how those of us cut off from the wilderness might make some desert in our lives written with vivid intelligence narrative ease and a gracefulness that is itself a comfort the solace of fierce landscapes gives us not only a description but a performance of an ancient and increasingly relevant spiritual tradition

presents literary criticism on the works of twentieth century writers of all genres nations and cultures critical essays are selected from leading sources including published journals magazines books reviews diaries interviews radio and television transcripts pamphlets and scholarly papers

the middle east is well known for its historic gardens that have developed over more than two millennia the role of urban landscape projects in middle eastern cities has grown in prominence with a gradual shift in emphasis from gardens for the private sphere to an increasingly public function the contemporary landscape projects either designed as public plazas or public parks have played a significant role in transferring the modern middle eastern cities to a new era and also in transforming to a newly shaped social culture in which the public has a voice this book considers what ties these projects to their historical context and what regional and local elements and concepts have been used in their design

between 1660 and 1820 great britain experienced significant structural transformations in class politics economy print and writing that produced new and varied spaces and with them new and reconfigured concepts of gender in mapping the relationship between gender and space in british literature of the period this collection defines charts and explores new cartographies both geographic and figurative the contributors take up a variety of genres and discursive frameworks from this period including poetry the early novel letters and laboratory notebooks written by authors ranging from aphra behn hortense mancini and isaac newton to frances burney and germaine de sta [?] l arranged in three groups inside outside and borderlands the essays conduct targeted literary analysis and explore the changing relationship between gender and different kinds of spaces in the long eighteenth century in addition a set of essays on charlotte smith s novels and a set of essays on natural philosophy offer case studies for exploring issues of gender and space within larger fields such as an author s oeuvre or a particular discourse taken together the essays demonstrate space s agency as a complement to historical change as they explore how literature delineates the gendered redefinition occupation negotiation inscription and creation of new spaces crucially contributing to the construction of new cartographies in eighteenth and early nineteenth century england

enclosure marshals bold new and persuasive arguments about the ongoing dispossession of palestinians revealing the israel palestine landscape primarily as one of enclosure geographer gary fields sheds fresh light on israel s actions he places those actions in historical context in a broad analysis of power and landscapes across the modern world examining the process of land grabbing in early modern england colonial north america and contemporary palestine enclosure shows how patterns of exclusion and privatization have emerged across time and geography that the same moral legal and cartographic arguments were copied by enclosers of land in very different historical environments challenges israel s current rationale as being uniquely beleaguered it also helps readers in the united kingdom and the united states understand the israel palestine conflict in the context of their own tortured histories

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
