if the contents of this publication were easy to understand it would be a much shorter book it s easy to wonder why being in love with someone or living in fear is so different from liking or being afraid of one thing or another differences arise because what we like for example is definable but who we love isn t we assume that all words are definable but love isn t and neither is faith appreciation passion or a host of other words which relate to love in truth we can t define the sensation of fear sin or temptation either why is it that we give such importance to words which can t be defined and why is it that many of our words including mind soul and god escape definition when we re certain that we know what they mean it s only by appreciating certain words that an understanding is achieved our relationship with god the father christ the son and the holy spirit are explored not in a theological context but a sensational one not so different from a sixth sense perspective contents of this book also include considerations of anger addiction homosexuality pain management and much more an attempt is made to tie up all these seemingly diverse subjects into one tightly knit package

mengzi mencius is known for his sophisticated views on human nature and moral psychology these essays explore a range of philosophical ideas at the core of his moral philosophy and relate them to both traditional chinese and current western philosophical concerns the introduction provides historical background and philosophical context and discusses each of the selections alongside mengzi s work as a whole

with each other creating an unprecedented opportunity to better understand the language of the psyche specific concerns include the discussion of corporeality how the body figures into psychoanalysis the meaning of the unconscious in connection with dreams unconscious fantasies and the field of epigenetics following a historical perspective the book provides a re reading of freud s drive theory exploring his concept of life at the threshold of science and culture as well as the relationship between various representations somatic states and the origin of drive overall the book argues that if the different methodological approaches of psychoanalysis and neuroscience are acknowledged not only for their individual uniqueness but also as a dialectic then the resulting epistemological and methodological dialogue might open up a fascinating body of neuropsychanalytical knowledge

from sung times and throughout the ming period one of the dominant philosophies of china had been a dualistic rationalism thought to be firmly grounded on the classics tai chen 1723 1777 was a scholar and philosopher during the ch ing period a time when china produced few philosophic thinkers he was the greatest of these and his views are embodied chiefly in yuan shan and in meng tzu txu yi shu cheng in place of the prevailing sung dualism tai chen propounded a rationalistic monism seldom before insinuated in a chinese philosophy he declines to accept current dogmas and preferred to seek his own truths his commentaries opposed the time honored interpretations of chu hsi and he discredited them on purely philosophical grounds but with few disciples to carry on his teachings he was virtually forgotten or ignored in china for more than a hundred years after his death it was not until early in the present century with china under the pressures of western aggression and internal disorders that tai chen s nearness to western thought was rediscovered and his important role in the history of philosophy recognized curiously this first of china s western oriented philosophers even today remains little known in the west and his major writings largely untranslated

a novel treatment of the capacity for shared attention joint action and perceptual common knowledge in the shared world axel seemann offers a new treatment of the capacity to perceive act on and know about the world together with others seemann argues that creatures capable of joint attention stand in a unique perceptual and epistemic relation to their surroundings they operate in an environment that they through their communication with their fellow perceivers help constitute seemann shows that this relation can be marshaled to address a range of questions about the social aspect of the mind and its perceptual and cognitive capacities seemann begins with a conceptual question about a complex kind of sociocognitive

phenomenon perceptual common knowledge and develops an empirically informed account of the spatial structure of the environment in and about which such knowledge is possible in the course of his argument he addresses such topics as demonstrative reference in communication common knowledge about jointly perceived objects and spatial awareness in joint perception and action

monkey see monkey do may sound simple but how an individual perceives and processes the behavior of another is one of the most complex and fascinating questions related to the social life of humans and other primates in the primate mind experts from around the world take a bottom up approach to primate social behavior by investigating how the primate mind connects with other minds and exploring the shared neurological basis for imitation joint action cooperative behavior and empathy in the past there has been a tendency to ask all or nothing questions such as whether primates possess a theory of mind have self awareness or have culture a bottom up approach asks rather what are the underlying cognitive processes of such capacities some of which may be rather basic and widespread prominent neuroscientists psychologists ethologists and primatologists use methods ranging from developmental psychology to neurophysiology and neuroimaging to explore these evolutionary foundations a good example is mirror neurons first discovered in monkeys but also assumed to be present in humans that enable a fusing between one's own motor system and the perceived actions of others this allows individuals to read body language and respond to the emotions of others interpret their actions and intentions synchronize and coordinate activities anticipate the behavior of others and learn from them the remarkable social sophistication of primates rests on these basic processes which are extensively discussed in the pages of this volume
