written in response to the hawk s nest tunnel disaster of 1931 in gauley bridge west virginia the book of the dead is an important part of west virginia s cultural heritage and a powerful account of one of the worst industrial catastrophes in american history the poems collected here investigate the roots of a tragedy that killed hundreds of workers most of them african american they are a rare engagement with the overlap between race and environment in appalachia published for the first time alongside photographs by nancy naumburg who accompanied rukeyser to gauley bridge in 1936 this edition of the book of the dead includes an introduction by catherine venerable moore whose writing on the topic has been anthologized in best american essays

the book of the dead by muriel rukeyser was published as part of her 1938 volume u s 1 the poem which is probably the most ambitious and least understood work of depression era american verse commemorates the worst industrial accident in u s history the gauley tunnel tragedy in this terrible disaster an undetermined number of men likely somewhere between 700 and 800 died of acute silicosis a lung disorder caused by prolonged inhalation of silica dust after working on a tunnel project in fayette county west virginia in the early 1930s after many years of relative neglect the book of the dead has recently returned to print and has become the subject of critical attention in muriel rukeyser

s the book of the dead tim dayton continues that study by characterizing the literary and political world of rukeyser at the time she wrote the book of the dead rukeyser s poem clearly emerges from 1930s radicalism as well as from rukeyser s deeply felt calling to poetry after describing the world from which the poem emerged dayton sets up the fundamental factual matters with which the poem is concerned detailing the circumstances of the gauley tunnel tragedy and establishes a framework derived from the classical tripartite division of the genres epic lyric and dramatic through this framework he sees rukeyser presenting a multifaceted reflection upon the significance particularly the historical significance of the gauley tunnel tragedy for rukeyser that disaster was the emblem of a history in which those who do the work of the world are denied control of the vast powers they bring into being dayton also studies the critical reception of the book of the dead and determines that while the contemporary response was mixed most reviewers felt that rukeyser had certainly attempted something of value and significance he pays particular attention to john wheelwright s critical review and to the defenses of rukeyser launched in the 1980s and 1990s by louise kertes and walter kalaidjian the author also examines the relationship between marxism as a theory of history governing the book of the dead and the poem itself which presents a vision of history based upon primary scholarship in rukeyser s papers a close reading of the poem and marxist theory muriel rukeyser s the book of the dead offers a comprehensive and compelling analysis of the book of the dead and will likely remain the definitive work on this poem

muriel rukeyser held a visionary belief in the human capacity to create social change through language she earned an international reputation as a powerful voice against enforced silences of all kind against the violence of war poverty and racism her eloquent poetry of witness of the scottsboro nine the spanish civil war the poisoning of the gauley bridge laborers split the darkness covering a shameful world in addition to the complete texts of her twelve previously published books this volume also features new poems discovered by the editors rukeyser s translations including the first english translations of octavio paz s work early work by rukeyser not previously published in book form and the controversial book length poem wake island an introduction by the editors traces rukeyser s life and literary reputation and complements discerning annotations and textual notes to the poems

provides a new perspective on the documentary diversity of muriel rukeyser s work and influences winner of the inaugural peggy o brien book prize of the irish association for american studies iaas

first appearing in the social sciences in the last decade the new materialism offers a fresh way of looking at the ways in which humanity views its relationship to the material world this study picks up on those key insights analyzing works that challenge the anthropocentric worldview that has defined western thinking for millennia poetry drawn from the period known as late modernism roughly 1930s 1970s is examined with particular attention paid to the ways in which the authors anticipate new materialist perspectives the authors include influential figures representing various anglophone traditions special attention is paid to the long poems of each writer hugh macdiarmid s on a raised beach muriel rukeyser s the book of the dead david jones s the anathemata melvin tolson s harlem gallery louis zukofsky s a and charles olson s the maximus poems a concluding chapter briefly looks ahead to the persistence of materialist thinking in a key postmodernist text armand schwerner s the tablets as new materialism teaches and these texts demonstrate a renewed reckoning of humanity s interaction with the material world can help engender a greater self awareness that humanity is not the only or best measure of the universe

cowinner of the mla prize for bibliographical or archival scholarship the muriel rukeyser era makes available for the first time a range of muriel rukeyser s prose a rich and diverse archive of political social and aesthetic writings eric keenaghan and rowena kennedy epstein assemble a selection of unpublished and out of print texts demonstrating the diversity brilliance and possibilities of mid

twentieth century women's intellectual life and sociopolitical engagement although primarily known as a poet rukeyser produced an expansive and influential body of nonfiction and critical writings reflective of a deeply committed thinker her accessible but philosophically complex prose including essays lectures radio scripts stories and reviews addresses issues related to racial gender and class justice war and war crimes the prison industrial complex jewish culture and diaspora motherhood literature music cinema and translation many of the selected texts have been forgotten have fallen out of print or were never previously published because of conservative cold war political and gender orthodoxies the muriel rukeyser era offers new insight into rukeyser's radical and strikingly contemporary vision for the role of the writer especially the woman writer this selection reveals the centrality of feminism antifascism and antiracism to her thinking and thus affirms the resonance and urgency of her work today

in a series of incisive readings francisco e robes provides a literary history of midcentury us multiethnic literature tracing the shift from coalitional aesthetics to multiculturalism by focusing on how migrancy and labor politics shape literary innovation along the way robes shows how writers kept the popular front's legacy of coalitional aesthetics alive through literary practices of what he calls speaking with whereby authors undo their authority as scribes audiences become participatory interpreters and texts emerge as places of communal and collaborative work beginning with significant unexpected connections between zora neale hurston and muriel rukeyser and delving deeply into the work of sanora babb woody guthrie gwendolyn brooks poets of the memphis sanitation strike carlos bulosan tomás rivera and authors included in this bridge called my back robes examines texts whose range of experimental strategies deliberately engage figurations of movement migration and coalition the experimentation these works display emerges from the particular methods of speaking with that they contain whether it's overcoming exclusion by finding new ways of representing migrants through word and sound or in the astonishing ways these authors conceive of migrancy as neither static nor statistical but as a modality that necessitates writerly innovation the result is a genealogy of coalitional aesthetics as a significantly important branch of american midcentury multiethnic writing that sustained and indeed extended the popular front and its legacies

each volume of the dictionary of world biography contains 250 entries on the lives of the individuals who shaped their times and left their mark on world history this is not a who's who instead each entry provides an in depth essay on the life and career of the individual concerned essays commence with a quick reference section that provides basic facts on the individual's life and achievements the extended biography places the life and works of the individual within an historical context and the summary at the end of each essay provides a synopsis of the individual's place in history all entries conclude with a fully annotated bibliography

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infrastructure comprises a combination of sociotechnical political and cultural arrangements that provide resources and services the contributors to this volume show in their respective fields how infrastructures are both generative forces and the materialized products of quotidian practices that affect and guide people's lives organized via shared conceptual foci this volume demonstrates infrastructuralist perspectives as an important transdisciplinary approach within the humanities

america's sense of space has always been tied to what hayden white called the narrativization of real events if the awe inspiring manifestations of nature in america niagara falls virginia's natural bridge the grand canyon etc were often used as a foil for projecting utopian visions and idealizations of the nation's exceptional place among the nations of the world the rapid technological progress and its concomitant appropriation of natural spaces served equally well as david nye argues to promote the dominant cultural idiom of exploration and conquest from the beginning american attitudes towards space were thus utterly contradictory if not paradoxical a paradox that scholars tried to capture in such hybrid concepts as the middle landscape leo marx an engineered new earth cecelia tichi or the technological sublime david nye not only was america's concept of space paradoxical it has always also been a contested terrain a site of continuous social and cultural conflict many foundational issues in american history the dislocation of native and african americans the geo political implications of nation building immigration and transmigration the increasing division and clustering of contemporary american society etc involve differing ideals and notions of space quite literally space and its various ideological appropriations formed the arena where america's search for identity national political cultural has been staged if american democracy as frederick jackson turner claimed is born of free land then its history may well be defined as the history of the fierce struggles to gain and maintain power over both the geographical social and political spaces of america and its concomitant narratives the number and range of topics interests and critical approaches of the essays gathered here open up exciting new avenues of inquiry into the tangled contentious relations of space in america topics include theories of space landscape nature technoscape architecture urban utopia literature performance film visual arts

this edited collection combines social science and humanities inquiries to examine the collective mentalities identities and national cultural models of people from different communities and nations unpacking the sociocultural mechanisms of people's actions and experiences the contributors use literary works to illustrate and further explore such mechanisms this book explores a variety of diverse geographies from around the globe in order to compare national forms of human subjectivity and further examine collective consciousness and cultural minds

in this nuanced revisionist history of modern american poetry john lowney investigates the depression era's impact on late modernist american poetry from the socioeconomic crisis of the 1930s through the emergence of the new social movements of the 1960s informed by an ongoing scholarly reconsideration of 1930s american culture and concentrating on left writers whose historical consciousness was profoundly shaped by the depression world war ii and the cold war lowney articulates the left's challenges to national collective memory and redefines the importance of late modernism in american literary history the late modernist writers lowney studies most closely muriel rukeyser elizabeth bishop langston hughes gwendolyn brooks thomas mcgrath and george oppen are not all customarily associated with the 1930s nor are they commonly seen as literary peers by examining these late modernist writers comparatively lowney foregrounds differences of gender and sexuality race and ethnicity and social class and region while emphasizing how each writer developed poetic forms that responded to the cultural politics and socioaesthetic debates of the 1930s in so doing he calls into question the boundaries that have limited the scholarly dialogue about modern poetry no other study of american poetry has considered the particular gathering of careers that lowney considers as poets whose collective historical consciousness was profoundly shaped by the turmoil of the depression and war years and the cold war's repression or rewriting of history their diverse talents represent a distinct generational impact on u s and international literary history

the definitive edition of selected work from a poet whose influence continues to be widely felt today introduced by natasha trethewey engaging closely with the violence oppression and injustice that she witnessed in her lifetime muriel rukeyser was one of the seminal poets of the mid twentieth century closely informed by issues relating to equality social justice feminism and judaism her impassioned

poetry was often seen as a mode of social protest but it was also heralded for its deep emotional impact its personal perspective forthright discussion of the female experience particularly sex and single parenthood at a time when these topics were largely taboo and its wide ranging exploration of genre and form as adrienne rich wrote muriel rukeyser s poetry is unequalled in the twentieth century united states she pushes us to enlarge our sense of what poetry is about in the world and of the place of feelings and memory in politics the essential muriel rukeyser represents the curation of rukeyser s most enduring and urgent work gathered in one volume that spans the many decades of her life and career and with an introduction from natasha trethewey one of our most important contemporary poets

this book examines the history theory and journalistic practice of profile writing profiles and the practice of writing them are of increasing interest to scholars of journalism because conflicts between the interviewer and the subject exemplify the changing nature of journalism itself while the subject often through the medium of their press representative struggles to retain control of the interview space the journalist seeks to subvert it this interesting and multi layered interaction however has rarely been subject to critical scrutiny partly because profiles have traditionally been regarded as public relations exercises or as soft journalism however chapters in this volume reveal not only that profiling has historically taken many different forms but that the idea of the interview as a contested space has applications beyond the subject of celebrated individuals the volume looks at the profile s historical beginnings at the contemporary manufacture of celebrity versus the ordinary at profiling communities countries and movements at profiling the destitute at sporting personalities and finally at profiling and trauma

from jewish publishers to appalachian poets green s cultural study reveals the role of mountain whites in american racial history part one 1880 1935 explores the networks that created american pluralism revealing appalachia s essential role in shaping america s understanding of african americans anglos jews southerners and immigrants drawing upon archival research and deft close readings of poems part two 1934 1946 delves into the inner workings of literary history and shows how diverse alliances used four books of poetry about appalachia to change america s notion of race region and pluralism

green starts with how jesse stuart and the agrarians defended southern whiteness follows how james still appealed to liberals shows how muriel rukeyser put appalachia at the center of anti fascism and ends with how don west and the progressives struggled to form interracial labor unions in the south

the century s midnight is an exploration of the literary and political relationships between a number of ideologically sophisticated american and european writers during a mid twentieth century dominated by the second world war clive bush offers an account of an intelligent and diverse community of people of good will transcending national ideological and cultural barriers although structured around five central figures the novelist victor serge the editors dwight macdonald and dorothy norman the cultural critic lewis mumford and the poet muriel rukeyser the book examines a wealth of european and american writers including hannah arendt simone de beauvoir walter benjamin john dos passos andré gide henry miller anaïs nin george orwell boris pilniak albert camus jean paul sartre ignacio silone and richard wright the book s central theme relates politics and literature to time and narrative the author argues that knowledge of the writers of this period is of inestimable value in attempting to understand our contemporary world

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
