we have at long last a real historian with real historical skills and no intra professional ax to grind all these pieces show the virtues one finds missing in nearly all of anthropological history work but stocking s extensive and critical use of archival sources tracing of real rather than merely plausible intellectual connections and contextualization of ideas and movements in terms of broader social and cultural currents stocking writes very clearly attacks important topics race and evolution the

influence of scientism the interaction between anthropology and other disciplines and is methodologically very sophisticated though his main theme is the development of racialism and of opposition to it his book bears on a range of issues very much alive in anthropology i would think no apprentice anthropologist ought to be pronounced a journeyman until he or she has absorbed what stocking has to say clifford geertz the institute for advanced study princeton

the pivotal era of reconstruction has inspired an outstanding historical literature in the half century after w e b dubois published black reconstruction in america 1935 a host of thoughtful and energetic authors helped to dismantle racist stereotypes about the aftermath of emancipation and union victory in the civil war the resolution of long running interpretive debates shifted the issues at stake in reconstruction scholarship but the topic has remained a vital venue for original exploration of the american past in reconstructions new perspectives on the postbellum united states eight rising historians survey the latest generation of work and point to promising directions for future research they show that the field is opening out to address a wider range of adjustments to the experiences and effects of civil war increased interest in cultural history now enriches understandings traditionally centered on social and political history attention to gender has joined a focus on labor as a powerful strategy for analyzing negotiations over private and public authority the contributors suggest that reconstruction historiography might further thrive by strengthening connections to such subjects as western history legal history and diplomatic history and by redefining the chronological boundaries of the postwar period the essays provide more than a variety of attractive vantage points for fresh examination of a major phase of american history by identifying the most exciting recent approaches to a theme previously studied so ably the collection illuminates the creative process in scholarly historical literature

this book reinterprets wifredo lam s work with particular attention to its political implications focusing on how these implications emerge from the artist s critical engagement with 20th century anthropology field work conducted in cuba including the witnessing of actual afro cuban religious ritual ceremonies and information collected from informants enhances the interpretive background against which we can construe the meanings of lam s art in the process claude cernuschi argues that lam hoped to fashion a new hybrid style to foster pride and dignity in the afro cuban community as well as counteract the acute racism of cuban culture

this penetrating historical study traces the rise and fall of the theory of recapitulation and its enduring influence on american education inherently ethnocentric and racist the theory of recapitulation was pervasive in the social sciences at the turn of the 20th century when early progressive educators uncritically adopted its basic tenets the theory pointed to the west as the developmental endpoint of history and depicted people of color as ontologically less developed than their white counterparts building on cutting edge scholarship this is the first major study to trace the racial worldviews of key progressive thinkers such as colonel francis w parker

john dewey charles judd william bagley and many others chapter summaries roots traces the intellectual context from which the new child centered education emerged recapitulation explains how racially segregated schools were justified and a differentiated curriculum was rationalized reform explores some of the most successful early progressive educational reforms as well as the contents of children s literature and popular textbooks racism documents the constancy of the idea of racial hierarchy among progressive educators such as edward thorndike g stanley hall and william bagley relativity documents how scholars such as w e b du bois carter woodson horace kallen and randolph bourne outlined a new inclusive ideology of cultural pluralism but overlooked the cultural relativism of anthropologist franz boas refashioning examines the enduring effects of recapitulation on education such as child centered teaching and the deficit approach to students of color for american scholars progressive education is something of a talisman we all give it ritual worship but we rarely question its origins or premises by contrast race has become perhaps the dominant theme in contemporary educational studies in this bold and brilliant study thomas fallace uses our present day racial lens to critique our historic dogmas about progressive education we might not like what we see but we should not look away jonathan zimmerman new york university this is an important and provocative book fallace provides a thoughtful analysis of how race influenced the foundational ideas of progressive educators in america he has made an important contribution to the history of curriculum and educational reform william b stanley professor curriculum and instruction monmouth university

between race and reason engages the work of diverse intellectuals who challenge the university s past and present collusion with racism violence militarization and war and seeks to re imagine the academy as a uniquely privileged site for critique in the interests of today s urgent imperatives for peace and justice

in race nation history oded y steinberg examines the way a series of nineteenth century scholars in england and germany first constructed and then questioned the periodization of history into ancient medieval and modern eras shaping the way we continue to think about the past and present of western civilization at a fundamental level steinberg explores this topic by tracing the deep connections between the idea of epochal periodization and concepts of race and nation that were prevalent at the time especially the role that germanic or teutonic tribes were assumed to play in the unfolding of western history steinberg shows how english scholars such as thomas arnold williams stubbs and john richard green and german scholars such as christian karl josias von bunsen max mϙller and re built on the notion of a shared teutonic kinship to establish a correlation between the division of time and the ascent or descent of races or nations for example although they viewed the germanic tribes conquest of the roman empire in a d 476 as a formative event that symbolized the transformation from antiquity to the middle ages they did so by highlighting the injection of a new and dominant ethnoracial character into the decaying empire but they also rejected the idea that the fifth century a d was the most decisive era in historical periodization advocating instead for a historical continuity that emphasized the significance of the germanic

tribes influence on the making of the nations of modern europe concluding with character studies of e a freeman james bryce and j b bury steinberg demonstrates the ways in which the innovative schemes devised by this community of victorian historians for the division of historical time relied on the cornerstone of race

this is the first book length study to address sport s role in the making of race the place of sport within black diasporic struggles for freedom and equality and the contested location of sport in relation to the politics of recognition within contemporary western multicultural societies race sport and politics shows that over the past century sport has occupied a dominant position within western culture in producing ideas of racial difference and alterity while providing a powerful and public modality for forms of black cultural resistance written by one of the leading international authorities on the sociology of race and sport it is the first book that centrally locates sport within the cultural politics of the black diaspora and will be of relevance to students and scholars in fields such as the sociology of culture and sport the sociology of race and diaspora studies postcolonial theory cultural theory and cultural studies

an argument for the existence of a mental see saw which in the last 250 years has affected a wide range of human attitudes and activities the author argues that the present economic crisis has close links with the seesaw though the seesaw itself helps to explain events that seem unconnected

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in race and radio pioneering black broadcasters in new orleans bala james baptiste traces the history of the integration of radio broadcasting in new orleans and tells the story of how african american on air personalities transformed the medium analyzing a trove of primary data including archived manuscripts articles and display advertisements in newspapers oral narratives of historical memories and other accounts of african americans and radio in new orleans between 1945 and 1965 baptiste constructs a formidable narrative of broadcast history racism and black experience in this enormously influential radio market the historiography includes the rise and progression of black broadcasters who reshaped the crescent city the first o c w taylor hosted an unprecedented talk show the negro forum on wnoe beginning in 1946 three years later in 1949 listeners heard vernon dr daddy o winslow s smooth and creative voice as a disk jockey on wwex the book also tells of larry mckinley who arrived in new orleans from chicago in 1953 and played a critical role in informing black listeners about the civil rights movement in the city the racial integration of radio presented opportunities for african americans to speak more clearly in their own voices and with a technological tool that opened a broader horizon in which to envision community while limited by corporate pressures and demands from advertisers ranging from local funeral homes to jax beer these black broadcasters helped unify and organize the communities to which they spoke race and radio captures the first overtures of this new voice and preserves a history of black radio s awakening
