for more than fifty years robert morgan has brought to life the landscape history and culture of the southern appalachia of his youth in 30 acclaimed volumes including poetry short story collections novels and nonfiction prose he has celebrated an often marginalized region his many honors include four nea fellowships a guggenheim fellowship and an award from the american academy of arts and letters as well as television appearances the best american poetry new stories from the south prize stories the o henry awards this first book on morgan collects appreciations and analyses by some of his most dedicated readers including fellow poets authors critics and scholars an unpublished interview with him is included along with an essay by him on the importance of sense of place and a bibliography of publications by and about him

and of course one poem about texas that is magnificent in its awfulness lasca with memorable lines like scratches don t count in texas down by the rio grande

in the last fifty years irish poets have produced some of the most exciting poetry in contemporary literature writing about love and sexuality violence and history country and city this book provides a unique introduction to major figures such as seamus heaney but also introduces the reader to significant precursors like louis macneice or patrick kavanagh and vital contemporaries and successors among others thomas kinsella paul muldoon and nuala ni dhomhnaill readers will find discussions of irish poetry from the traditional to the modernist written in irish as well as english from both north and south this companion the only book of its kind on the market provides cultural and historical background to contemporary irish poetry in the contexts of modern ireland but also in the broad currents of modern world literature it includes a chronology and guide to further reading and will prove invaluable to students and teachers alike

31 short stories and 108 poems represent a literary history of english writing in the philippines from the turn of the century to the present

a groundbreaking collection explores contemporary american poetry s relation to social critique and the public sphere

this impressive volume provides over 1 700 biographical entries on poets writing in english from 1910 to the present day including t s eliot dylan thomas and carol ann duffy authoritative and accessible it is a must have for students of english and creative writing as well as for anyone with an interest in poetry

this newly revised edition contains the most up to date versions of poems from david s first five volumes of poetry songs for coming home where many rivers meet fire in the earth the house of belonging and everything is waiting for you as well as the latest versions of the new poems that originally appeared in the first edition of river flow

czesław miłosz 1911 2004 felt that part of his role as a poet and critic was to bear witness to bloodshed and terror as well as to beauty he survived the soviet invasion of his beloved lithuania escaped to nazi occupied warsaw where he joined the socialist resistance then witnessed the holocaust and the razing of the warsaw ghetto after persecution and censorship triggered his defection in 1951 he found not relief but the anguish of solitude and obscurity in the years of loneliness and labor miłosz continued

writing poems and essays learning to love his privacy and preoccupations and enjoying the devotion of his students at the university of california berkeley international fame came like lightning when miłosz won the 1980 nobel prize for literature czesław miłosz conversations collects pieces from a wide range of sources over twenty five years and includes an unpublished interview between miłosz and his friend and fellow nobel laureate poet joseph brodsky this volume acquaints us with a man whose work life and thought defy easy characterization he is a sensualist with a scholar's penchant for history as likely to celebrate heraclitus as the hooks on a woman's corset he is a devout but doubting catholic and a thinker tinged with a heretical sensibility cynthia l haven is a literary critic for the san francisco chronicle and a regular contributor to the washington post book world the times literary supplement and the los angeles times book review her work also has been published in civilization the georgia review the kenyon review and the cortland review

when gary snyder's long poem mountains and rivers without end was published in 1996 it was hailed as a masterpiece of american poetry anthony hunt offers a detailed historical and explicative analysis of this complex work using among his many sources snyder's personal papers letters and interviews hunt traces the work's origins as well as some of the sources of its themes and structure including nō drama east asian landscape painting the rhythms of storytelling chant and song jungian archetypal psychology world mythology buddhist philosophy and ritual native american traditions and planetary geology hydrology and ecology his analysis addresses the poem not merely by its content but through the structure of individual lines and the arrangement of the parts examining the personal and cultural influences on snyder's work hunt's benchmark study will be rewarding reading for anyone who enjoys the contemplation of snyder's artistry and ideas and more generally for those who are intrigued by the cultural and intellectual workings of artistic composition

in the poetry of james wright the author traces wright's formal evolution and concentrates on his consistent themes the artist's role in society the artist's search for poetic and personal identities the power of poetry as fortification against the onslaughts of time and the definition of a good and humane action charting the poet's evolution from his first book the green wall to the last collections this journey elkins discusses one major book in each chapter explicating the more important poems in detail and explaining how each volume is part of a progression from youthful imitator to mature innovator wright's individual struggle taking place as it did in the last half of the 20th century in america dramatizes the central problems of the creative individual in a late industrial society who is trying to turn a life into art wright worked in the great tradition of the adamant individualists in our literary heritage and like all of his formidable ancestors he refused to trust the socialized self he found attached to his soul refused to be diminished or circumscribed

by any society's definition of himself the effect of reading and studying his complete work is the recognition that wright is a major 20th century american poet whose apparent simplicity and occasional sentimentality can obscure the complexity and maturity of his courageous confrontation with the problems of living and writhing in contemporary america

in his latest historical novel bestselling author robert morgan brings to full and vivid life the story of jonah williams who in 1850 on his eighteenth birthday flees the south carolina plantation on which he was born a slave he takes with him only a few stolen coins a knife and the clothes on his back no shoes no map no clear idea of where to head except north following a star that he prays will be his guide hiding during the day and running through the night jonah must elude the men sent to capture him and the bounty hunters out to claim the reward on his head there is one person however who once on his trail never lets him fully out of sight angel herself a slave yet with a remarkably free spirit in jonah she sees her own way to freedom and so sets out to follow him bristling with breathtaking adventure chasing the north star is deftly grounded in historical fact yet always gripping and poignant as the story follows jonah and angel through the close calls and narrow escapes of a fearsome world it is a celebration of the power of the human spirit to persevere in the face of great adversity and it is robert morgan at his considerable best

this companion covers charles wright's first two trilogies *country music* 1982 and *the world of the ten thousand things* 1990 providing biographical details information on wright's sources and influences and historical notes it pays special attention to the way that wright's poems work together and the links that are formed between them while each poem is given its own commentary the author argues that they work together in a concentrated whole to document a man's spiritual journey

the ethnically diverse scope broad chronological coverage and mix of biographical critical historical political and cultural entries make this the most useful and exciting poetry reference of its kind for students today american poetry springs up out of all walks of life its poems are maternal as well as paternal stuff'd with the stuff that is coarse and stuff'd with the stuff that is fine as walt whitman wrote adding of every hue and caste am i of every rank and religion written for high school and undergraduate students this two volume encyclopedia covers u.s. poetry from the colonial era to the present offering full treatments of hundreds of key poets of the american canon what sets this reference apart is that it also discusses events movements schools and poetic approaches placing poets in their social historical political cultural and critical contexts and showing how their works mirror the eras in which they were written readers will learn about surrealism ekphrastic poetry pastoral elegy the black mountain poets and language poetry there are long and rich entries on modernism and postmodernism as well as entries related to the formal and technical dimensions

of american poetry particular attention is paid to women poets and poets from various ethnic groups poets such as amiri baraka nathaniel mackey natasha trethewey and tracy smith are featured the encyclopedia also contains entries on a wide selection of latino and native american poets and substantial coverage of the avant garde and experimental movements and provides sidebars that illuminate key points

we are where we ve been and what we ve read aren t we where else do we get the experience we need to evocatively live at once a memoir a reading journal and a novel fragments of a mortal mind is a daring contemporary commonplace book donald anderson critically acclaimed author of gathering noise from my life and below freezing shows us how the disparate elements of our lives collect to construct our deepest selves and help us to make sense of it all anderson layers his personal experiences and reflections with those of others who have wrestled with inner and outer social cultural and political memories that are not as accurate as history might suggest but that each of us believe nonetheless he challenges the reader s sense of memory and fact downplaying the latter in explaining how each of us crafts our own personal histories as anderson weaves his voice among numerous other voices and ideas that rest upon other ideas we are faced with larger issues of human existence war memory trauma mortality religion fear joy ugliness and occasional beauty what we have here is a meditation on living in america we are shown how the world we consume becomes us as we metabolize it how we as humans through our own fragments of memories influences and experiences become our true selves by charting fragments of thoughts over a lifetime anderson exposes a way of thinking and perceiving the world that is refreshingly intuitive and desperately needed fragments of a mortal mind is a powerful masterpiece that closely resembles our lived experiences and is a vivid reflection of our time

a book of the year 2019 in the morning star this is a rare glimpse into the inner workings of a small ambitious press over a period of radical transformation in publishing each of carcanet s fifty years is marked by an exchange of letters handwritten typed and now emailed between an author and the editor beginning in 1969 with the response to an invitation to subscribe to carcanet for two guineas the book traces carcanet s progress and offers insight into the nature of literary editing at its heart is the personal relationship of author and editor publisher the conflicts friendships and vicissitudes that occur at the nexus between the work its creator publisher and reader poets are central but fiction writers translators biographers and critics also contribute to the carcanet ferment and firmament fifty fifty celebrates the writers readers and editor s risks passions and pleasures

when in 1901 alfred nobel bequeathed to the world the funds to support the nobel prize one of his few directives for the category of

literature was that the artists selected be of idealistic tendency since its inception the prize has given a very public voice to some of the world's greatest writers and their responses to the honor their acceptance speeches have themselves often been epochal within each author's body of literature from the famed call to arms by William Faulkner to the multicultural song of Derek Walcott from 1903 to Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson to 1999's Günter Grass this collection traces the ideals of the artists and the selection committee itself throughout the entirety of the 20th century interestingly writes Draugsvold none of the writers discuss the more technical aspects of their craft equally striking is the strength of the common thread of idealism found in these addresses a firm belief in humankind and the power of art in its role in the service of truth and the service of liberty as Albert Camus said in 1957 I decline to accept the end of man wrote the old man William Faulkner the speeches presented here were chosen not by subjective but rather by substantive criteria with biographical presentations and brief statements of gratitude omitted included are an introduction to each of the 28 writers chosen an excerpted copy of the speech or lecture and a bibliography of works in English the work concludes with a complete list of prize winners in literature and a bibliography of sources cited in the writer's introductions
