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a philosophical approach to analyzing human experience inclusive of theology might be regarded as a process of discovery finding the experience of existing a given and good fact thinking individuals may inquire regarding the nature and way of being and its process of changing in a continuum of form and reform in writing these informal essays and comments on contemporary interests i wanted to put some philosophical intention on it the essays are of a more theoretical nature in comparison to those of my other volumes of a philosophical approach

this book takes a philosophical approach to the question what is academic writing and specifically explores the question of how academic writing and writing development can be better understood and developed by lecturers in higher education it examines how a number of interconnected and interdisciplinary political linguistic discursive ontological and epistemological frameworks can be used to inform a post qualitative approach for research into higher education academic writing practices employing a bourdusian deluzean inspired approach using lecturers own perceptions and experiences of academic writing and treating them as part of a professional academic writing in higher education habitus the book illustrates and analyses a number of ideas and concepts through a broadly post qualitative paradigm it also offers a number of innovative academic writing and writing development practices offering an in depth discussion into how lecturers might better negotiate academic writing practices and use their own academic writing experiences to develop students writing this book will be highly relevant to academics scholars and post graduate students working in higher education

it is fine for ordinary people that have not drank the kool aid of professional cosmological atheists to consider the universe from a personal and philosophical viewpoint informed with information from reputable physicists and some perhaps less so in addition to theologians and philosophers a few physicists and evolution scientists with a legion of herd followers have taken up atheism as a consequence of scientific insight i do not share that unsupportable line of thinking herein are my recent posts related at least generally to the field of cosmology one might readily compare and contrast select ideas from theology on topics like pre destination inclusive of macro cosmic determinism with the opinions about modern physics on

pre determinism in the post newtonian era in this book i have only hit upon such subjects in passing rather than systematically

the person at the crossroads a philosophical approach brings together scholars from around the world who share a common interest in the nature and activity of the human person personhood is examined from a variety of perspectives both philosophical and theological drawing on the rich traditions of both western and eastern thought readers will find themselves on a journey through the works of past and current scholars including confucius augustine david hume immanuel kant horace bushnell maurice merleau ponty michael polanyi rudolf carnap karol wojtyla erazim kohak and many other authors who touch upon the personalist tradition and the human person this volume will be of particular interest to readers interested in the nature of the human person as well as philosophy and theology undergraduate and graduate students and professors teaching in these areas

this volume presents eleven new essays that reveal how significant nineteenth and twentieth century writers have drawn from and in some cases opposed major trends in philosophy essays in this collection deal with tennyson coleridge woolf faulkner de quincey beckett romance as a genre the state of contemporary literary theory as shaped by the writings of wittgenstein ricoeur and derrida and other topics

this collection brings together new papers addressing the philosophical challenges that the concept of a devil presents bringing philosophical rigor to treatments of the devil contributors approach the idea of the devil from a variety of philosophical traditions methodologies and styles providing a comprehensive philosophical overview that contemplates the existence nature and purpose of the devil while some papers take a classical approach to the devil drawing on biblical exegesis other contributors approach the topic of the devil from epistemological metaphysical phenomenological and ethical perspectives this volume will be relevant to researchers and scholars interested in philosophical conceptions of the devil and related areas such as philosophers of religion theologians and scholars working in philosophical theology and demonology

eleven papers collected in the volume philosophical approaches to the foundations of logic and mathematics address various aspects of the roots basic concepts and the nature of logic and mathematics

taken together these papers reveal how many serious philosophical problems lie at the foundations of logic and mathematics the topics discussed in this volume include transcending anti foundationalism and two concurrent trends of anthropological and practical understanding of the foundations of mathematics new approaches to mathematical realism the roots of logic in a genetic perspective the primacy of truth or satisfaction and the effectiveness of mathematics in terms of categorical semantics

this book provides new interpretations of heidegger s philosophical method in light of 20th century

postmodernism and 21st century speculative realism in doing so it raises important questions about philosophical method in the age of global warming and climate change vincent blok addresses topics that have yet to be extensively discussed in heidegger scholarship including heidegger s method of questioning the religious character of heidegger s philosophical method and heidegger s conceptualization of philosophical method as explorative confrontation he is also critical of heidegger s conceptuality and develops a post heideggerian concept of philosophical method which provides a new perspective on the role of willing poetry and earth interest in contemporary philosophy this earth interest turns out to be particularly important to consider and leads to critical reflections on heidegger s concept of earth the necessity of earth interest in contemporary philosophy and a post heideggerian concept of the earth heidegger s concept of philosophical method will be of interest primarily to heidegger scholars and graduate students but its discussion of philosophical method and environmental philosophy will also appeal to scholars in other disciplines and areas of philosophy

in contradistinction to the many monographs and edited volumes devoted to historical cultural or theological treatments of demonology this collection features newly written papers by philosophers and other scholars engaged specifically in philosophical argument debate and dialogue involving ideas and topics in demonology the contributors to the volume approach the subject from the perspective of the broadest areas of western philosophy namely metaphysics epistemology logic and moral philosophy the collection also features a plurality of religious cultural and theological views on the nature of demons from both eastern and western thought in addition to views that may diverge from these traditional roots philosophical approaches to demonology will be of interest to philosophers of religion theologians and scholars working in philosophical theology and demonology as well as historians cultural anthropologists and sociologists interested more broadly in the concept of demons

it has been argued that religious studies is a polymethodic discipline and that the student of religion should

be familiar with the approaches of the major disciplines concerned with understanding the nature of religion not least because the approach adopted has profound influence on the phenomena chose for investigation and the conclusions reached this book is the first textbook specifically designed for undergraduate students that provides the essential background on methods of the major relevant disciplines presenting each of the significant approaches to religion in an informed manner the book brings together experienced researchers from feminism anthropology sociology phenomenology psychology philosophy and theology it presents a consistent approach throughout with each chapter dealing with the same themes the historical development of the approach the characteristics of the approach and the surrounding issues and debates

an introduction to philosophical methods is the first book to survey the various methods that philosophers use to support their views rigorous yet accessible the book introduces and illustrates the methodological considerations that are involved in current philosophical debates where there is controversy the book presents the case for each side but highlights where the key difficulties with them lie while eminently student friendly the book makes an important contribution to the debate regarding the acceptability of the various philosophical methods and so it will also be of interest to more experienced philosophers

the human mind is the most powerful game engine but it can always use some help this book is meant for developers who want to create games that will evoke richer and more memorable gameworlds in the minds of their players we don t just enter such unforgettable gameworlds when we play first person 3d rpgs with high resolution graphics even relatively simple 2d puzzle or strategy games with 8 bit style visuals can immerse players in worlds that are beautiful terrifying mysterious or moving that are brutally realistic or delightfully whimsical indeed good video games can transport us to incredible new worlds the process by which a particular gameworld emerges is a symbiotic collaboration between developer and player the game system presents a carefully architected stream of polygons and pixels which somehow leads the player s mind to construct and explore an intricate world full of places people relationships dilemmas and quests that transcends what s actually appearing onscreen drawing on insights from ontology and philosophical aesthetics this volume provides you with conceptual frameworks and concrete tools that will enhance your ability to design games whose iconic gameworlds encourage the types of gameplay experiences you want to offer your players among other topics the book investigates the unusual ways in which a gameworld s contents can shrink or grow in players minds depending on whether the players are mentally positioned

within a game's social space cultural space built space or tactical space the manner in which players' minds spontaneously concretize the countless gaps that exist in a game and how this dynamic explains why so many players still enjoy 8-bit style games with retro pixel art the differing ways in which players experience success and failure danger and safety good and evil the future and the past the known and the unknown and engagement and retreat depending on whether a game reveals its gameworld through a 1d game environment like that of a text-based adventure 2d environment like that of a sidescroller or a grand strategy game with a top-down map view 2.5d environment like that of an isometric turn-based tactics game or 3d environment like that of a first-person shooter the powerful way in which players are able to mentally explore a gameworld simply by shifting their conscious awareness between different senses media ontological strata and constituent spaces without needing to travel through the gameworld's terrain at all necessary and optional elements of the gameworld from built areas natural landscapes laws of nature and a cosmogony to the game's player and designer and their roles in shaping the gameplay experience how to strategically employ the architectural paradigms of the cyberspatial grid maze space biomimetic net simulacral world virtual museum and protean world when architecting locales within your game in order to evoke particular kinds of emotional gameplay experiences for your players the nature of the unique sixth sense that 2d games grant to player characters and players simple techniques for helping your 2d game to feel more like a 3d game the differing kinds of immersiveness interactivity and determinacy possessed by different types of games and their implications for the gameplay experience once you've undertaken this philosophical and artistic journey you'll never look at your games or their gameworlds in quite the same way again phenomenology of the gameworld is a book by the award-winning video game designer philosopher and writer Matthew E. Gladden he has over 20 years of experience with commercial and non-commercial game development has published numerous scholarly and popular works relating to the philosophy of video game design virtual reality and neurocybernetics and has served as a video game conference keynote speaker

offers techniques for teaching dostoevsky's crime and punishment in undergraduate graduate and high school classrooms topics include ethics gender money orthodox christianity psychoanalysis social justice teaching in prison and the use of digital media and film adaptations

in wittgenstein on logic as the method of philosophy oskari kuusela examines wittgenstein's early and late philosophies of logic situating their philosophical significance in early and middle analytic philosophy with particular reference to frege russell carnap and strawson he argues that not only the early but also the later wittgenstein sought to further develop the logical philosophical approaches of his contemporaries throughout his career wittgenstein's aim was to resolve problems with and address the limitations of frege's and russell's accounts of logic and their logical methodologies so as to achieve the philosophical progress that originally motivated the logical philosophical approach by re-examining the roots and development of analytic philosophy kuusela seeks to open up covered up paths for the further development of analytic philosophy offering a novel interpretation of the philosopher he explains how wittgenstein extends logical methodology beyond calculus based logical methods and how his novel account of the status of logic enables one to do justice to the complexity and richness of language use and thought while retaining rigour and ideals of logic such as simplicity and exactness in addition this volume outlines the new kind of non-empiricist naturalism developed in wittgenstein's later work and explaining how his account of logic can be used to dissolve the long-standing methodological dispute between the ideal and ordinary language schools of analytic philosophy it is of interest to scholars researchers and advance students of philosophy interested in engaging with a number of scholarly debates
