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this outstanding anthology traces major critical statements from classic theorists like plato to the contemporary this standard historical textbook in the field focuses on important individual thinkers and not particular schools of thought or isms current selections bring the anthology into contemporary times and show students how critical theory has evolved and progressed over time

contemporary cultural studies have marginalized agency namely the power of people to

shape social life here stephen tumino offers a new materialist challenge to these tendencies and articulates an internationalist cultural theory that puts global agency in the forefront of cultural analysis

this book addresses the function and status of the visual and verbal image as it relates to social political and ideological issues the authors first articulate some of the lost connections between image and ideology then locate their argument within the modernist postmodernist debates the book addresses the multiple trans disciplinary problems arising from the ways cultures authors and texts mobilize particular images in order to confront conceal work through or resolve contradictory ideological conditions

this ambitious work provides a systematic study of chinese theories of reading and writing in intellectual thought and critical practice the author maintains that there are two major hermeneutic traditions in chinese literature the politico moralistic mainstream and the metaphysico aesthetical undercurrent in exploring the interaction between the two ming dong gu finds a movement toward interpretive openness in this the chinese practice anticipates modern and western theories of interpretation especially literary openness and open poetics classic chinese works are examined including the zhouyi the i ching or book of changes the shijing the book of songs or book of poetry and selected poetry along with the philosophical background of the hermeneutic theories ultimately gu relates the chinese practices of reading to western hermeneutics offering a cross cultural conceptual model for the comparative study of reading and writing in general

not too long ago literary theorists were writing about the death of the novel and the death of the author today many are talking about the death of theory theory as the many theoretical isms among them postcolonialism postmodernism and new historicism are now known once seemed so exciting but has become ossified and insular this iconoclastic collection is an excellent companion to current anthologies of literary theory which have embraced an uncritical stance toward theory and its practitioners written by nearly fifty prominent scholars the essays in theory's empire question the ideas catchphrases and excesses that have let theory congeal into a predictable orthodoxy more than just a critique however this collection provides readers with effective tools to redeem the study of literature restore reason to our intellectual life and redefine the role and place of theory in the academy

this book redefines the nature of textual difficulty in literature and shows the implications of the new definition for teachers at all levels of education contrary to the traditional use of grade levels or readability formulae the authors redefine difficulty in terms of readers and the texts they meet they base their arguments on contemporary linguistic theory on historical and comparative studies of criticism on literary theory about readers and texts on post freudian psychology on empirical research concerning the nature of reading literature and on studies of classrooms curricula and testing what emerges is a coherent work that builds a case for seeing difficulty in literature as a human phenomenon more than a textual one

this book begins with a reflection on dichotomies in comparative studies of chinese and western literature and aesthetics critiquing an oppositional paradigm ming dong gu argues that despite linguistic and cultural differences the two traditions share much common ground in critical theory aesthetic thought metaphysical conception and reasoning focusing on issues of language writing and linguistics metaphor metonymy and

poetics mimesis and representation and lyricism expressionism creativity and aesthetics gu demonstrates that though ways of conception and modes of expression may differ the two traditions have cultivated similar aesthetic feelings and critical ideas capable of fusing critical and aesthetic horizons with a two way dialogue this book covers a broad spectrum of critical discourses and uncovers fascinating connections among a wide range of thinkers theorists scholars and aestheticians thereby making a significant contribution to bridging the aesthetic divide and envisioning world theory and global aesthetics

in modernism the morning after bob perelman scrutinizes a number of long held modernist dogmas in order to articulate a more capacious model for thinking about modernism past present and future throughout his career perelman has focused on the persistence of modernist ambition in poetry with all of its admirable articulations and tragicomic short circuits poetry it turns out is not simply news that stays news as ezra pound postulated instead as perelman demonstrates poetry often gropes toward whatever news can be found in the broader contexts of public speech the cultural commons the almost real or much too real language of people and our hyperactive media book jacket

this work is the first history and evaluation of contemporary american critical theory within its european philosophical contexts in the first part frank lentricchia analyzes the impact on our critical thought of frye stevens kermode sartre poulet heidegger sussure barthes lévi strauss derrida and foucault among other less central figures in a second part lentricchia turns to four exemplary theorists on the american scene murray kriege r e d hirsch jr paul de man and harold bloom and an analysis of their careers within the lineage established in part one lentricchia s critical intention is in evidence in his sustained attack on the more or less hidden formalist premises inherited from the new critical fathers even in the name of historical consciousness he contends contemporary theorists have often cut literature off from social and temporal processes by so doing he believes that they have deprived literature of its relevant values and turned the teaching of both literature and theory into a rarefied activity all along the way with the help of such diverse thinkers as saussure barthes foucault derrida and bloom lentricchia indicates a strategy by which future critical theorists may resist the mandarin attitudes of their fathers

class acts examines two often neglected aspects of jacques derrida s work as a philosopher his public presentations at lectures and conferences and his teaching along with the question of the speech act that links them what michael naas asks is one doing when one speaks in public in these ways the book follows derrida s itinerary with regard to speech act theory across three public lectures from 1971 to 1997 all given for reasons the book seeks to explain in montreal in these lectures derrida elaborated his critique of j l austin and his own subsequent redefinition of speech act theory the book then gives an

overview of derrida s teaching career and his famous seminar presentations along with his own explicit reflections on pedagogy and educational institutions beginning in the mid 1970s naas then shows through a reading of three recently published seminars on life death theory and practice and forgiveness just how derrida the teacher interrogated and deployed speech act theory in his seminars whether in a conference hall or a classroom naas demonstrates derrida was always interested in the way spoken or written words might do more than simply communicate some meaning or intent but might give rise to something like an event class acts bears witness to the possibility of such events in derrida s work as a pedagogue and a public intellectual

representations of violence are often said to generate cathartic effects but what does catharsis mean and what theory of the unconscious made this concept so popular that it reaches from classical antiquity to the digital age in violence and the oedipal unconscious nidesh lawtoo reframes current debates on new media violence by tracing the philosophical aesthetic and historical vicissitudes of the catharsis hypothesis from antiquity to modernity and into the present drawing on theorists of mimesis from aristotle to nietzsche bernays to breuer freud to girard to morin lawtoo offers a genealogy of the relationship between violence and the unconscious with at least two aims first this study gives an account of the birth of the oedipal unconscious out of a cathartic method second it provides new theoretical foundations to solve a riddle of new media violence that may no longer rest on oedipal solutions in the process lawtoo outlines a new theory of violence mimesis and the unconscious that does not have desire as a via regia but rather the untimely realization that all affects spread contagiously and thus mimetically

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
