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theodore porter s portrait of pearson extends from religious crisis and sexual tensions to metaphysical and even mathematical anxieties pearson sought to reconcile reason with enthusiasm and to achieve the impersonal perspective of science without sacrificing complex individuality even as he longed to experience nature directly and intimately he identified science with renunciation and positivistic detachment porter finds a turning point in pearson s career where his humanistic interests gave way to statistical ones in his grammar of science 1892 in which he attempted to establish scientific method as the moral educational basis for a refashioned culture book jacket

this volume provides a concise synthesis of human animal relations over time charting shifting attitudes towards animals from domestication to the present day it asks how non human species have shaped human history and how humans have reconfigured the animal world humans have had a long and close relationship with animals they have hunted them consumed them as food and fashion exploited them as energy sources utilised them in warfare exhibited them in zoos and menageries and studied them for science in the process they have radically changed the way in which many animals live subjecting them to captivity altering their diets constraining their movements and through selective breeding reshaping their bodies the book explores the use of animals for sustenance labour companionship and display and traces the rise of the animal rights movement it also assesses how humans have impacted the overall biodiversity of the planet driving some species of animals to extinction and permitting others to colonise new continents with case studies on animal astronauts celebrity kakapos globetrotting pandas and cocaine hippos animals in world history offers a lively and accessible introduction to human animal relations for students and instructors of animal studies

world history explores the human past around the globe to help us understand the world we live in today it seeks to identify how major forces like patterns of migration or world trade have developed over time it explores the cultures and political institutions of different regions to help explain commonalities and differences world history builds on a growing body of historical scholarship some of which has truly altered the picture of the past it involves a rich array of stories and examples of human variety intriguing in themselves it helps develop skills that are vital not just to the history classroom but to effective operation in a global society skills like comparing different societies appreciating various viewpoints and identifying big changes and continuities in the human experience always however it uses the past as a prologue to the present world historians argue that no one society past or present can be understood without reference to other societies and to larger global forces they argue even more vigorously that the present which clearly involves relationships that embrace the whole world cannot be grasped without a sense of the global historical record from its first edition world civilizations the global experience has aimed at capturing a truly global approach by discussing and comparing major societies and focusing on their interactions the goal is to present a clear factual framework while stimulating analysis about global contacts regional patterns and the whole process of change and continuity on a world stage this kind of world history focused on the development over time of the forces that shape the world today helps students make sense of the present and prepare to meet the challenges of the future it is hard to imagine a more important topic embracing the whole world's history obviously requires selectivity and explicit points of emphasis this text gains coherence through decisions about time about place and about topic in all three cases the book encourages analysis relating facts to vital issues of interpretation through analysis and interpretation students become active engaged learners rather than serving as passive vessels for torrents of historical facts underpinning analysis the issues of time place and topic are the three keys to an intelligible global past

a fascinating and comprehensive history this book explores the most important transformation in twentieth century economics the creation of econometrics containing fresh archival material that has not been published before and taking ragnar frisch as the narrator francisco louca discusses both the key events the establishment of the econometric society the cowles commission and the journal *econometrica* and the major players economists like wesley mitchell mathematicians like john von neumann and statisticians like karl pearson in history that shaped the development of econometrics he discusses the evolution of their thought detailing the debates the quarrels and the interrogations that crystallized their work and even offers a conclusion of sorts suggesting that some of the more influential thinkers abandoned econometrics or became critical of its development international in scope and appeal the years of high econometrics is an excellent accompaniment for students taking courses on probability econometric methods and the history of economic thought

as an historiographic monograph this book offers a detailed survey of the professional evolution and significance of an entire discipline devoted to the history of science it provides both an intellectual and a social history of the development of the subject from the first such effort written by the ancient greek author eudemus in the fourth century bc to the founding of the international journal *historia mathematica* by kenneth o may in the early 1970s

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in this revised and expanded second edition of *third world studies* gary y okihiro considers the methods and theories that might constitute the formation of third world studies proposed in 1968 at san francisco state college by the third world liberation front but replaced by faculty and administrators with ethnic studies third world studies was over before it began as opposed to ethnic studies which okihiro critiques for its liberalism and us centrism third world studies begins with the colonized world and the anti imperial anticolonial and antiracist projects located therein as described by w e b du bois in 1900 third world studies analyzes the locations and articulations of power around the axes of race gender sexuality disability class and nation in this new edition okihiro emphasizes the work of third world intellectuals such as m n roy josé

carlos mariátegui and oliver cromwell cox foregrounds the importance of bandung and the tricontinental and adds discussions of eugenics feminist epistemologies and religion with this work okihiro establishes third world studies as a theoretical formation and a liberatory practice

world history has expanded dramatically in recent years primarily as a teaching field and increasingly as a research field growing numbers of teachers and ph ds in history are required to teach the subject they must be current on topics from human evolution to industrial development in song dynasty china to today s disease patterns and then link these disparate topics into a coherent course numerous textbooks in print and in preparation summarize the field of world history at an introductory level but good teaching also requires advanced training for teachers and access to a stream of new research from scholars trained as world historians in this book patrick manning provides the first comprehensive overview of the academic field of world history he reviews patterns of research and debate and proposes guidelines for study by teachers and by researchers in world history

in 1900 w e b dubois prophesied that the colour line would be the key problem of the twentieth century and he later identified one of its key dynamics the new religion of whiteness that was sweeping the world whereas most historians have confined their studies of race relations to a national framework this book studies the transnational circulation of people and ideas racial knowledge and technologies that under pinned the construction of self styled white men s countries from south africa to north america and australasia marilyn lake and henry reynolds show how in the late nineteenth century and early twentieth century these countries worked in solidarity to exclude those they defined as not white actions that provoked a long international struggle for racial equality their findings make clear the centrality of struggles around mobility and sovereignty to modern formulations of both race and human rights

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
