and relative power of judges and prosecutors the severity of punishment for drug offenders and white collar offenders the abuse of prisoners and the enforcement of prisoner rights and repeat offending by released prisoners readers will better understand the challenges that come with a high incarceration rate such as the management of mental illness in the criminal justice system the management of sex offenders and the impact of parental incarceration on children looking ahead this timely resource also considers prospects for reducing current incarceration levels the availability and effectiveness of alternatives to incarceration and the future of capital punishment

this book brings together various discourses concerned with violence and punishment paying special attention to the extreme variations of these phenomena starting from a narrow definition of violence as an infliction of physical harm paired with a broad discussion of its causes and a wide definition of punishment as an authority claim to retribution or reform the book maps and interprets political theoretical discourses on the death penalty historical explanations of the changes of violence and punishment and comparative differences in punishment it also puts violence and punishment into perspective with political power world religions literature and film and criminological theory the final chapter changes the perspective taken in the bulk of the book dealing with discourses of theodicy in the face of cases of extreme violence and suffering by juxtaposing many unusual discourses the book attempts to fulfill three primary functions first it skeptically probes numerous discourses explaining and legitimizing violence and punishment in the light of extreme cases the book is a map of violence and punishment second it invites the reader to confront choose and combine these discourses when thinking about facts and norms of punishment the book provides an analytical toolbox for research of violence and punishment third the book presents wider sense seeking strategies employed to deal with suffering such as irony redemption or rationalization

reward and punishment in human learning elements of a behavior theory provides a different approach to the study of reward and punishment emphasizing what is learned when a response is rewarded and how does this differ from what is learned when a response is punished this book discusses the distortions in impressions of success accuracy in recall of reward and punishment and determinants of outcome recall the role of open task attitudes in motor learning effects of isolated punishments and structural isolation in the closed task situation are also elaborated this publication is intended for psychologists but is also helpful to teachers executives prison officials psychotherapists and parents

this volume provides an abundance of information on the history of capital punishment and ongoing opposition to it author bruce e r thompson includes narratives on well known figures on both sides of the issue various methods of execution are explained and their use placed in historical context legal terminology important to the debate is defined and explained

capital punishment is one of the more controversial subjects in the social sciences especially in criminal justice and criminology over the last decade or so the united states has experienced a significant decline in the number of death sentences and executions since

2007 eight states have abolished capital punishment bringing the total number of states without the death penalty to 19 plus the district of columbia and more are likely to follow suit in the near future nebraska reinstated its death penalty in 2016 worldwide 70 percent of countries have abolished capital punishment in law or in practice the current trend suggests the eventual demise of capital punishment in all but a few recalcitrant states and countries within this context a fresh look at capital punishment in the united states and worldwide is warranted the routledge handbook on capital punishment comprehensively examines the topic of capital punishment from a wide variety of perspectives a thoughtful introductory chapter from experts bohm and lee presents a contextual framework for the subject matter and chapters present state of the art analyses of a range of aspects of capital punishment grouped into five sections 1 capital punishment history opinion and culture 2 capital punishment rationales and religious views 3 capital punishment and constitutional issues 4 the death penalty s administration and 5 the death penalty s consequences this is a key collection for students taking courses in prisons penology criminal justice criminology and related subjects and is also an essential reference for academics and practitioners working in prison service or in related agencies

in the wake of american independence it was clear that the new united states required novel political forms less obvious but no less revolutionary was the idea that the american people needed a new understanding of the self sensibility was a cultural movement that celebrated the human capacity for sympathy and sensitivity to the world for individuals it offered a means of self transformation for a nation lacking a monarch state religion or standing army sensibility provided a means of cohesion national independence and social interdependence facilitated one another what sarah knott calls the sentimental project helped a new kind of citizen create a new kind of government knott paints sensibility as a political project whose fortunes rose and fell with the broader tides of the revolutionary atlantic world moving beyond traditional accounts of social unrest republican and liberal ideology and the rise of the autonomous individual she offers an original interpretation of the american revolution as a transformation of self and society

in the insidious momentum of american mass incarceration provides a comprehensive understanding of when how and why the united states became the world leader in incarceration to further propose a range of strategies that can reduce prison population and promote rational policies of criminal punishment zimring argues that the most powerful enemy to reducing excess incarceration are simply the mundane features of state and local government such as elections of prosecutors and state support for prison budgets

punishment occupies a central place in our lives and attitudes we suffer a profound ambivalence about its moral consequences persons who have been punished or are liable to be punished have long objected to the legitimacy of punishment we are all objects of punishment yet we are also its users our ambivalence is so profound that not only do we punish others but we punish ourselves as well we view those who submit too willingly to punishment as obedient verging on the groveling coward and we view those who resist punishment as disobedient rebels in the punishment response graeme newman describes the uses of punishment and how these uses change over time some argue that punishment

promotes discrimination and divisiveness in society others claim that it is through punishment that order and legitimacy are upheld it is important that punishment is understood as neither one nor the other it is both this point simple though it seems has never really been addressed this is why newman claims we wax and wane in our uses of punishment why punishing institutions are clogged by bureaucracy why the death penalty comes and goes like the tide graeme newman emphasizes that punishment is a cultural process and also a mechanism of particular institutions of which criminal law is but one because academic discussions of punishment have been confined to legalistic preoccupations much of the policy and justification of punishment have been based on discussions of extreme cases the use of punishment in the sphere of crime is an extreme unto itself since crime is a minor aspect of daily life the uses of punishment and the moral justifications for punishment within the family and school have rarely been considered certainly not to the exhaustive extent that criminal law has been in this outstanding work

the united states military is often presented as a model of equal opportunity employment in this work the author examines and challenges this assertion with respect to the navy dunklin studies navy claims of meritocracy and training processes profiles the careers of eight senior enlisted african american servicemen and examines barriers to african american inclusion first hand accounts and interviews provide insight into the coping mechanisms and struggles of african americans in the navy the author concludes by offering suggestions to improve the navy equal opportunity environment

one of the most important problems faced by the united states is addressing its broken criminal justice system this collection of essays offers a thorough examination of incarceration as a form of punishment in addition to focusing on the philosophical aspects related to punishment the volume s diverse group of contributors provides additional background in criminology economics law and sociology to help contextualize the philosophical issues the first group of essays addresses whether or not our current institutions connected with punishment and incarceration are justified in a liberal society the next set of chapters explores the negative effects of incarceration as a form of punishment including its impact on children and families the volume then describes how we arrived at our current situation in the united states focusing on questions related to how we view prisons and prisoners policing for profit and the motivations of prosecutors in trying to secure convictions finally rethinking punishment in the era of mass incarceration examines specific policy alternatives that might offer solutions to our current approach to punishment and incarceration

research on prisons prior to the prison boom of the 1980s and 1990s focused mainly on inmate subcultures inmate rights and sociological interpretations of inmate and guard adaptations to their environment with qualitative studies and ethnographic methods the norm in recent years research has expanded considerably to issues related to inmates mental health suicide managing special types of offenders risk assessment and evidence based treatment programs the oxford handbook of prisons and imprisonment provides the only single source that bridges social scientific and behavioral perspectives providing graduate students with a more comprehensive understanding of the topic academics with a

body of knowledge that will more effectively inform their own research and practitioners with an overview of evidence based best practices across thirty chapters leading contributors offer new ideas critical treatments of substantive topics with theoretical and policy implications and comprehensive literature reviews that reflect cumulative knowledge on what works and what doesn't the handbook covers critical topics in the field some of which include recent trends in imprisonment prison gangs inmate victimization the use and impact of restrictive housing unique problems faced by women in prison special offender populations risk assessment and treatment effectiveness prisoner re entry and privatization the oxford handbook of prisons and imprisonment offers a rich source of information on the current state of institutional corrections around the world on issues facing both inmates and prison staff and on how those issues may impede or facilitate the various goals of incarceration

campaigns against corporal punishment explores the theory and practice of punishment in antebellum america from a broad comparative perspective it probes the concerns underlying the naval prison domestic and educational reform campaigns which occurred in new england and new york from the late 1820s to the late 1850s focusing on the common forms of physical punishment inflicted on seamen prisoners women and children the book reveals the effect of these campaigns on actual disciplinary practices myra c glenn also places the crusade against corporal punishment in the context of various other contemporary reform movements such as the crusade against intemperance and that against slavery she shows how regional and political differences affected discussions of punishment and discipline

more than 30 years after the us supreme court reinstated the death penalty it is still plagued with egregious problems issues of wrongful conviction inhumane practices and its efficacy as a deterrent are hotly debated topics as of august 2007 two thirds of the worlds countries have abolished the death penalty today the us falls alongside i
