the present work is an attempt to analyse critically plato s views on mind and body and more particularly on the mind body relationship within the wider setting of plato s metaphysics we seek to achieve this by a philosophical examination of the dialogues on the basis of a generally accepted order some revision of this order is a by product of our examination strictly speaking soul ought perhaps to be substituted for mind in the above but it seems to be in terms of mind that modern philosophers deal with and refer to the problem that plato tackled mainly in terms of psyche and as it is part of the motivation for dealing with plato s treatment that it is of importance for the modern debate it has been felt necessary to stress the rough identity of the problem in the title of the book and in the introduction in the title of part three and a few other places below this superordinate level we try to keep mind as a translation typically of nous and soul as a translation of psyche

thomas aquinas 1224 6 1274 lived an active demanding academic and ecclesiastical life that ended while he was still comparatively young he nonetheless produced many works varying in length from a few pages to a few volumes the present book is an introduction to this influential author and a guide to his thought on almost all the major topics on which he wrote the book begins with an account of aquinas s life and works the next section contains a series of essays that set aquinas in his intellectual context they focus on the philosophical sources that are likely to have influenced his thinking the most prominent of which were certain greek philosophers chiefly aristotle latin christian writers such as augustine and jewish and islamic authors such as maimonides and avicenna the subsequent sections of the book address topics that aguinas himself discussed these include metaphysics the existence and nature of god ethics and action theory epistemology philosophy of mind and human nature the nature of language and an array of theological topics including trinity incarnation sacraments resurrection and the problem of evil among others these sections include more than thirty contributions on topics central to aguinas s own worldview the final sections of the volume address the development of aquinas s thought and its historical influence any attempt to present the views of a philosopher in an earlier historical period that is meant to foster reflection on that thinker s views needs to be both historically faithful and also philosophically engaged the present book combines both exposition and evaluation insofar as its contributors have space to engage in both this handbook is therefore meant to be useful to someone wanting to learn about aguinas s philosophy and theology while also looking for help in philosophical interaction with it

the idea that some parts of reality are fundamental and others derivative was an important one in aristotle s philosophical system and is now again of great current interest in philosophy michail peramatzis presents a new account of priority relations in aristotle s metaphysics and draws out their continuing philosophical significance

there is an historical element throughout philosophy as edel notes this is always in the

context of problems so emphasis will fall on the major objective of reflective analysis of ideas the major objective of edel s analysis in the theory and practice of philosophy is the fundamental interrelatedness of problems of method metaphysics and value each part is an integral whole complete in itself that philosophy has this central role in human practice indicates that it should be neither discarded nor deified this is the explicit premise of the book students are likely to be faced increasingly with a demand for clarification on the fundamental issues of life and value the expectation that philosophy will provide ready made answers to these kinds of questions is as naive as the demand for any panacea but this task cannot be turned over to any other department of human knowledge or any other branch of social activity by placing emphasis on the importance of theory in matters of practice the need for clear and systematic understanding of the world and man within it and on the constant role of reflection in the management of human affairs edel seeks to shed light on the larger questions of philosophy by examining them in a systematic way the result is a great text and tool for students and teachers that deals directly with the fundamental issues of our civilization

first published in 1999 we are fortunate in possessing a fascinating document the life of plotinus written by the philosopher porphyry a pupil and associate of plotinus for the last eight years of his life the basic facts contained in this life can be quickly recounted plotinus was likely a greek born in egypt in ad 205 it is possible though that he came from a hellenized egyptian or roman family in his 28th year plotinus discovered in himself a thirst for philosophy this is a collection of his works ennead i contains treatises on what porphyry calls ethical matters enneads ii iii contain treatises on natural philosophy or cosmology with some rationalizations for the inclusion of iii 4 5 7 and 8 ennead iv concerns the soul v intellect or and vi being numbers and the one the thematic unity of enneads i iv and v is somewhat greater than the rest
