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when asked to describe wartime atrocities acts of terrorism and serial killers many of us reach for the word evil but what does it mean to say that an action or a person is evil some philosophers have claimed that there is no such thing as evil and that thinking in terms of evil is simplistic and dangerous in response to this sceptical challenge luke russell shows that concept of evil has a legitimate place within contemporary secular moral thought in this book he addresses questions concerning the nature of evil action such as whether evil actions must be incomprehensible whether evil actions can be banal and whether there is a psychological hallmark that distinguishes evils from other wrongs russell also explores issues regarding the nature of evil persons including whether every evil person is an evildoer whether every evil person is irredeemable and whether a person could be evil merely in virtue of having evil feelings the concept of evil is extreme and is easily misused nonetheless russell suggests that it has an important role to play when it comes to evaluating and explaining the worst kind of wrongdoing

fifteen years after its original publication comes a thoroughly revised edition of the evangelical dictionary of theology every article from the original edition has been revisited with some articles being removed others revised and many new articles added the result is a completely new dictionary covering systematic historical and philosophical theology as well as theological ethics

torture is not as universally condemned as it once was from quantanamo and abu ghraib prisons to the death of giulio regeni countless recent cases have shocked public opinion but if we want to defend the human dignity that torture violates simple indignation is not enough in this important book donatella di cesare provides a critical perspective on torture in all its dimensions she seeks to capture the peculiarity of an extreme and methodical violence where the tormentor calculates and measures out pain so that he can hold off the victim's death allowing him to continue to exercise his sovereign power for the victim being tortured is like experiencing his own death while

he is still alive torture is a threat wherever the defenceless find themselves in the hands of the strong in prisons in migrant camps in nursing homes in centres for the disabled and in institutions for minors this impassioned book will appeal to students and scholars of philosophy and political theory as well as to anyone committed to defending human rights as universal and inviolable

a philosophical history of the concept of evil in western culture evil is something to be feared and historically we shall see it is the enemy within who has been seen as representing the most intense evil of all the enemy who looks just like us talks like us and is just like us the myth of evil explores a contradiction the belief that human beings cannot commit acts of pure evil that they cannot inflict harm for its own sake and the evidence that pure evil truly is a human capacity acts of horror are committed not by inhuman monsters but by ordinary human beings this contradiction is clearest in the apparently extreme acts of war criminals terrorists serial murderers sex offenders and children who kill phillip cole delves deep into our two cosily established approaches to evil there is the traditional approach where evil is a force which creates monsters in human shape and there is the enlightened perspective where evil is the consequence of the actions of misguided or mentally deranged agents cole rejects both approaches satan may have played a role in its evolution but evil is really a myth we have created about ourselves and to understand it fully we must acknowledge this drawing on the philosophical ideas of nietzsche arendt kant mary midgley and others as well as theology psychoanalysis fictional representations and contemporary political events such as the global war on terror cole presents an account of evil that is thorough and thought provoking and which

more fundamentally compels us to reassess our understanding of human nature

political polemics the essays in this book address an eclectic range of topics the diverse authors include americans who left the united states during the vietnam war era conservative christian political pundits rock musicians classical linguists disney fans scholars of american slavery and experts on holocaust literature and films from portrayals of evil in the television shows the wire and 24 to the violent lyrics of the rap duo insane clown posse to the storylines of the lord of the rings and harry potter books readers will find themselves rethinking what evil is and how they came to hold their beliefs
