waste Exploring the environmental impact of packaging materials and promoting alternative solutions like recycled cardboard or compostable packaging

Misleading greenwashing Analyzing claims of ecofriendliness and ensuring they are backed by genuine sustainable practices Promoting responsible consumerism

Encouraging students to think critically about packaging and its impact on the environment

3 Cultural Sensitivity Cereal box designs can reflect cultural biases and stereotypes This presents an opportunity to discuss Representation and diversity Analyzing the portrayal of gender race and ethnicity in cereal box designs and encouraging diverse representation Cultural appropriation Exploring the use of cultural elements in designs and ensuring they are respectful and authentic Promoting inclusivity and awareness Encouraging students to be mindful of cultural nuances and sensitivity in design choices

Activity 1 Cereal Box Deconstruction 1 Brainstorm Start with a class discussion about the role of cereal boxes in marketing and advertising Ask students about their favorite cereal boxes and what makes them appealing 2 Observation Divide students into small groups and distribute different cereal boxes to each group Encourage them to closely examine the elements of the design Visuals Colors imagery characters fonts illustrations Text Brand name slogans nutritional information ingredients Layout Arrangement of elements use of space balance 3 Analysis Have each group discuss and record their observations about the design elements and how they relate to the target audience 4 Presentation Each group presents their findings to the class highlighting the strengths and weaknesses of each cereal box design

Activity 2 Design Your Own Cereal Box 1 Brainstorming As a class discuss the following Target audience Who is this cereal designed for Children adults specific age group healthconscious consumers Cereal concept What kind of cereal is it Flavor health benefits unique features Message What message do you want to convey Taste health fun energy etc 2 Sketching Students individually sketch their cereal box designs incorporating the elements discussed in Activity 1 3 Design Development Students can use digital tools or physical materials to create a more detailed and polished design 4 Presentation Students present their designs to the class explaining their choices and how they align with their target audience and message

Activity 3 Ethical Considerations 1 Discussion Engage students in a class discussion about the ethical implications of cereal box design focusing on Targeting Children Discuss the potential for exploitation and manipulative marketing strategies aimed at children Environmental Impact Explore the environmental impact of packaging materials and 4 promote sustainable solutions Cultural Sensitivity Analyze the portrayal of diverse groups in cereal box designs and promote inclusivity and awareness 2 Reflection Encourage students to reflect on their own design choices and consider how they could be more ethical and responsible 3 Action Plan Brainstorm ideas for promoting positive change in the cereal industry such as supporting sustainable brands or advocating for more ethical marketing practices

Assessment Participation Observe student engagement in discussions and group activities Design Process Evaluate students ability to analyze interpret and apply design
