excellence routman identifies 10 key factors that describe an excellent teacher ranging from intellectual curiosity to creativity and explains how carrying yourself as a role model contributes to an inclusive caring empathic and fair classroom she also stresses the importance for school leaders to make job embedded professional development a top priority dismantling unequal education the huge gap in the quality of education in high vs low income communities is the civil rights issue of the 21st century according to routman she spells out specific actions educators can take to create more equitable schools and classrooms such as diversifying texts used in curriculums and ensuring all students have access to opportunities to discuss reflect and engage with important ideas from the author i wrote literacy essentials because i saw a need to simplify teaching raise expectations and make expert teaching possible for all of us i saw a need to emphasize how a school culture of kindness trust respect and curiosity is essential to any lasting achievement i saw a need to demonstrate and discuss how and why the beliefs actions knowledge we hold determine the potential for many of our students equal opportunity to learn depends on a culture of engagement and equity which under lies a relentless pursuit of excellence

first published in 2001 the purpose of this curriculum guide is to help student teachers and newly qualified teachers to make a start on learning how to become competent teachers of english despite the emphasis given in training courses to the teaching of english newly qualified teachers often feel underprepared for it and frequently mention their concerns about this these

concerns can be partly explained by a general lack of confidence in this key area and partly by widespread media and political criticism of the teaching of literacy it is also because it is often difficult for a student to make the connection between observation of key teaching strategies and his or her own personal practice

transforming early learners into superb readers promoting literacy at school at home and within the community aids elementary educators reading specialists school administrators private and public educators parents and caregivers who want to help early learners become proficient readers the early years are the most important for children because they are the formative years so it is vital for children to build a solid reading foundation when they are most receptive andrea nelson royes contends that if all these individual players collectively help to develop a child's reading readiness all children may thrive from a high quality education and a love of literacy

every elementary teacher deals with students who struggle as readers on a daily basis each struggling child is complex and each has a unique history as a learner in one child at a time experienced literacy specialist and consultant pat johnson provides a framework she has used in numerous k 6 classrooms to help teachers understand and assist individual children the four step process outlined in the book enables teachers to focus carefully on specific strategies and behaviors analyze them with theoretical and practical lenses design targeted instruction in keeping with current research on reading process and then assess and refine the teaching in conferences with the child the framework is by no means an easy answer to a difficult problem but

through its use teachers learn how the reading process works for proficient readers and how to support struggling readers as they construct their own reading process the text is packed with examples of actual conferences with students detailing how and when pat and her colleagues intervene to instruct and assess the examples of follow up assessment and analysis of struggling readers over days and weeks provide an indispensable model for teachers pat shows how to use this framework successfully with a range of learners including young children english language learners and students in the upper elementary grades who are stalled in their literacy progress she builds upon her decades of work as a classroom teacher literacy specialist and consultant in schools with high poverty and diversity to demonstrate how this framework can be useful in any setting

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
