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this minimalist study proposes that the computational system of human language must consist of strictly local operations in this highly original reanalysis of minimalist syntax thomas stroik considers the optimal design properties for human language taking as his starting point chomsky s minimalist assumption that the syntactic component of a language generates representations for sentences that are interpreted at perceptual and conceptual interfaces stroik investigates how these representations can be generated most parsimoniously countering the prevailing analyses of minimalist syntax he argues that the computational properties of human language consist only of strictly local merge operations that lack both look back and look forward properties all grammatical operations reduce to a single sort of locally defined feature checking operation and all grammatical properties are the cumulative effects of local grammatical operations as stroik demonstrates reducing syntactic operations to local operations with a single property merging lexical material into syntactic derivations not only radically increases the computational efficiency of the syntactic component but it also optimally simplifies the design of the computational system locality in minimalist syntax explains a range of syntactic phenomena that have long resisted previous generative theories including that trace effects superiority effects and the interpretations available for multiple wh constructions it also introduces the survive principle an important new concept for syntactic analysis and provides something considered impossible in minimalist syntax a locality account of displacement phenomena

this handbook represents the development of research and the current level of

knowledge in the fields of syntactic theory and syntax analysis syntax can look back to a long tradition especially in the last 50 years however the interaction between syntactic theory and syntactic analysis has led to a rapid increase in analyses and theoretical suggestions this second edition of the handbook on syntax adopts a unifying perspective and therefore does not place the division of syntactic theory into several schools to the fore but the increase in knowledge resulting from the fruitful argumentations between syntactic analysis and syntactic theory it uses selected phenomena of individual languages and their cross linguistic realizations to explain what syntactic analyses can do and at the same time to show in what respects syntactic theories differ from each other it investigates how syntax is related to neighbouring disciplines and investigate the role of the interfaces especially the relationship between syntax and phonology morphology compositional semantics pragmatics and the lexicon the phenomena chosen bring together renowned experts in syntax and represent the consensus reached as to what has to be considered as an important as well as illustrative syntactic phenomenon the phenomena discuss do not only serve to show syntactic analyses but also to compare theoretical approaches with each other

r s thomas 1913 2000 is the most recognizable literary figure in twentieth century wales his controversial politics and public personality made him a cultural icon during his life and the merits of his poetry have continued to be debated in the years after his death yet these debates have too often circled familiar ground returning to the assumed personality of the poet or to the received narrative of his experience even the best studies have focused almost exclusively on ideas and themes as a result the poetry itself has frequently been marginalized this book argues that thomas s reputation must be grounded in poetry not personality unlike traditional literary biography which combines historical facts with the conventions of narrative in an attempt to understand the life of a literary figure this stylistic biography focuses on the essential relationship between the maker and the made object giving priority to the latter r s thomas began his career by writing sugary derivative lyrics inspired by palgrave s golden treasury yet he ended it as a form seeking experimentalist this study guides the reader through that journey tracing thomas s stylistic evolution over six decades in so doing it asserts a priority not to look at poetry as many have as a way of affirming existing notions about an iconic r s thomas but to come to terms with the tensions within him as they reveal themselves in the tensions rhythmic linguistic structural of the poetry itself

edward thomas volunteered when he was 37 years old and a father of three and was killed as an artillery officer during the first hour of the arras offensive on april 9th 1917 in the two years before his death he wrote the 144 poems which ensured a place for him among the poets of his generation though all his poems had been written oc under stormocos wingoco thomas was not a war poet in the sense that owen sassoon or rosenberg were war poets before he turned to poetry in december 1914 he

the study places the work of a major religious poet of the late twentieth century in a number of striking new perspectives that allow him to be viewed for the first time as an alternative war poet a conscience stricken pacifist a jealously opportunistic student of art and an experimental biographer of the modern soul published to mark the centenary of the ogre of wales this volume deals with the idées fixes that serially possessed the fiercely intense imagination of r s thomas iago prytherch wales his family and of course a vexingly elusive deity here these familiar obsessions are set in several unusual contexts that bring thomas s poetry into startling new relief the war poetry is considered alongside the poet s early relationship to the english topographical tradition comparisons with borges and levertov underline the international dimensions of the poetry s concerns the intriguing secret code of some of thomas s welsh language references is cracked and his painting poems including several hitherto unpublished are brought centre stage from the peripheries to which they have been routinely relegated

edward thomas 1878 1917 is a renowned poet until recently his prose writing has by comparison been neglected and very often dismissed by critics thanks not least to the multi volume new edition being published by oup gen eds guy cuthbertson and lucy newlyn this body of work is being re evaluated this new study by ralph pite forms part of that undertaking it is the first to consider thomas s prose on its own terms independently of the poetry that it preceded by considering all of thomas s prose work in its wide variety of genres nature writing literary criticism fiction autobiography and by drawing for the first time on the whole range of his reviewing this study transforms understanding of his development the continuity of his critical perspective emerges his celtic loyalties their nature and their depth are revealed both the complexity and the conviction of his politics are brought to light alongside his receptive alertness to innovative writing and his own originality and daring as a writer the view of his achievement generated by his interwar reception itself the outcome of societal mourning and griefwork is challenged so is the critical consensus regarding the quality of his prose and the reasons behind its changing styles across thomas s career from all of this it becomes clear moreover how powerfully thomas s work speaks in the contemporary moment of environmental and climate breakdown thomas s prose seeks constantly to articulate a relationship of absolute interdependence between human beings and the natural world his writing is so exploratory and original because thomas seeks to address the problematic reality that interdependence this truth of humanity s place in natural world is perceptible to western eyes only as mystery
